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Introduction

As Derbyshire Police and Crime Commissioner, part of my role is to consult with members of the public to listen to their views, which are then reflected in my Police and Crime Plan, ensuring those views help shape a better policing service.

Listening To You is a general consultation programme that I run throughout the year on a rolling basis, to enable myself and Derbyshire Constabulary to identify trends through the annual results. To ensure that Derbyshire's results can be measured against data provided nationally, many of the questions used are from the Crime Survey for England and Wales (CSEW) which has an emphasis on public safety and views on the police service.

The results of this survey help to give both myself and the Chief Constable a better understanding of the views and concerns of people within our communities. We are aware that survey results can sometimes be influenced by current national affairs and events, but it is important that we continually consult with the public and always strive to deliver against the concerns of residents and ensure they receive the strong local policing they deserve. The results of the Listening To you Survey are also shared with local authority Community Safety Partnerships and other partners to inform services for residents across Derbyshire.

Conducting the survey

A total of 3,377 questionnaires were completed in 2022/23 by residents from across the whole of the Derbyshire Police force area, with around 300 respondents from each of the nine local authorities.

As usual, the survey was promoted at various engagement events across Derby and Derbyshire, including at a Neighbourhood Watch meeting in Eckington, a Young Farmers' meeting in the High Peak, an Anti-social Behaviour Week event in Ashbourne, weekly markets in Swadlincote and Bolsover, Chesterfield Pride and the Ashover Show.

The survey was also regularly promoted through various channels, including social media, Derbyshire Alert and via partners, to try to reach a wide variety of demographics and ensure as representative sample as possible.



Commentary and Main Points

Responses were received from 3,377 people, which equates to approximately one in every 310 residents of the Derbyshire Police force area having completed a survey during this 12-month period.

The profile of respondents is broadly representative of the population of Derbyshire with regard to female/male, age group, home local authority, ethnic background and sexual orientation. However, to ensure that valid comparisons can be made across the different demographics, and that results can be directly compared to past and future survey results, answers have been weighted by female/male, age group and home local authority in line with the Census 2021 profile of Derbyshire.

Results calculations for each question are generally based on answers where the respondent has expressed an opinion only, i.e. "Don't know / Prefer not to say" and blank answers have been excluded unless specified.

Particular issues of note from individual questions are detailed below. Where appropriate, comparisons have been made with results from the Crime Survey for England & Wales (CSEW) year ending March 2023 and for Q11, the YouGov monthly tracker "Are the police doing a good job?".

Question 3. Have you been a victim of crime in the past 12 months?

Around one in seven respondents (15%) said that they had been a victim of crime in the past 12 months, the same as the previous year. This is in line with CSEW estimates of 16% for the year ending March 2023.

Respondents who are aged 35-54 years (22%) or who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (21%) were more likely to have been a victim of crime, and respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities were twice as likely (30%) than the average to have been a victim of crime.



Question 4. Are you aware of the services available for victims in Derbyshire?

Two in five respondents (40%) said they were aware of the victim services that are available, with results fairly consistent across the different areas of the Derbyshire Police force area, apart from High Peak and South Derbyshire where respondents were slightly less aware.

Respondents aged 24 years and younger or who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality were more likely to be aware, with those aged 35-54 years less likely to be aware.

Just under three in five respondents (57%) who had been a victim of crime in the past 12 months were aware of the services available for them.

Question 5. How safe do you feel walking alone in your local area during the day / after dark?

Results show that around four out of five respondents (81%) felt either very safe or fairly safe walking alone in their local area during the day, slightly lower than the previous year (84%), and also preceding results of 87-89%.

Results for feeling safe during the day are fairly similar (mainly between 79%-85%) throughout the various demographics, apart from respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a victim of crime in the past 12 months - where results were significantly lower (60%).

Around two in five respondents (41%) felt safe walking alone in the local area after dark – this is also less than last year's results (49%).

However, there is considerable variance for feeling safe after dark in the local area. Females (29%), respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (22%) or who have been a victim of crime (27%) were the least likely to say they felt safe, whereas males (54%) and those living in Derbyshire Dales (59%) were the most likely to say they felt safe.

In comparison, CSEW results show 79% of persons nationally felt safe when walking alone after dark (males 90%, females 69%), which may suggest that people in Derbyshire have a higher fear of crime, as Derbyshire's crime rates are lower than the national average.



Question 6. How worried are you about being a victim of the following types of crime?

- a. **Having your home broken into and something stolen?**
- b. **Being mugged and / or robbed?**
- c. **Being physically attacked by a stranger?**
- d. **Being physically attacked by someone you know?**
- e. **Being subject to a crime because of your race, religion, sexual orientation, transgender identity or disability?**
- f. **Having your vehicle stolen or vandalised?**
- g. **Being a victim of fraud or identity theft?**
- h. **Being a victim of antisocial behaviour?**

The proportion of respondents being very or fairly worried about property crimes – burglary (50%), robbery (37%) and car crime (49%) – are similar to last year. Respondents aged 24 years and under were considerably less worried about burglary and car crime, and slightly less worried about robbery than older respondents. Those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or have been a recent victim of crime were much more worried than average about being a victim of property crime.

There does appear to be a higher fear of property crime in Derbyshire compared to the country as a whole – the Listening To You survey 2022/23 has 13% of respondents being very worried about burglary and 14% of respondents being very worried about car crime, compared to the CSEW national figures of 8% and 5% respectively.

Two in five respondents (40%) said they were very or fairly worried about being physically attacked by a stranger, with respondents from Derby (49%), who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (49%), have been a recent victim of crime (56%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (6%) being the most worried. Females (46%) were much more worried than males (32%).

One in eight respondents (12%) said they were very or fairly worried about being physically attacked by someone they know. Respondents aged under 18 years (19%), from an ethnic minority background (20%), who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (23%), have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (26%) or have been a recent victim of crime (28%) were the most likely to be worried.

The proportion of people very worried about violent crime (11% being attacked by a stranger, 4% being attacked by someone they know) is similar to the CSEW (8%).

Just under one in five respondents (18%) said they were worried about being subject to a crime because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, transgender identity or disability. This was the question with the widest variance of levels of worry by different demographics. Over half (55%) of respondents from an ethnic minority background said they were worried compared to 14% of respondents from a white ethnic background. Respondents from Derby (28%), aged 18-24 years (30%), who have been a recent victim of crime (33%), who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (43%) or who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (54%) were the most likely to say they were worried. Levels of worry decreased considerably with age – those aged 24 years or under were three times more likely to be worried (28%) compared to aged 55 years or over (9%).

Levels of worry about fraud (46%) are lower than last year (54%) and have reduced compared to previous years (57%-59%). The CSEW indicates that fraud is, by far, the most common crime type experienced - by 6% of people in a 12 month period. The fear of being a victim of fraud increases considerably with age – respondents aged over 35 years are around four times as likely to be worried about fraud than those aged 24 years and under. The proportion of people very worried about fraud (14%) is slightly lower than the CSEW (16%).

Just over half (56%) of respondents said they were worried about being a victim of anti-social behaviour, slightly less than last year (59%). Residents of Derby (62%) and Chesterfield (61%), respondents who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (61%), who have been a recent victim of crime (74%) and who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (77%) were the most likely to be worried, whereas those aged 24 years and under (42%), and residents of Derbyshire Dales (44%) and South Derbyshire (47%) were the least worried.



Question 7. How many times in the past 12 months have you personally experienced or witnessed in your local area?

- a. **Street drinking / drunken behaviour / under-age drinking**
- b. **Vandalism / criminal damage or graffiti**
- c. **Inconsiderate behaviour**
- d. **People using or dealing drugs, or evidence of drugs**
- e. **Inconvenient or illegal parking, abandoned vehicles**
- f. **Speeding cars or motorcycles, car revving, boy racers**

Responses to this question were similar to last year. Generally, around one in five respondents had experienced or witnessed the various types of anti-social behaviour on at least a weekly basis, with respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a recent victim of crime saying they had experienced or witnessed these behaviours more often.

Two types of behaviours were reported as occurring on a more frequent basis. For inconvenient or illegal parking and/or abandoned vehicles, two in five respondents (40%) said they had experienced or witnessed this on at least a weekly basis. Three in five respondents (59%) said they had experienced or witnessed speeding cars or motorcycles, car revving and/or boy racers on at least a weekly basis.

Question 8. In the last 12 months, have you seen or heard information in any of the following ways about what the police are doing to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour in your local area?

Via social media; E-mail notifications; Public meeting; On a police/government website; Newsletters; Community messaging; Local newspapers; Other; None of these

Over one third (39%) of respondents had seen or heard information about what the police are doing to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour in their local area via social media, which was, by far, the most common way. One in six respondents (16%) had seen or heard information via e-mail notifications, one in eight (12%) via community messaging and one in ten via newspapers (10%) or on a police/government website (10%). However, almost half of respondents (43%) had not seen or heard information via any of the listed ways.

The likelihood of respondents having seen or heard information increased significantly with age, with almost three-quarters (72%) of respondents aged 55 years or over having seen or heard information in one of the listed ways, compared to half of those aged 18-34 years (52%).



Respondents from more rural areas were also more likely to have seen or heard information than respondents from urban areas. Respondents from an ethnic minority background were less likely (43%) to have seen or heard information than those from a white background (59%).

Question 9. Do you think that your local police are dealing with the issues that matter to your community?

Half of respondents (50%) did feel that their local police are dealing with the issues in their community. This is a slight decrease from last year (53%), and a decrease from the previous two years (63%), and is likely to have been affected by stories in the national media where the police have not provided a good service to members of the public and/or not behaved in an appropriate manner.

Respondents who were the most likely to agree that their local police are dealing with issues were those aged 75 years or over (62%), aged 24 years or under (59%), or from South Derbyshire (60%). Respondents who were the least likely to agree were those who had been a victim of crime (27%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (38%).

Respondents who had seen or heard information about what the police are doing to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour in their local area (Q8) were more than one and a half times more likely to say that their local police are dealing with issues (59%) than those who had not seen or heard information (35%).

Question 10. To what extent do you agree or disagree...?

- a. Derbyshire Police treat people fairly and with respect**
- b. The use of Stop and Search is an effective tool to prevent crime**

Three in five respondents (59%) feel that Derbyshire police treat people fairly and with respect, a slight decrease from last year (64%), with people moving to the neutral “Neither agree nor disagree” position as the proportion who disagree (13%) has remained almost the same as last year (12%).

Respondents who had been a victim of crime (32%), who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (23%) or who are from an ethnic minority background (21%) were the most likely to disagree.



Around two-thirds (63%) of respondents agree that the police use of Stop and Search is an effective tool to prevent crime, an increase from last year (55%). However, there is considerable variance with age, with only 43% of those aged 24 years and under agreeing, compared to 76% of those aged 55 years or over.

Just under half (46%) of respondents from an ethnic minority background agree and 31% disagree compared to two-thirds (65%) of respondents from a white background who agree and 14% who disagree.

Question 11. Taking everything into account how good a job do you think the Derbyshire police are doing?

The proportion of respondents (39%) who feel that Derbyshire police are doing an excellent or good job is similar to the previous year (40%), but continues to be lower than previous years (53%/54%). The CSEW figure for Derbyshire for 2022/23 is 51%, the same as 2019/20; however, this is based on small samples of 708 and 563 respondents respectively and should therefore be taken with caution. The Listening To You figures are in line with the trend seen in the YouGov monthly tracker “Are the police doing a good job?” which fell around 20 percentage points from mid-2019 to early 2022, but has remained fairly stable since.

