Introduction

As Police and Crime Commissioner, I have been elected to represent the residents of Derbyshire. Listening and acting on their views will remain the primary focus of my work.

I take every opportunity to invite feedback on what local people need to feel safer. Listening to You is an ongoing consultation programme used throughout the year to understand community safety and policing services from the perspectives of those they are created to serve.

Throughout 2024/25, thousands of residents have contributed to my Listening to You programme. I am grateful to everyone who took the time to share their thoughts. These insights have provided me with a wealth of information to ensure the decisions we continue to make as partners are based on the best interests and needs of our communities.

It has been encouraging to see evidence of improvement in the work we have undertaken this year in response to last year's findings. One area is public awareness about our victim support services, which has seen a six per cent uplift compared to 2023/24. This issue has been the focus of additional investment in communication and website resources, and it is reassuring to see that these measures are having the desired impact, particularly among recent victims of crime.

Confidence in local policing is largely the same as last year, but up on the previous two years with the proportion of residents agreeing that Derbyshire police treat people fairly and with respect also staying the same. Positively, more people feel that the force is doing an excellent or good job than in the last three years. This is strongly welcomed and shows that tireless efforts to improve service standards to the public are making a difference.

However, as in previous years, there appears to be a higher fear of crime by residents in Derbyshire compared to the country as a whole – even though Derbyshire's crime rate remains below the national average. This is especially the case for property crime in Derbyshire.

Perceptions of safety also vary, with significant differences based on individual experiences of crime, ethnicity, age, sexuality and disability.

Trust and confidence are the cornerstones of effective policing. As safety leaders, it is vital we remain reactive to the concerns of our communities and take proactive steps to address them to improve overall feelings of safety and security.

The roll out of the Neighbourhood Policing Guarantee should strengthen relationships between officers and their communities by improving communication channels and empowering the public to set their own local priorities. The force has worked tirelessly to implement the new service standards, and recruitment is well underway to secure our quota of new officers.

My team will be working closely with partners over the coming year to ensure our resources are targeted appropriately to maximise public confidence and feelings of safety and to reduce offending. As Commissioner, I will also be seeking external funding opportunities to secure additional resources for Derbyshire.

It is imperative that our communities feel supported, empowered and understood. This cannot be achieved by one organisation alone. Community safety is a journey we must take together, and I will continue to do whatever it takes to involve and learn from the people who know our communities best.

I am grateful for your engagement and for sharing your experiences and views with me. Together, we will make Derbyshire safer and stronger.

Conducting the survey

A total of 3,675 questionnaires were completed in 2024/25 by residents from across the whole of the Derbyshire Police force area, with around 300 respondents from each of the nine local authorities.

As usual, the survey was promoted at various engagement events across Derby and Derbyshire, including in Buxton, Chesterfield, Long Eaton, Matlock, South Normanton and Swadlincote. Young people were engaged with at Chesterfield College, Derby College, Buxton and Leek College and Derby University Refresher Fair.

The survey was also regularly promoted through various channels, including social media (Facebook, Instagram, X, Nextdoor), Derbyshire Alert and via partners, to try to reach a wide variety of demographics and ensure as representative sample as possible.



Commentary and Main Points

Responses were received from 3,675 people, which equates to approximately one in every 290 residents of the Derbyshire Police force area having completed a survey during this 12-month period.

The profile of respondents is broadly representative of the population of Derbyshire with regard to female/male, age group, home local authority, ethnic background and sexual orientation. However, to ensure that valid comparisons can be made across the different demographics, and that results can be directly compared to past and future survey results, answers have been weighted by female/male, age group and home local authority in line with the Census 2021 profile of Derbyshire.

Results calculations for each question are generally based on answers where the respondent has expressed an opinion only, i.e. "Don't know / Prefer not to say" and blank answers have been excluded unless specified.

Particular issues of note from individual questions are detailed below. Where appropriate, comparisons have been made with results from the Crime Survey for England & Wales (CSEW) year ending March 2025.

Question 3. Have you been a victim of crime in the past 12 months?

Around one in eight respondents (13%) said that they had been a victim of crime in the past 12 months, similar to last year (12%). This is lower than the national CSEW estimates of 16% for the year ending March 2025; however, Derbyshire's crime rate is also below the national average.

Respondents with considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities were more than twice as likely (32%) than the average to have been a recent victim of crime, with respondents aged 25-44 years (20%) and those who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (22%) also more likely to have been a victim of crime.

Question 4. Are you aware of the services available for victims in Derbyshire?

Almost half of respondents (49%) said they were aware of the victim services that are available, which is higher than the last two years (43%/40%). The proportion of respondents who were aware was generally fairly consistent across areas and age groups, apart from respondents aged under 18 years and respondents from North East Derbyshire who were more aware, and respondents from High Peak who were less aware.

Two-thirds (65%) of respondents who had been a recent victim of crime were aware of the services available for them (compared to 47% of respondents who had not been a victim of crime). Again, this is higher than the last two years (58%/57%).

Question 5. How safe do you feel walking alone in your local area during the day / after dark?

Results show that most respondents (86%) felt either very safe or fairly safe walking alone in their local area during the day, similar to last year (87%).

