

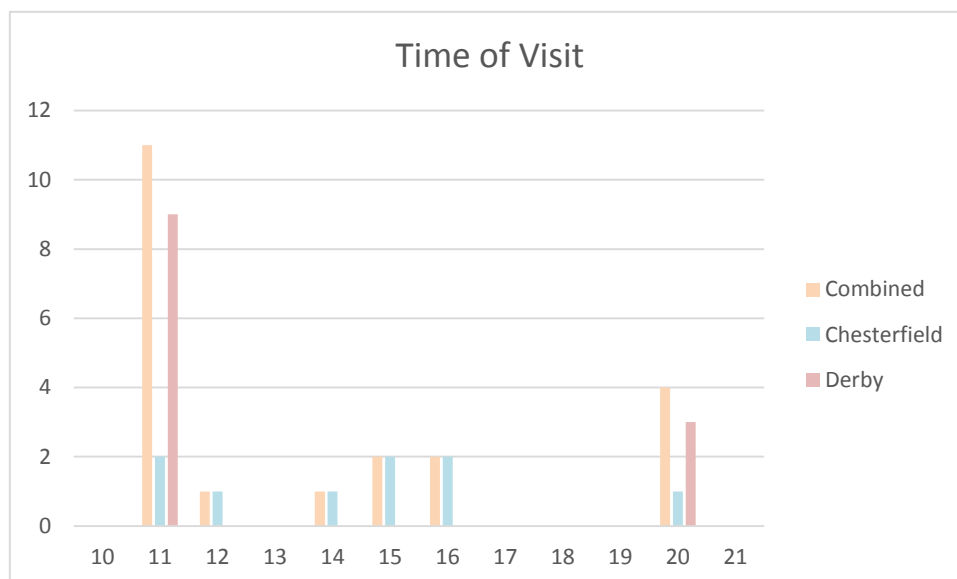
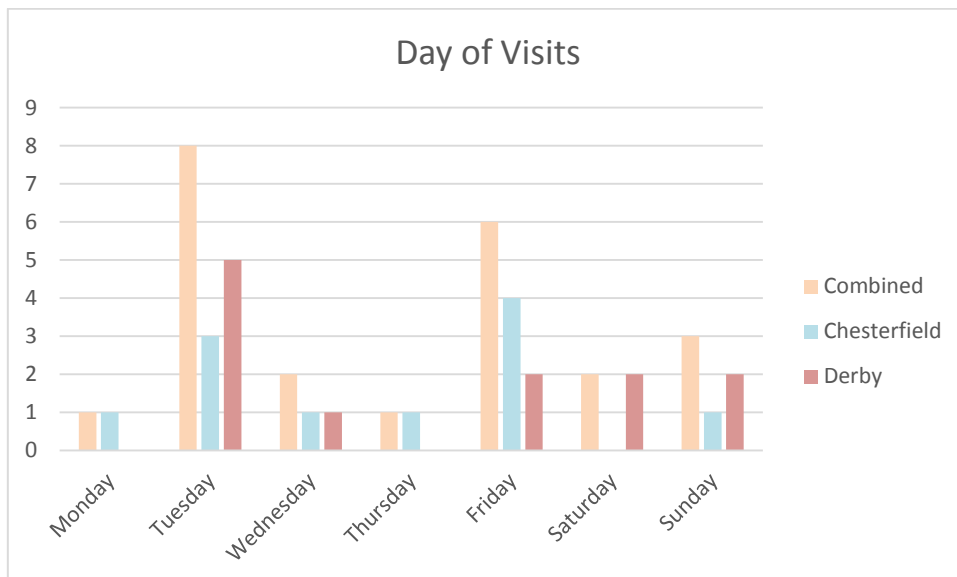
Quarterly Report – January to March 2020

QUARTERLY CRR REPORT

1st January to 31 March 2020

Our vulnerability focus during this period was Young People and the Mentally Vulnerable.

During this quarter we reviewed a total of 72 Custody Records, 24 records of Young people and 48 records of those with Mental Health Vulnerabilities.

Our Custody Record Reviewers retrospectively check the redacted Custody Records of Vulnerable DPs to ensure that they have been detained and cared for according to their needs. The volunteers report on pre-set criteria and highlight whether the reporting of that care has been logged into the Custody Record of each individual.

Below is a snapshot from the output of our Custody Record Reviewers, please note that fuller reports are presented to the Strategic Priorities Assurance Board twice per year.

Findings from the reviews may indicate a failing to record adequately rather than a failing of care and as such this should be read in junction with the custody visiting report.

General Requirements

Records are checked to ensure that DPs are informed about the cell call button, that the toilet area is obscured, all detained should be asked if they have caring responsibilities and informed if they have been reviewed whilst asleep.

The findings from our record reviewing show that in all areas the recording of the above has improved.

Delay from Arrival to Authorised Detention

There continues to be a number of delays in which the reason for the delay in authorising detention is not rationalised.

Appropriate Adults (AA)

Mental Health (MH)

Calls for an AA for those with MH vulnerabilities appears to have reduced and whilst it is acknowledged that an AA is not always needed for those with MH vulnerabilities there were some records where it appeared that an AA may have been beneficial.

The length of time until first recorded contact with the AA has reduced overall, but where there is a delay a rationale is not always given.

Young People (YP)

There were some long delays in AA first contact for YP and where these delays occurred there was not always a good rationale recorded.

Observation Levels

Our reviewing checks if observation levels are adhered to (within 5 minutes). The adhering to observations levels had unfortunately declined during this period.

There are some good examples of recording the movement between different levels of observation though.

Liaison and Diversion (L & D)

The data demonstrates that L & D appeared to have spoken to fewer DPs with MH vulnerabilities during the months of January and February. For YP L & D appeared to have made more contact.

It is good to note rationale is being included on the records for non-engagement with L & D.