Reports in the national media during the past few years concerning incidents where individual police officers have committed serious crimes and/or victims have received a poor service are likely to have affected the perception of policing as a whole.

Respondents who had seen or heard information about what the police are doing to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour in their local area (Q8) were more than one and a half times more likely to feel that Derbyshire Police are doing an excellent or good job (48%) than those who had not seen or heard information (29%).

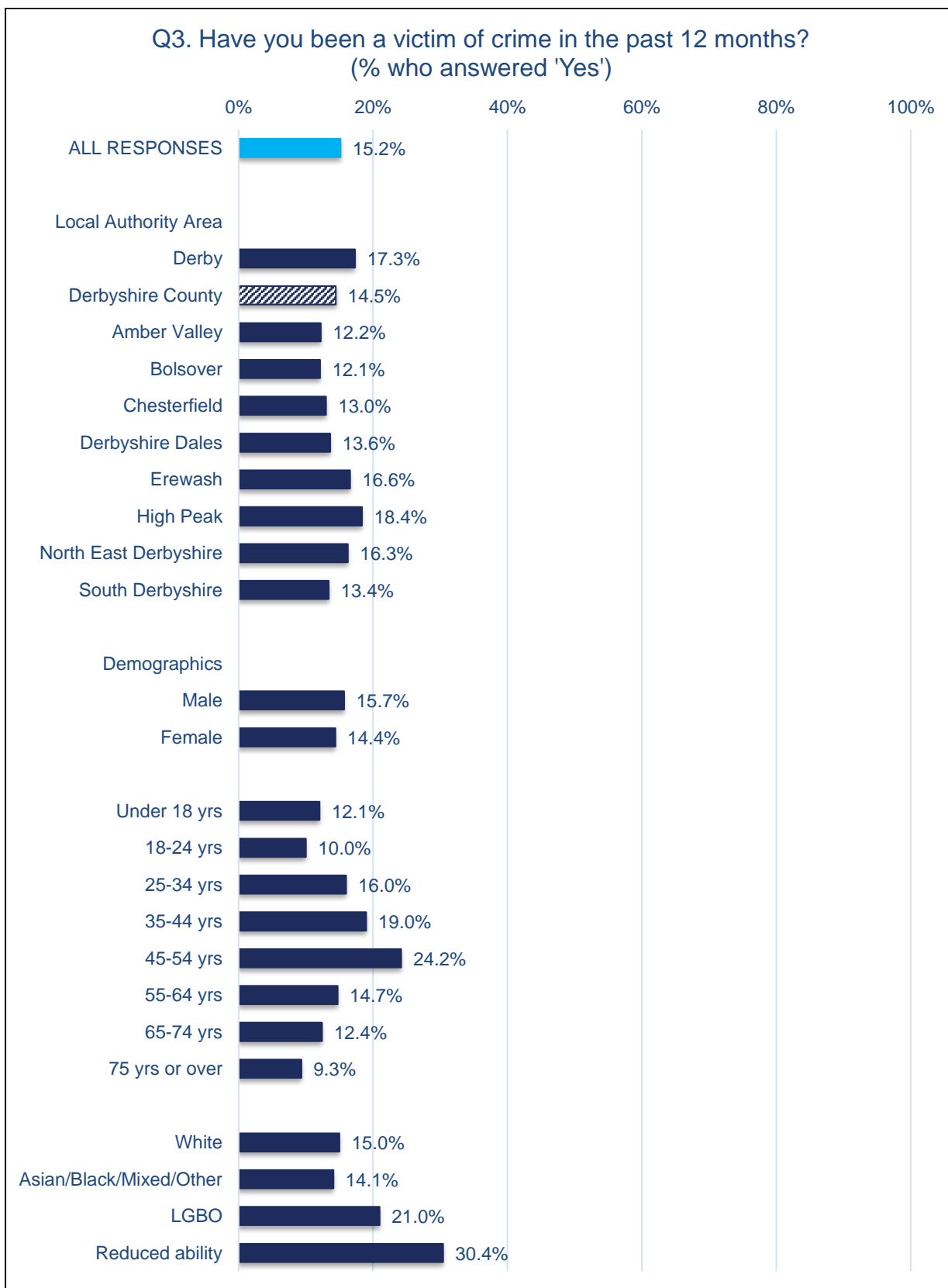

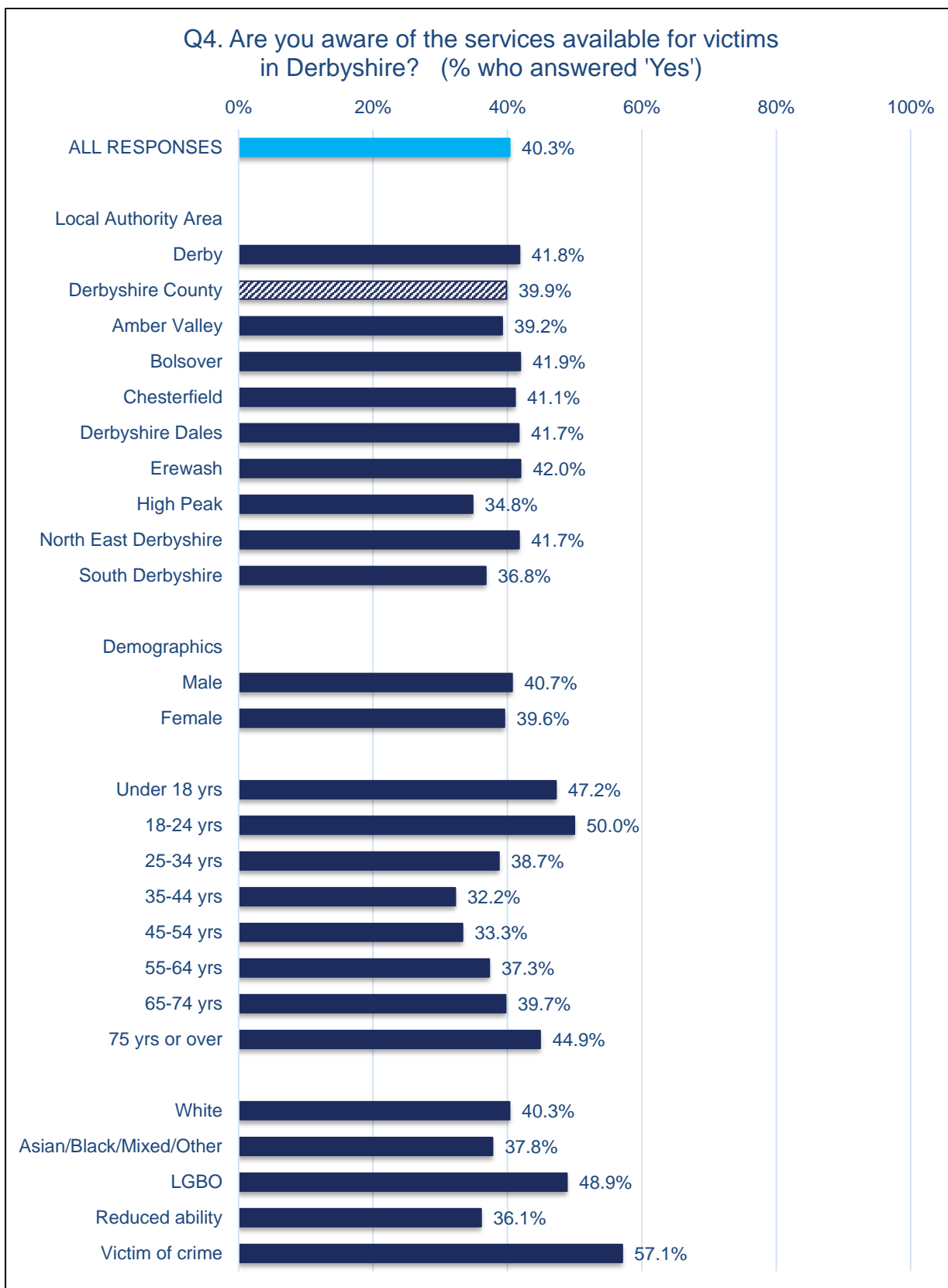

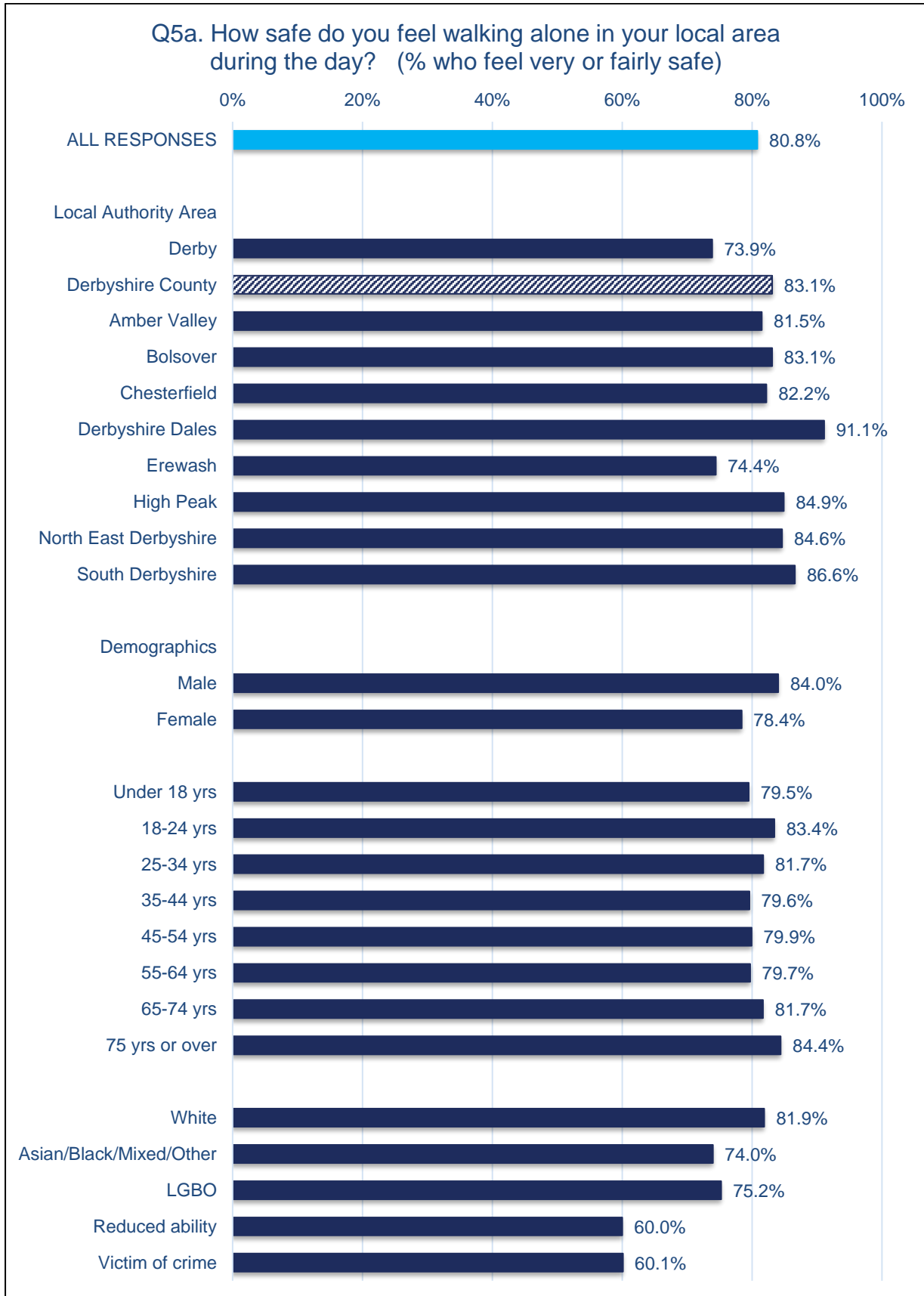


Q5a. How safe do you feel walking alone in your local area during the day?

