5. Why does the operation require a P. R. department?

The OPCC doesn't have a dedicated PR department. However, within the office structure, there is a staff member who does provide PR advice as part of their broader role. Aside from this staff member, there is a Communications and Engagement Team which primarily works to fulfil our statutory duty to consult with the public and victims throughout Derby and Derbyshire. The team seeks to gain feedback from the public, victims, and stakeholders in regard to crime and policing related matters. In addition, to ensure initiatives such as grants schemes, which are facilitated by the Commissioner's office, are appropriately promoted, communication methods are used to attract interest from relevant organisations and interested stakeholders.

The Communications and Engagement team produce a range of literature such as the Annual Report, Council Tax Budget Leaflet and regular Newsletters to communicate the work of the Commissioner and to ensure key information is shared with the public.

If you are not satisfied with our response to your request, under Section 17 of the FOIA of the FOIA you are entitled to ask for an internal review of our decision. Any internal review needs to be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of this response and state why you are unhappy with the response.
