



Where the Money Comes From



This year's budget will support



STRONG LOCAL POLICING

- Over 100 more police officers in our communities
- An extra 100 officers trained to use Tasers
- Increased investment in 101 and 999 to reduce waiting times
- Increased number of Special Constables and other volunteers
- Investment in police stations across the county

NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING

- A reduction in burglary and anti-social behaviour
- Creation of dedicated anti-social behaviour co-ordinators
- Recruitment of more PCSOs with increased crime prevention training
- Increased operations to drive down knife crime and violence

IMPROVEMENTS TO ROAD SAFETY

- Extra vehicles for the Roads Policing Unit to tackle road offences
- Increased enforcement to reduce speeding and dangerous driving
- Increased funding to improve road safety, including Community Speedwatch



ROBUST APPROACH TO RURAL CRIME

- More resources and training for our Rural Crime Team
- Increased police presence across the county
- Targeted specialised support for victims of crime in rural areas



VICTIM SUPPORT AND SAFEGUARDING

- Investment in crime reporting services
- Over £4.3m invested in community safety and specialised support for victims of crime
- A new stalking coordinator to tackle stalking and harassment and additional night-time patrols
- Increased funding to reduce Domestic Abuse and Violence Against Women and Girls



EFFICIENCY DRIVE

- £3 million efficiency savings reinvested in frontline policing and community safety
- Ongoing scrutiny of the Constabulary's expenditure to reduce waste in public spending
- Further cost savings within the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner