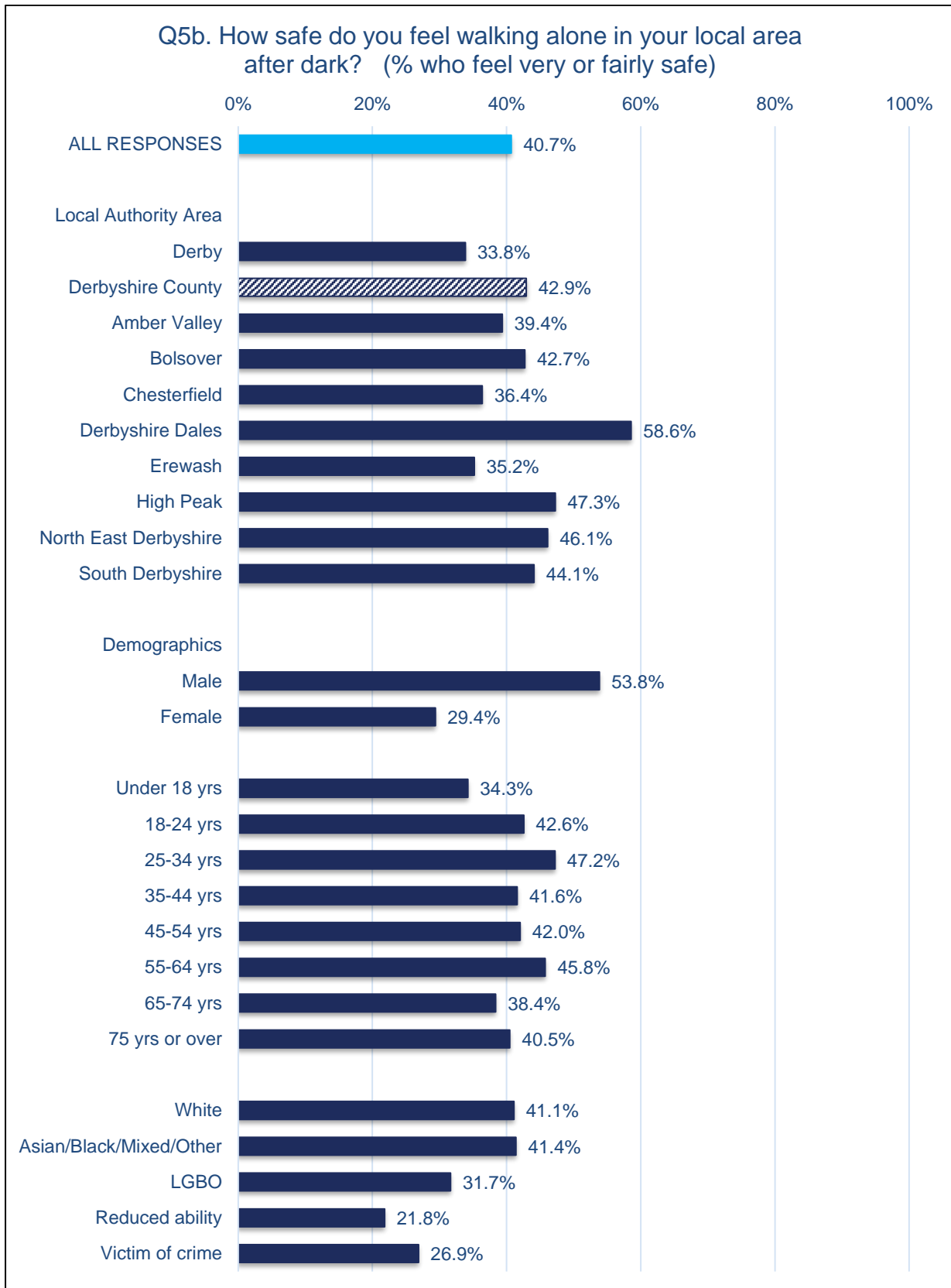

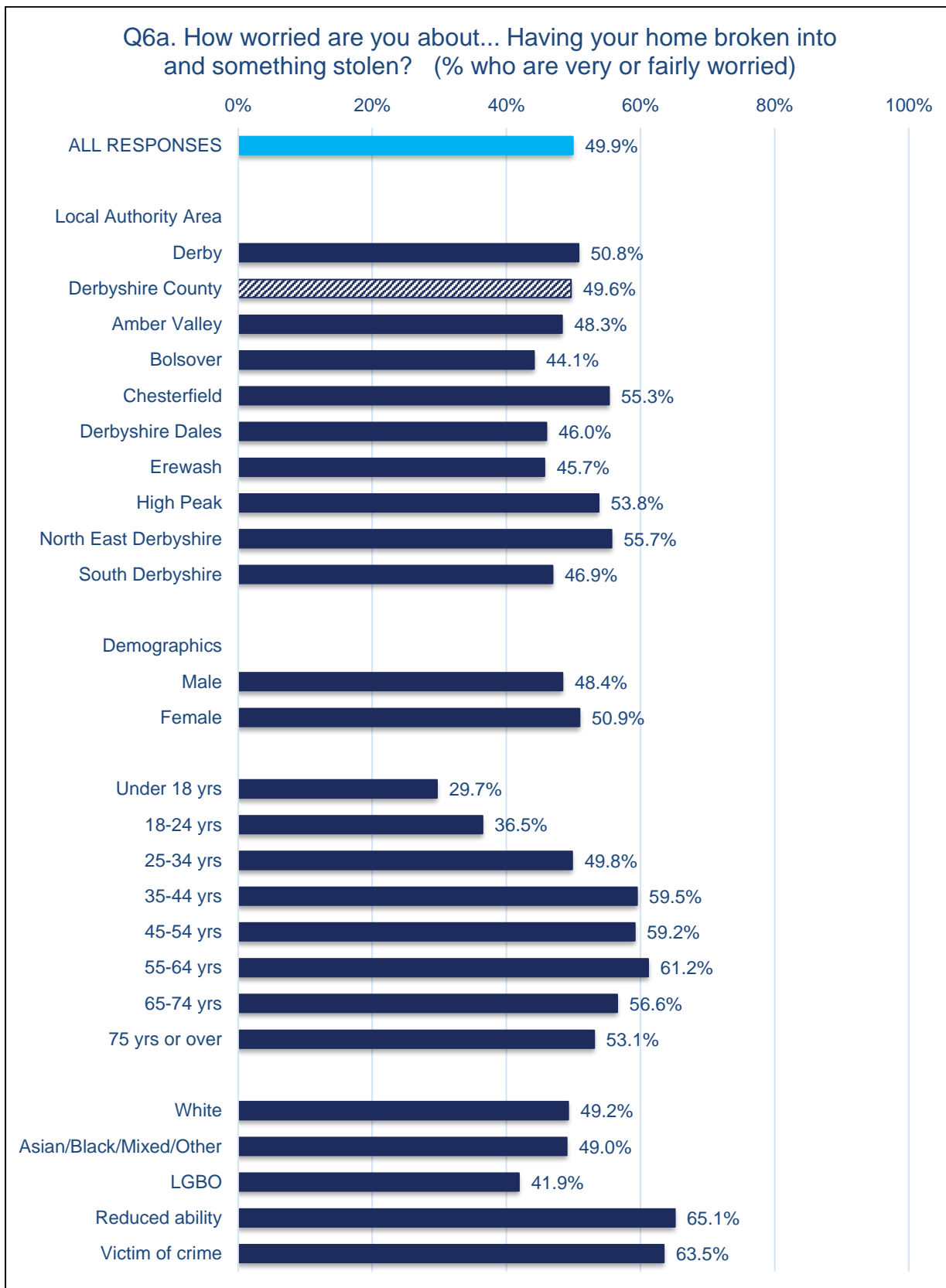

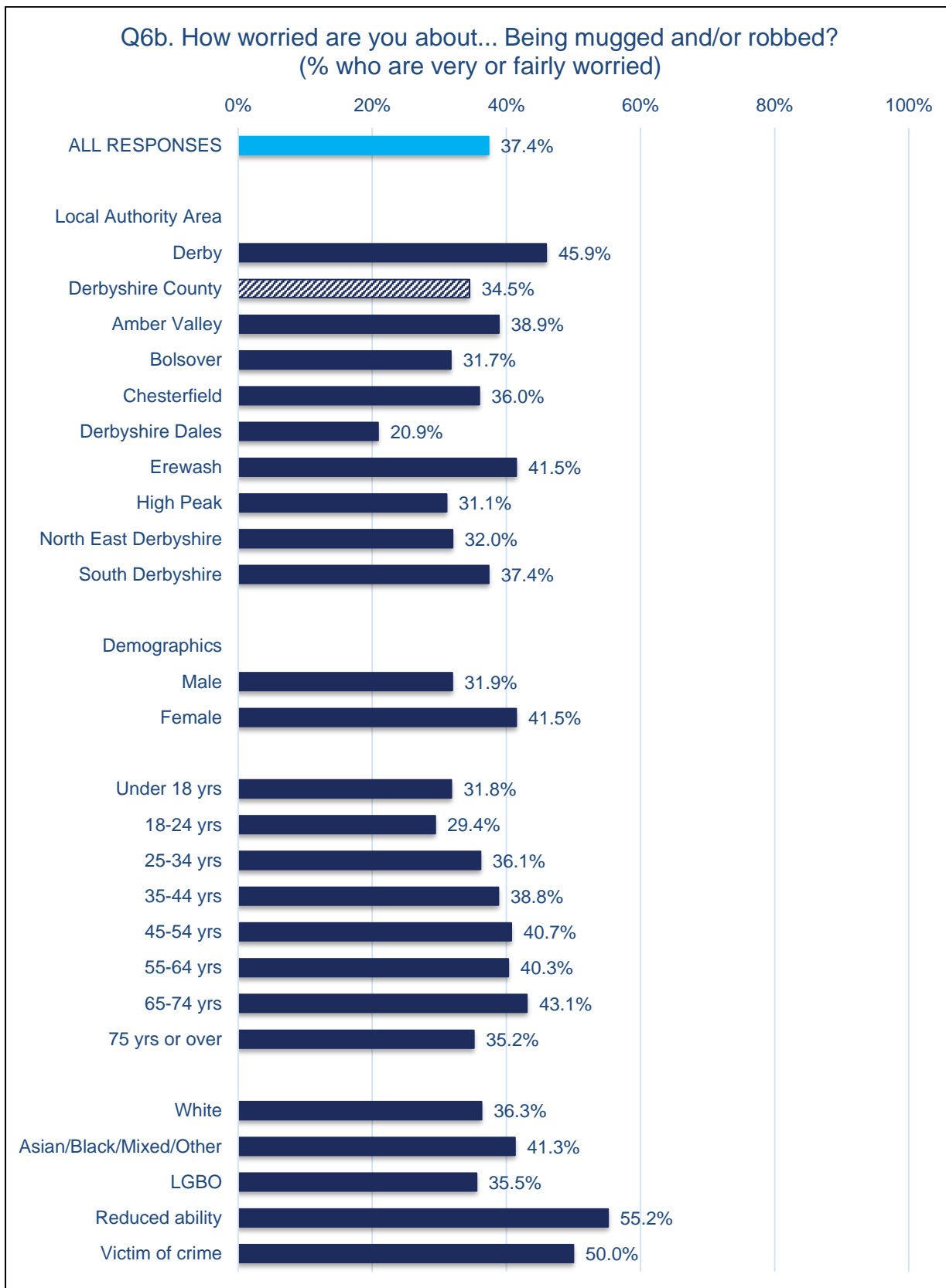

