- 1.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner for Derbyshire is committed to supporting projects delivered by community groups and voluntary organisations that will help him to deliver his Police and Crime Plan priorities.
- 1.2 The award of grants through an annual timetable of a Community Action Grant has enabled several organisations across Derbyshire to develop local projects which help to deliver the priorities in his Police and Crime Plan.
- 1.3 These priorities include keeping vulnerable people safe from harm, supporting victims, maintaining strong and effective partnership working, tackling drugs and alcohol, supporting those with mental health issues and working with young people to break the cycle of offending and repeat victimisation.

1.4 During the most recent round of large grants an exceptionally high volume of applications was received. The Commissioner was unable to fund as many of these grants as he would have liked but three of these stood out as being of significant merit.

1.5 Following some further due diligence on the part of the commissioning and grants team, recommendations were made to the Commissioner to fund the three applications from the organisations detailed below.

1.6 Table 1 highlights the projects which were offered funding and the funding period will run from 1st April 2020 to 30th September 2020.

Safer Living Foundation – Young People’s projects	The Safer Living Foundation provides evidence-based services for young people who have committed sexual offences or engaged in sexually harmful behaviour. The primary aim is preventing further harmful sexual behaviour whilst also increasing young people’s emotional wellbeing and decreasing loneliness and isolation.	£15,000	1,3,4,5
Active South Derbyshire – ASD Community project	Roaming provision of activities across identified areas of need, to include Stenson Fields, Swadlincote/Urban Core, Hilton, Melbourne and the Seals. Programme of activities to include: Street Games/Doorstep Delivery, Youth Group Development, Creation, support and development of new and existing groups, Mentoring Scheme, Volunteer identification and development	£25,000	1,3,4,5
Derbyshire Wildlife Trust – Wild Well Being	Wild Wellbeing addresses loneliness and anti-social behaviour in young people by engaging them with the natural world through a skills development programme. The programme develops personal and practical skills, emotional resilience and helps attendees acquire new skills and build better relationships. It is proposed to extend the successful initial years’ work, to cover Heanor, Langley Mill, Ridings and Ironville, all deprived areas where access to constructive activities for young people are limited by social and economic factors.	£24,865	1,3,4,5
