# STRATEGIC GOVERNANCE BOARD 22 JANUARY 2017 REPORT OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE

#### **7A: SGB MEETING DATES**

### 1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

- 1.1 To update the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) on work to review the SGB meeting process and develop a more relevant and engaging process.
- 1.2 To publish the proposed dates for the new meetings.

### 2. <u>INFORMATION AND ANALYSIS</u>

- 2.1 Following the paper that went to the November SGB meeting, work has continued to revise and refocus the SGB meetings to encourage greater attendance and engagement by the public.
- 2.2 The focus of the meetings will move from reports from the Force to presentations by i) The Force, ii) The PCC's Office and iii) Partners on progress towards delivering each of the Police and Crime Plan objectives.
- 2.3 The meetings will take place in the evening. It is hoped that this may encourage those who have not been able to attend in the past to consider either coming to an event, or following the live Q&A session at the start of the meeting.
- 2.4 To signal the move to a new format it was agreed that a new name for the meeting should be identified. The suggested new title for the meeting is the Strategic Priorities Assurance Board or SPA Board. It is hoped that this will best reflect the nature and purpose of the meeting and will ensure that the focus of the meeting is the Police and Crime Plan.

### 3. FORMAT

- 3.1 Historically the meeting has received a number of reports from the Force which have described specific areas of work and attempted to link these back specific Police and Crime Plan objectives.
- 3.2 The new meeting structure will see three main presentations one from the Force, one from the PCC's office and one from partners. These presentations will look specifically at one of Police and Crime Plan objectives and will highlight threats and risks as well as successes and future work in this particular area.
- 3.3 As there are 7 objectives, the two more 'inward facing' priorities 6(Force diversity) and 7 (the use of technology) will be reported on at the same meeting.
- 3.4 There will also continue to be a single agenda item held in January to agree the budget and the proposed precept level.
- 3.5 Appendix A contains a draft for the new SPA Board agenda.
- 3.6 Appendix B gives the dates for the 2018/19 meetings

 That the PCC accepts the new name, format and dates for the Strategic Priority Assurance Board.