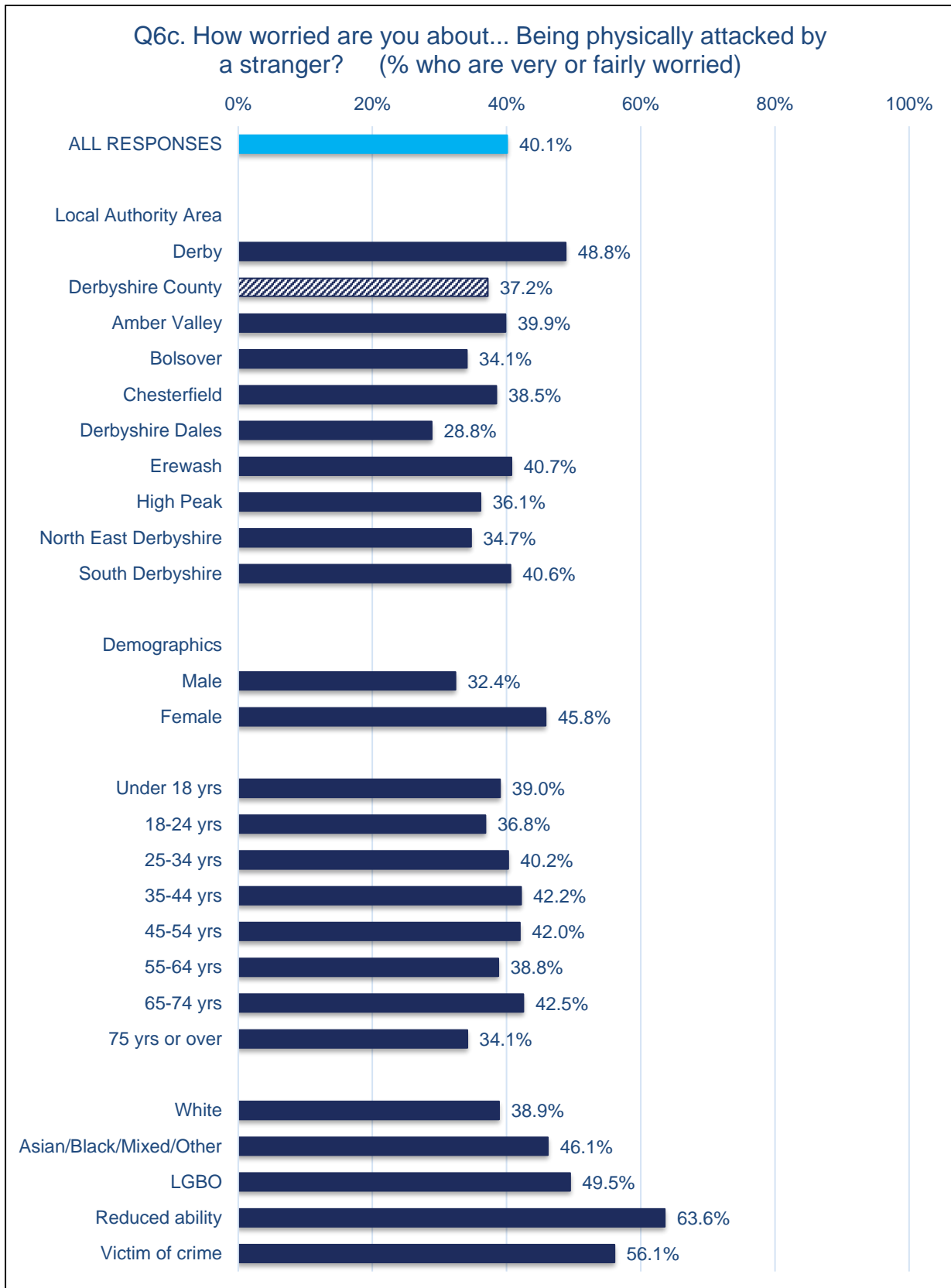

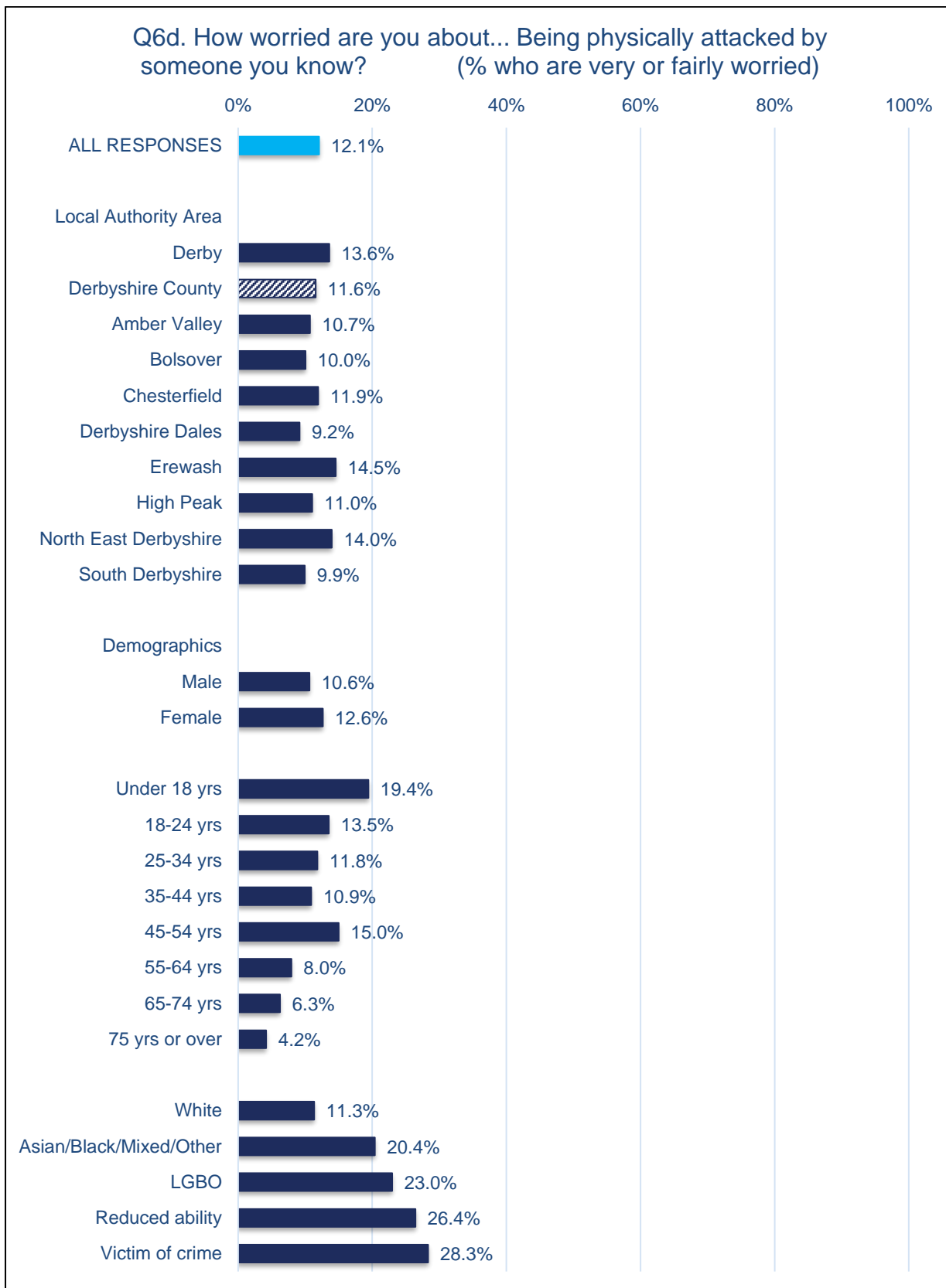

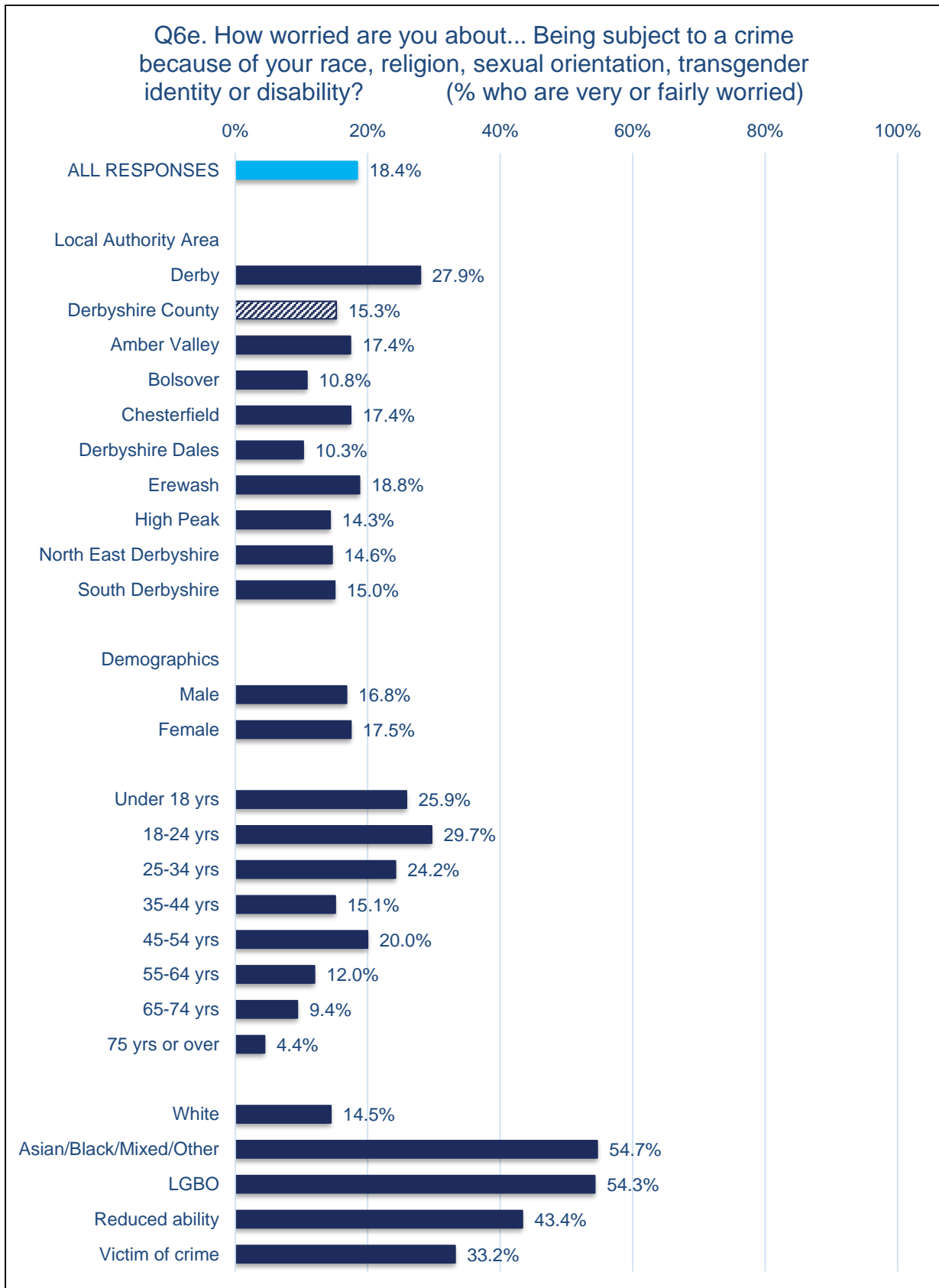

