NMPR LICENCE

Executive Summary

The NMPR database is a unique product which has been used in Force since 2015. It is predominantly used by the Intelligence Analysts mainly in the attribution of mobile phones to persons of interest but also has other uses including the reporting of found devices

Following analysis of the usage of the system it was apparent that there is an ongoing requirement for access to this database. It also highlighted an area for staff development as it was clear that whilst some members of the Force Intelligence Management Unit were accessing the database regularly others were not utilising the database at all, due to lack of awareness.

A compliant route to purchase the software licence has been found via the CCS G-Cloud 11 Framework which allows direct award to the supplier, Recipero Limited.

The quoted renewal price for 2020 was £8008

Decision

To purchase the software licence at the quoted renewal price for 2020 of £8008 for 1 year or £15507 for 2 years. After further discussion a reduced price was agreed at £14,997.97 for 2 years which equates to £7499.98 per year.
