Overview

There are a total of 21 generators throughout the estate and all require service regime, with the back-up of a call out service that operates 24/7 365 days per year, to support operations.

The evaluation team consisted of Joan Watson & Daniel Linfield.

This was an open tender advertised on EU-Supply.com and Source Derbyshire, using the Most Economical Advantageous Tender Criteria (MEAT): Weighting 40% Price and 60% Quality (delivery).

19 Companies expressed an interest, 2 Companies submitted bids, and both bids were evaluated.

Based on the detailed evaluation, Power Control Ltd scored highest on the combined quality and cost total figure. They demonstrated that they could meet the requirements which were outlined within the specification and provided a comprehensive response to the method statements.

Summary

The bids were assessed against the quality criteria set out in the invitation to tender document - most economical advantageous tender criteria (meat): weighting 60% quality (delivery) and 40% price, the submission from Power Control Ltd is the successful bid.