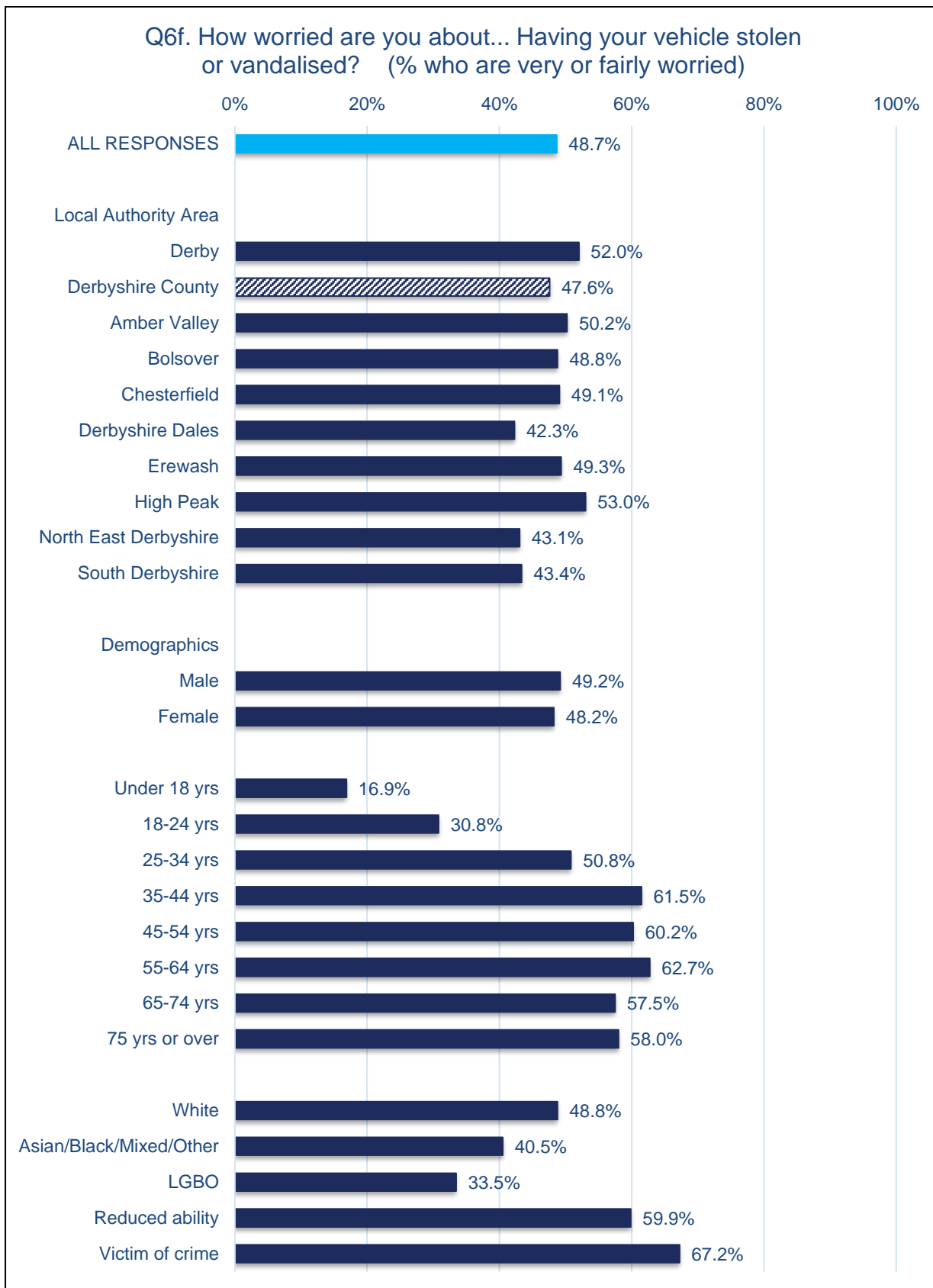

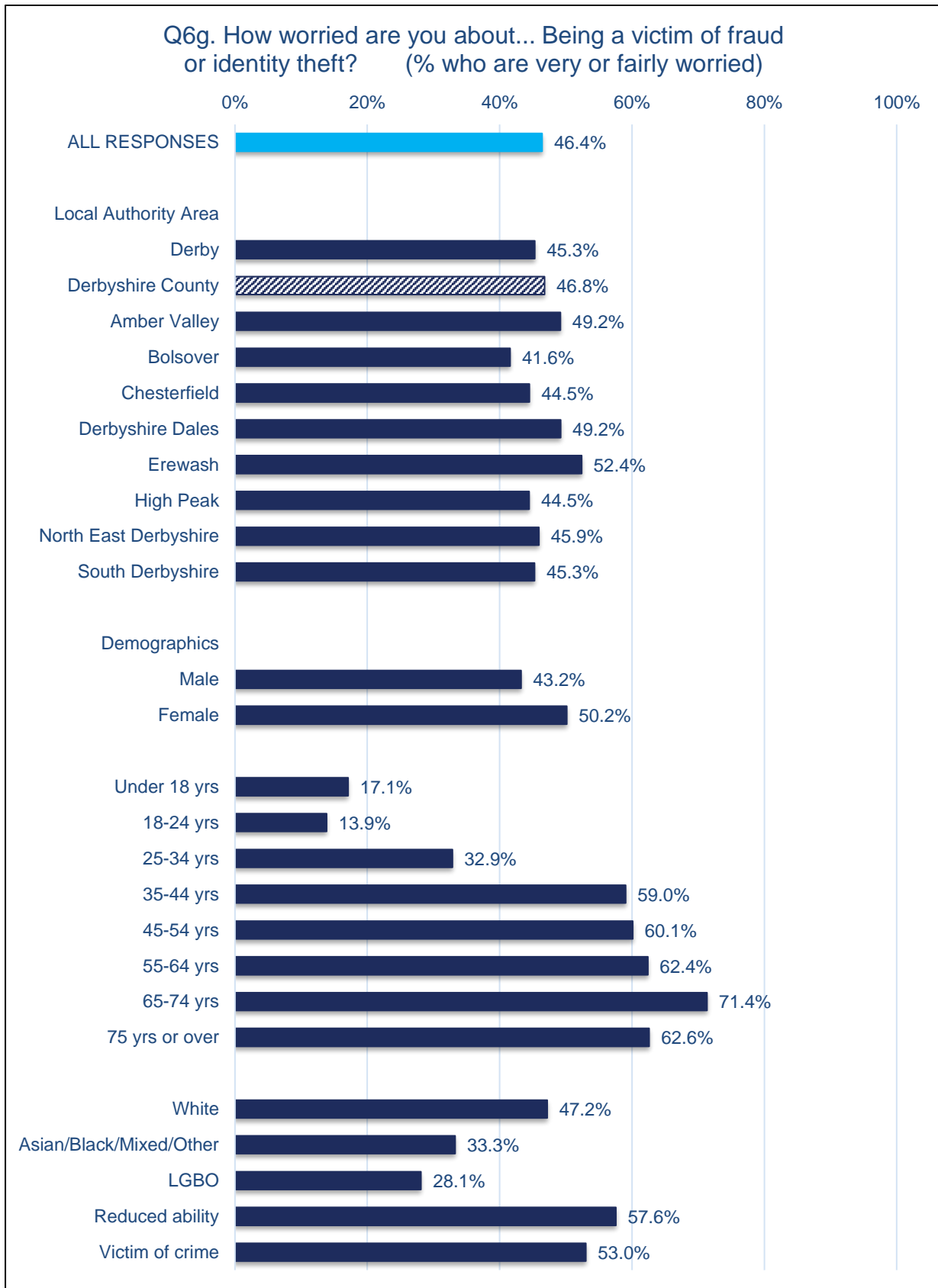

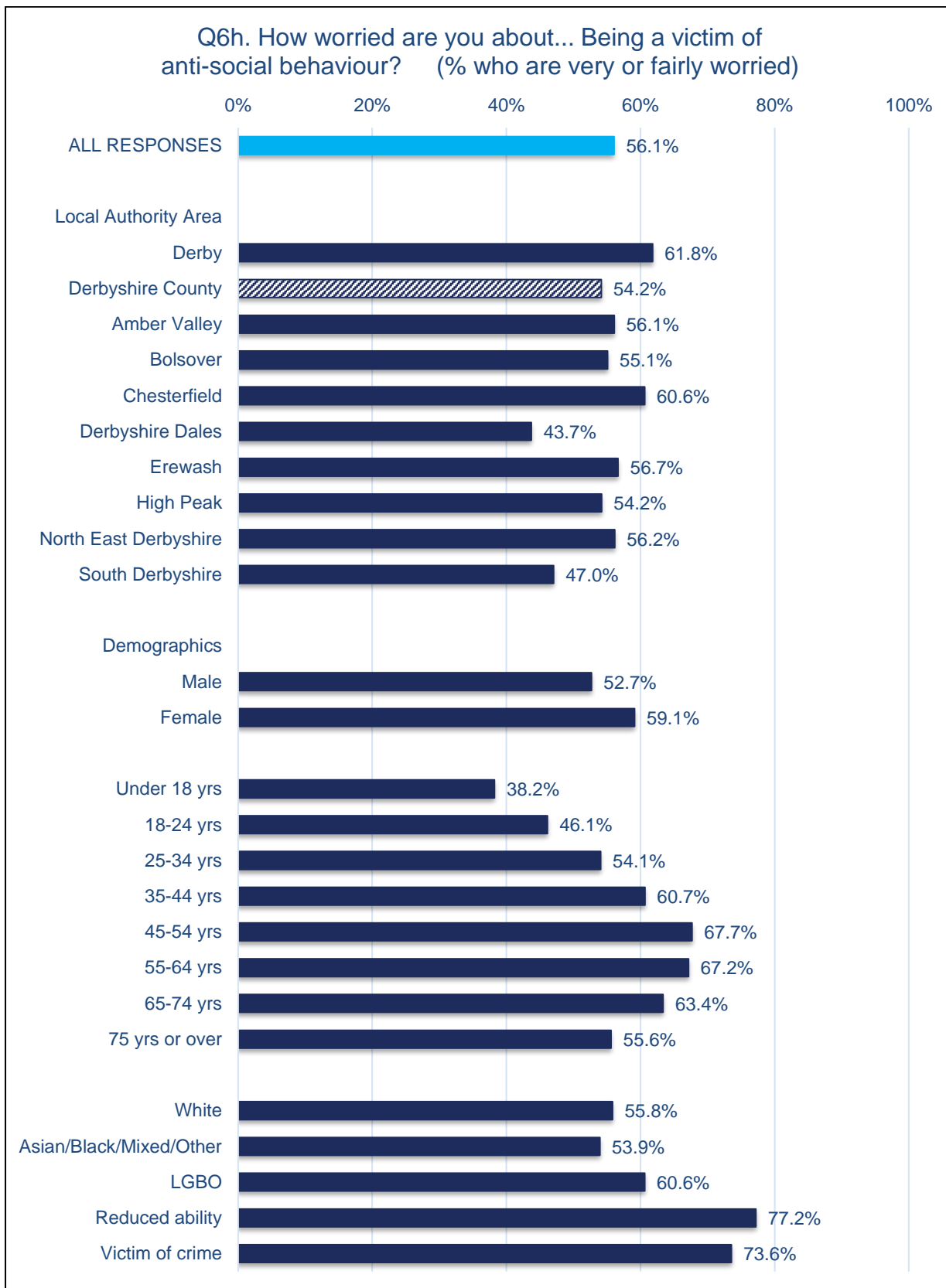

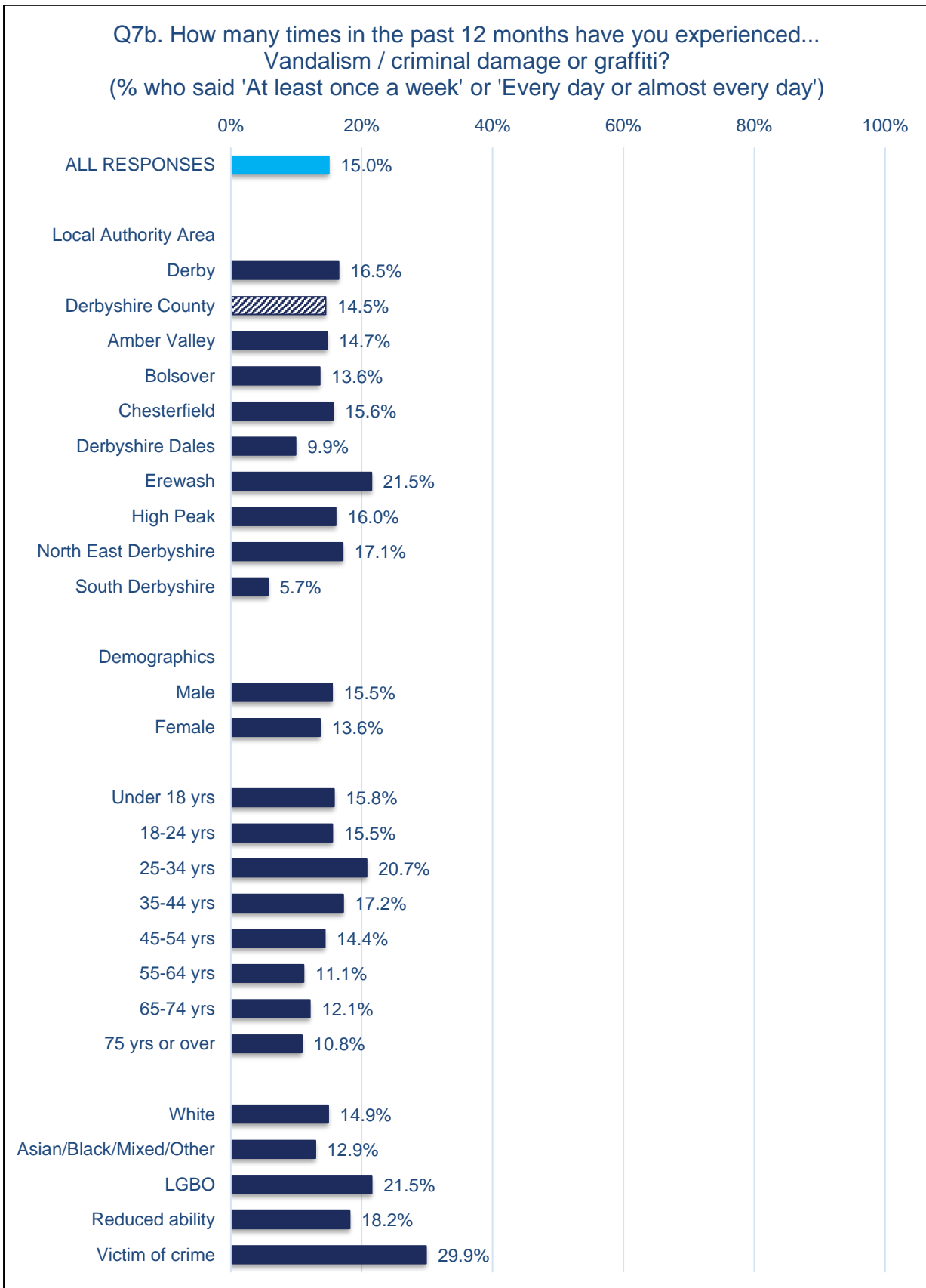

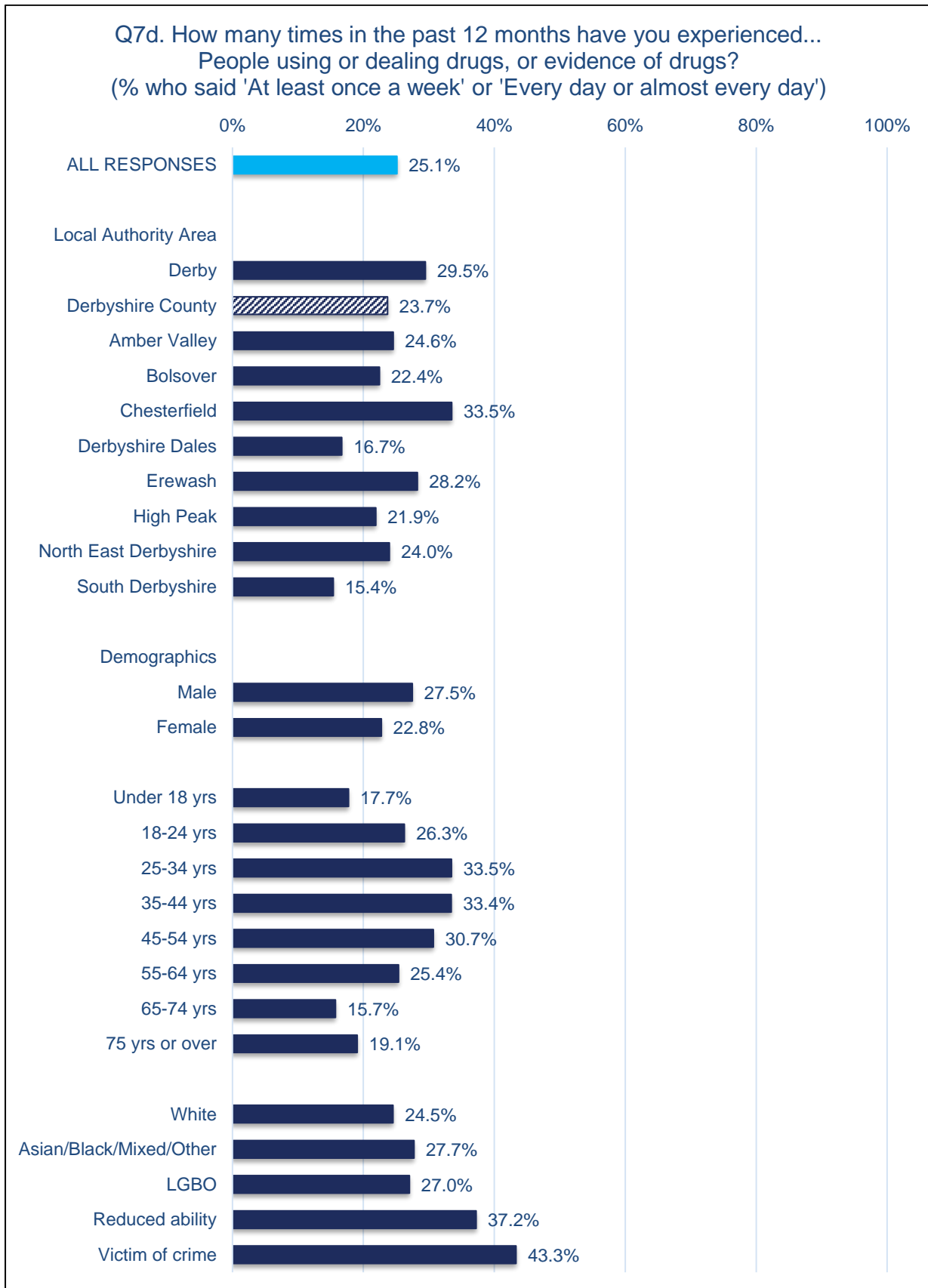

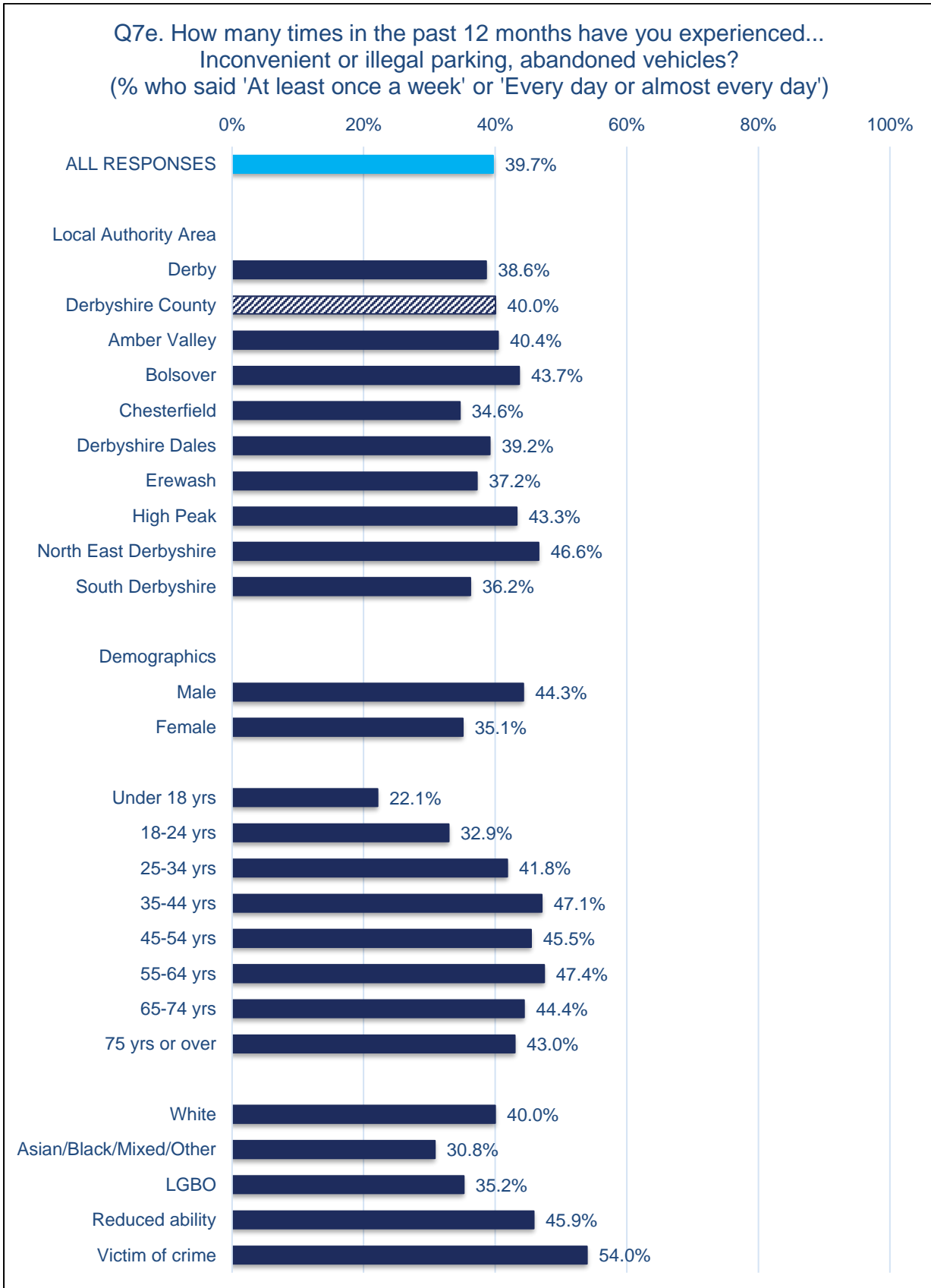

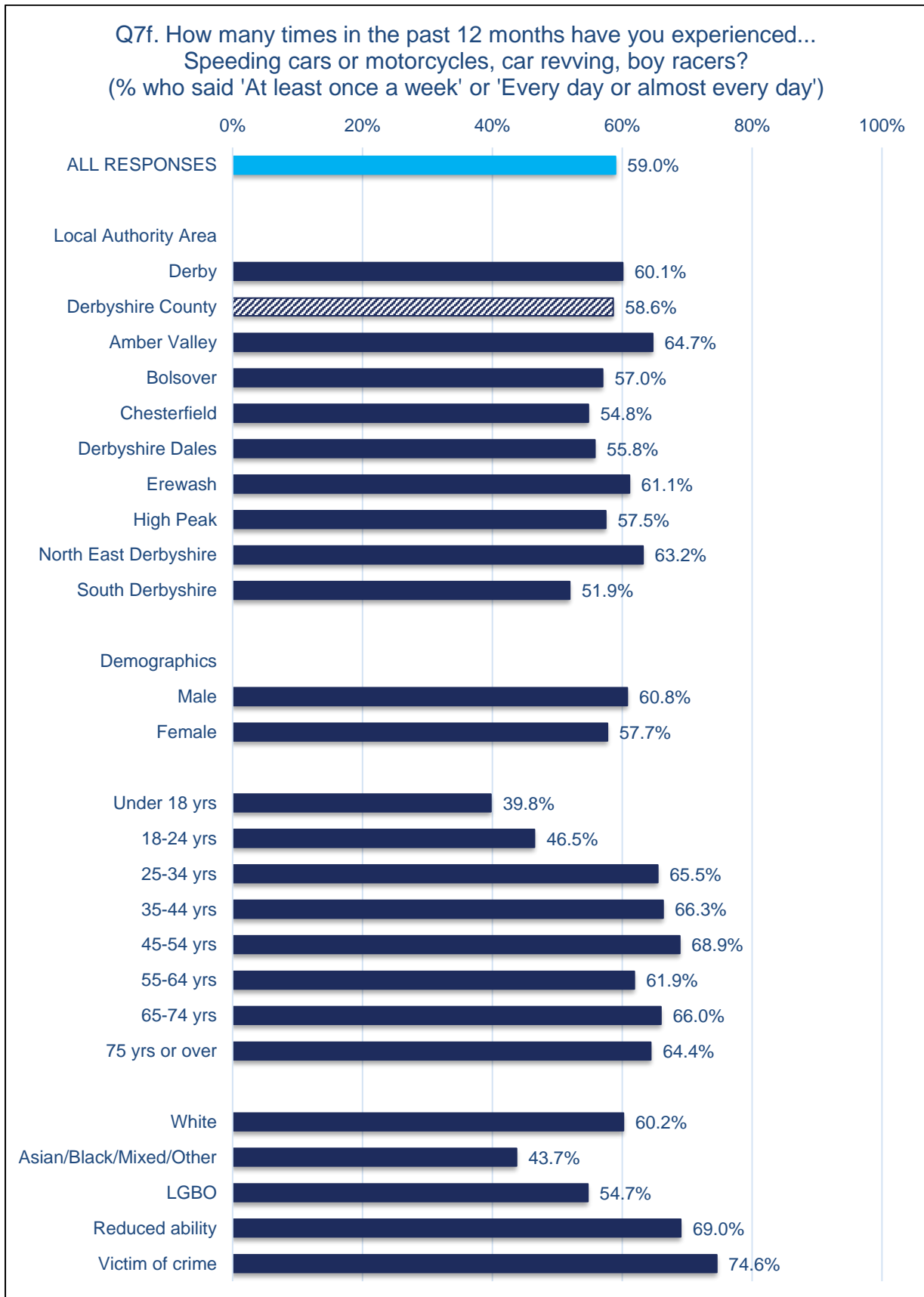

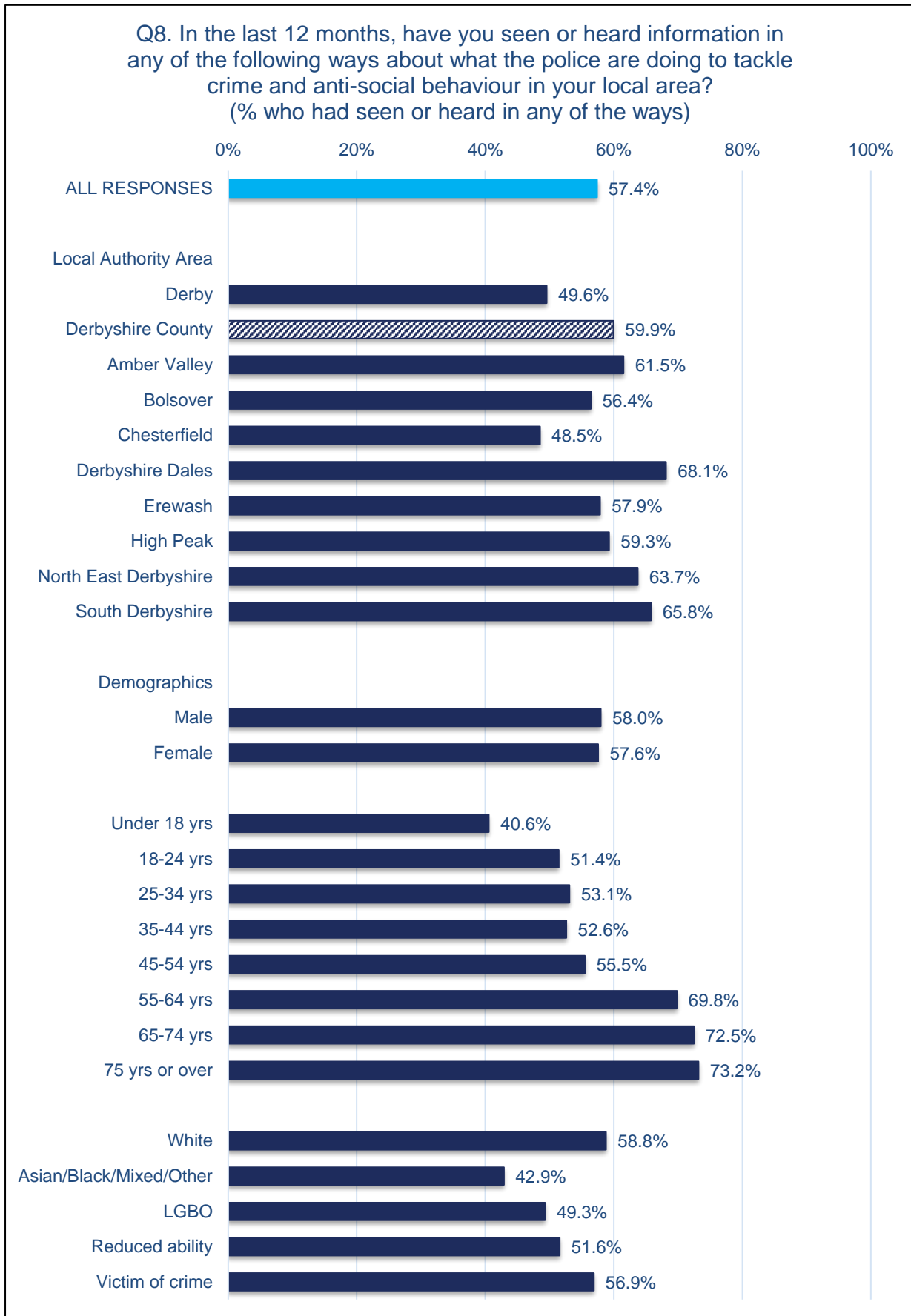

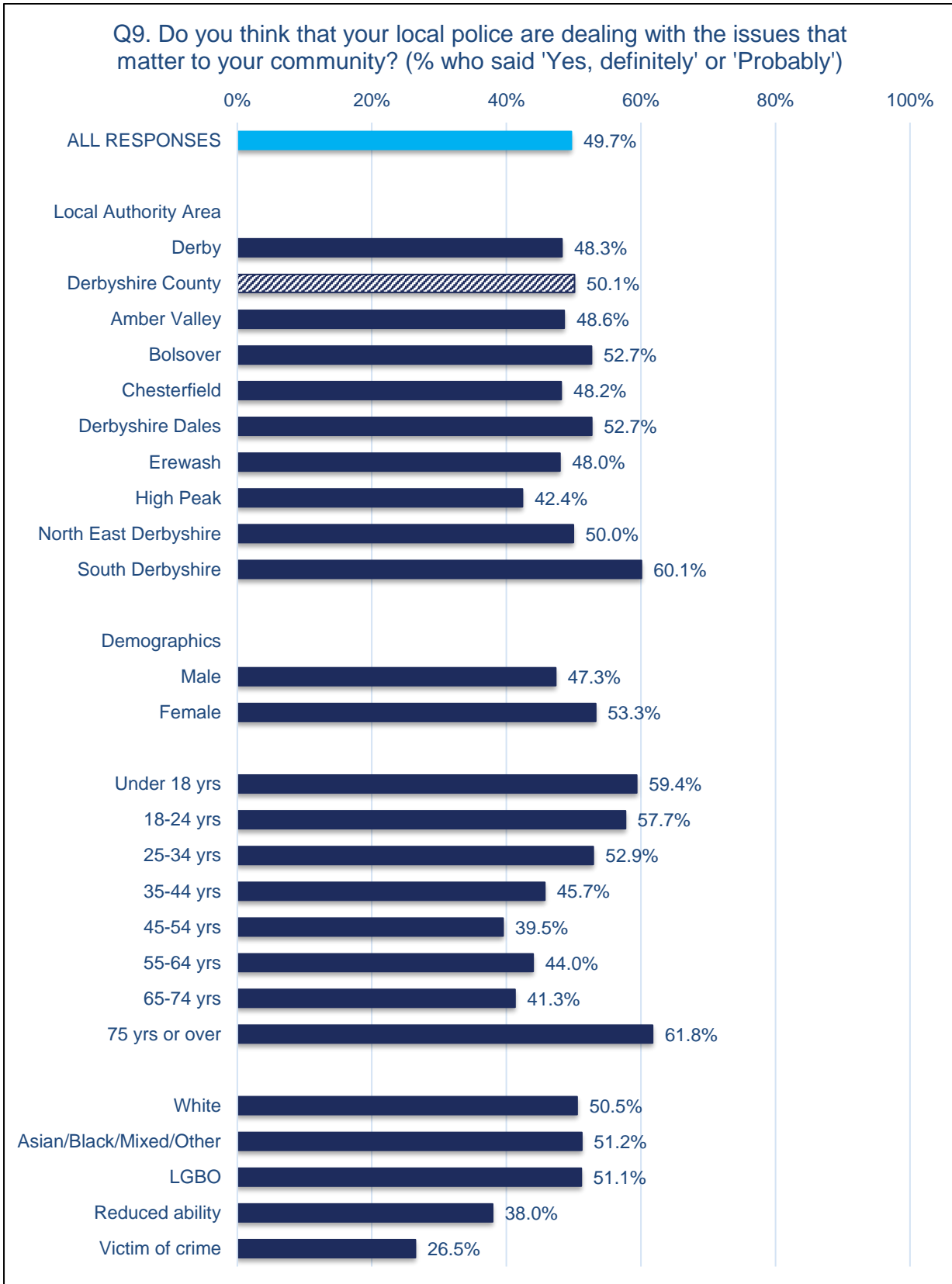

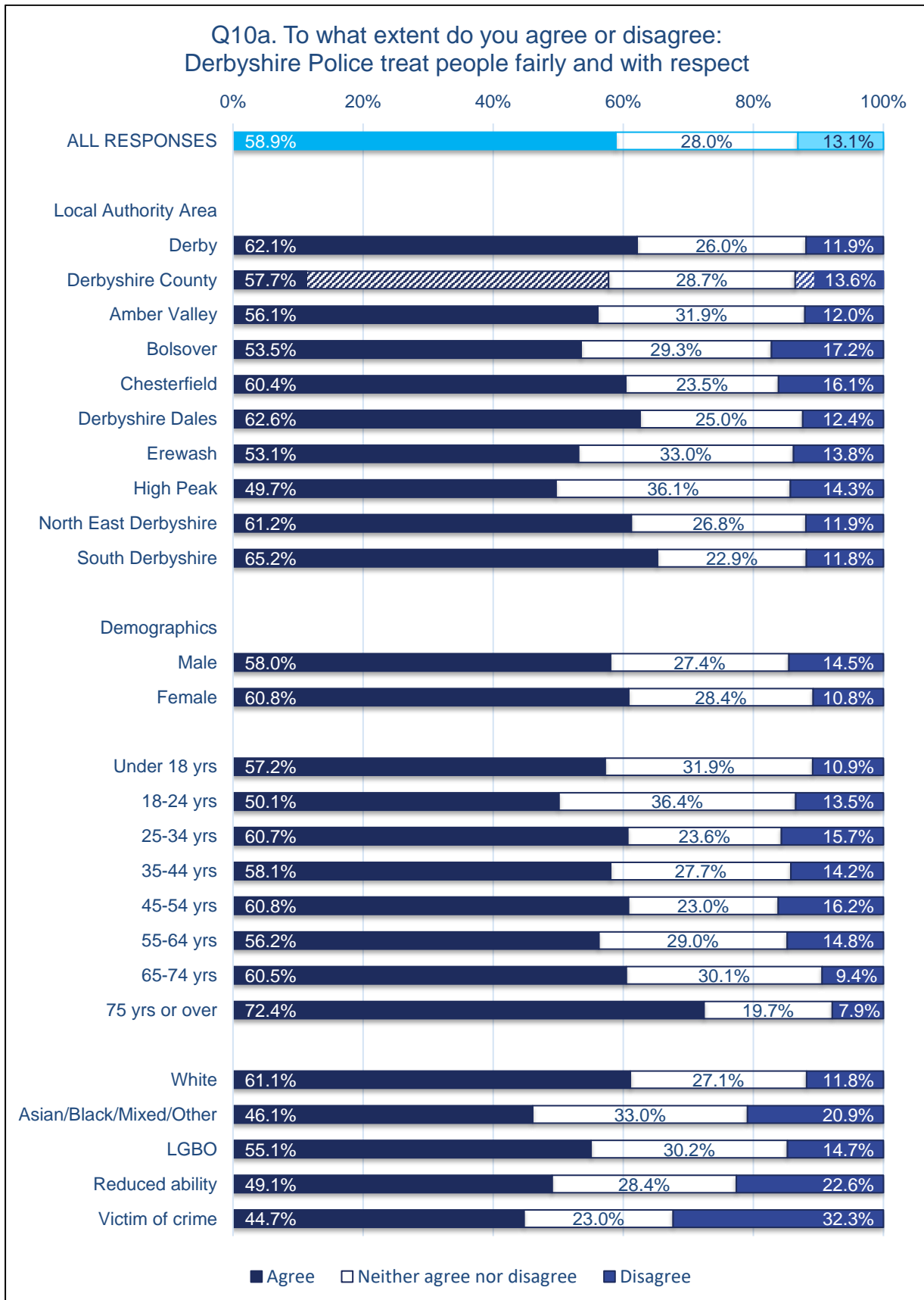

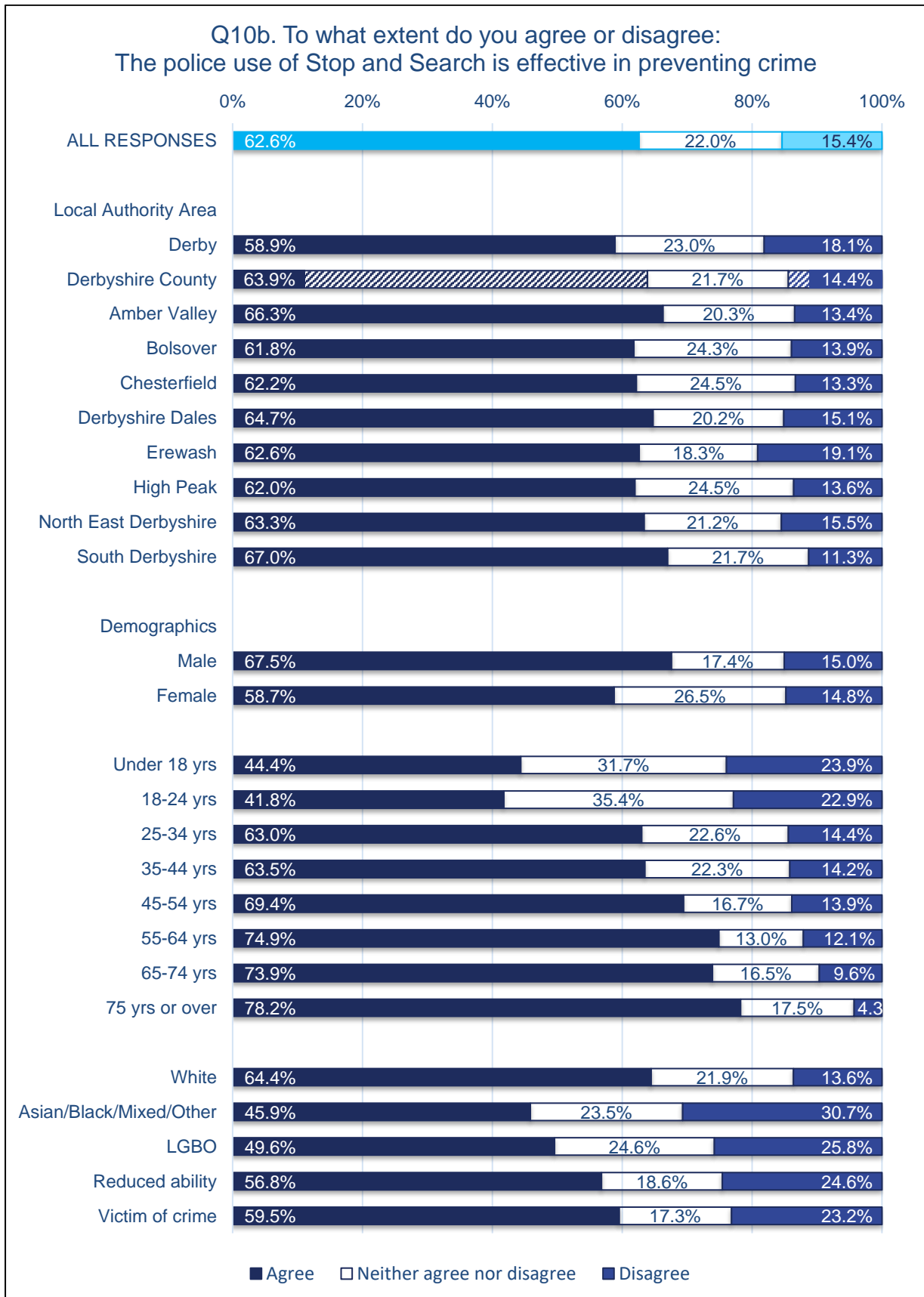

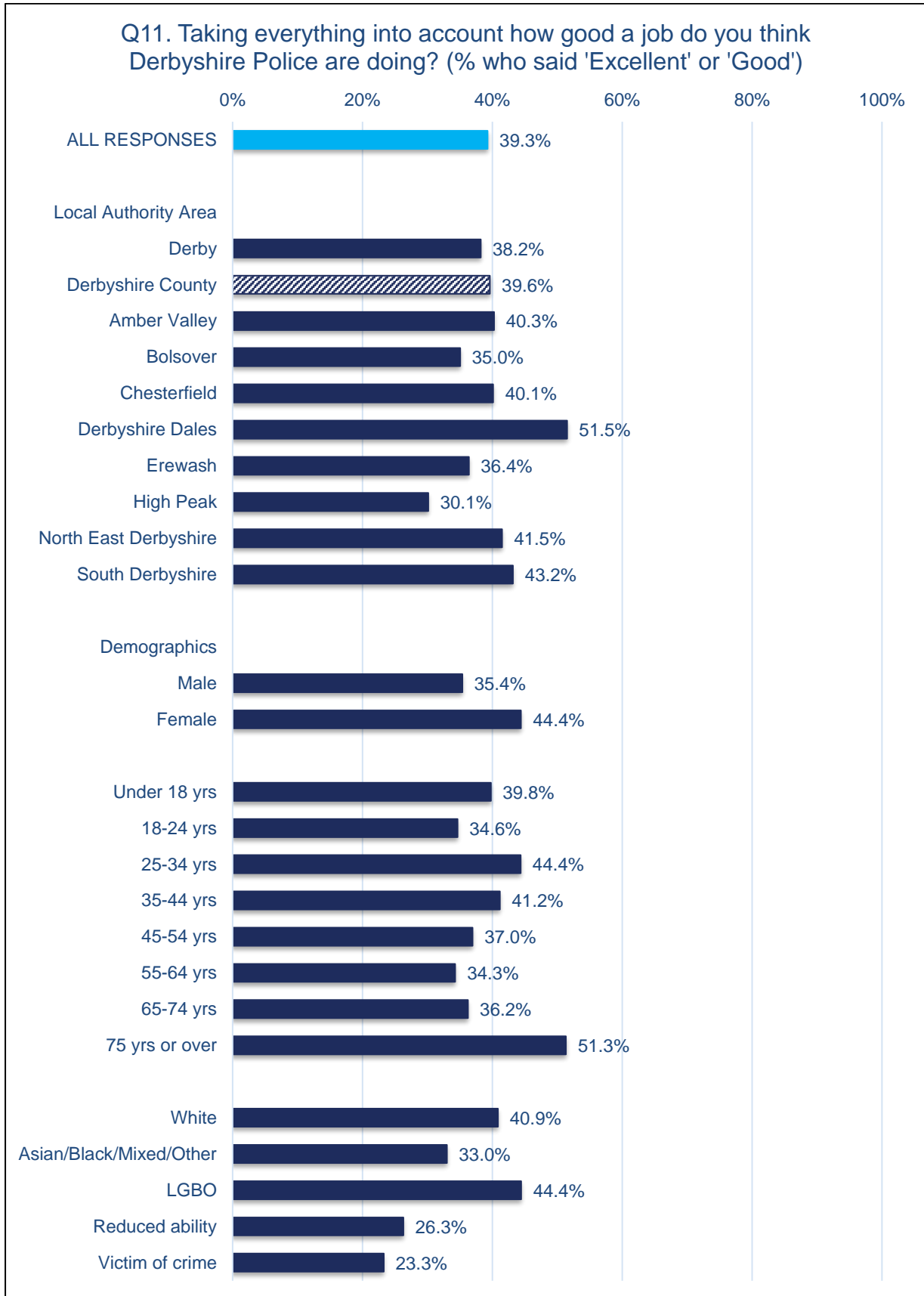