Results for feeling safe during the day are fairly similar (mainly between 82%-90%) throughout the various demographics, apart from respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a victim of crime in the past 12 months - where results were significantly lower (56%/68%).

Around half of respondents (48%) felt safe walking alone in the local area after dark – similar to last year (50%).

However, there is considerable variance for feeling safe after dark in the local area. Females (33%), respondents who have been a recent victim of crime (37%) or who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (19%) were the least likely to say they felt safe, whereas males (64%) and those living in Derbyshire Dales (67%) were the most likely to say they felt safe.

In comparison, CSEW results show 78% of persons nationally felt safe when walking alone after dark (males 89%, females 68%), which may suggest that people in Derbyshire have a higher fear of crime, as Derbyshire's crime rates are lower than the national average.



Question 6. How worried are you about being a victim of the following types of crime?

Respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a recent victim of crime were consistently more worried than average about all of the issues asked about.

- a. Having your home broken into and something stolen?**
- b. Being mugged and / or robbed?**
- g. Having your vehicle stolen or vandalised?**

The proportion of respondents being very or fairly worried about property crimes – burglary (42%), mugging/robbery (36%) and car crime (42%) – are similar to, but slightly lower than the last two years. Respondents aged 24 years or under were considerably less worried about burglary and car crime than older respondents. Those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a recent victim of crime were around one and half times more worried than average about being a victim of property crime.

As in previous years, there does appear to be a higher fear of property crime in Derbyshire compared to the country as a whole – even though Derbyshire's burglary and vehicle crime rates are considerably below the national average. The Listening to You survey 2024/25 has 10% of respondents being very worried about burglary and 12% of respondents being very worried about car crime, compared to the CSEW year ending March 2025 national figures of 8% and 7% respectively.

c. Being physically attacked by a stranger?

Just over one third of respondents (36%) said they were very or fairly worried about being physically attacked by a stranger, similar to, but slightly below the last two years (41%/40%), with respondents who have been a recent victim of crime (52%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (63%) being the most worried. Females (46%) were much more worried than males (28%), and, generally, the level of worry increased with age.

The proportion of people very worried about violent crime (9% being attacked by a stranger) is similar to the CSEW (8%).

d. Being physically attacked by someone you know?

Respondents were far less worried about being physically attacked by someone they know, with one in nine respondents (11%) saying they were very or fairly worried. Respondents from an ethnic minority background (17%), aged under 18 years (19%), who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (21%), who have been a recent victim of crime (25%) or have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (30%) were the most likely to be worried. Generally, the level of worry decreased with age.

e. Being sexually assaulted?

This is the second year that a question on worry about sexual assault was asked. One fifth of respondents (20%), compared to one quarter (25%) last year, said they were very or fairly worried, although this was much higher amongst females (33%) than males (6%). Levels of worry decreased with age, with those aged 24 years or under (29%) being two times more likely to be worried than those aged 45 years or over (14%). Respondents who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality were more than twice as likely (42%) to be worried than the average.

f. Being subject to a crime because of your race, religion, sexual orientation, transgender identity or disability?

One in seven respondents (15%) said they were worried about being subject to a crime because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, transgender identity or disability. This question had the widest variance of levels of worry by different demographics.

Almost half (47%) of respondents from an ethnic minority background said they were worried compared to 11% of respondents from a white ethnic background.

Respondents who have been a recent victim of crime (24%), who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (37%) or who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (44%) were also much more likely to say they were worried. Levels of worry decreased significantly with age – those aged 24 years or under were two times more likely to be worried (22%) compared to those aged 25 years or over (11%).

h. Being a victim of fraud or identity theft?

Levels of worry about fraud (46%) are similar to the last two years (49%/46%) and have reduced compared to 2016/17 to 2020/21 (average 57%). The CSEW indicates that fraud is one of the most common crime types experienced - by 7% of people in 2024/25. The fear of being a victim of fraud increased considerably with age – respondents aged 45 years or over were more than three times as likely to be worried about fraud (68%) than those aged 24 years or under (19%). The proportion of people very worried about fraud (13%) is lower than the CSEW (17%).

i. You or a family member being a victim of an online crime?

A new question in the 2024/25 survey asked respondents how worried they were about themselves or a family member being a victim of an online crime. Results are similar to the question on being a victim of fraud, with just over half of respondents (51%) saying they were very worried or fairly worried. Respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities were the most worried (70%). Levels of worry increased with age, with 31% of those aged 24 years or under worried compared to 66% of those aged 45 years or over.

j. Being a victim of antisocial behaviour?

Just under half (45%) of respondents said they were worried about being a victim of anti-social behaviour, lower than the last two years (55%/56%). Respondents who have been a recent victim of crime (64%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (68%) were the most likely to be worried. Respondents aged 24 years or under were considerably less likely to be worried (31%) than those aged 25 years or over (50%).

Question 7. How many times in the past 12 months have you personally experienced or witnessed in your local area?

- a. Street drinking / drunken behaviour / under-age drinking**
- b. Vandalism / criminal damage or graffiti**
- c. Inconsiderate behaviour**
- d. People using or dealing drugs, or evidence of drugs**

Responses to these questions are very similar to last year, with around one in five respondents (one in seven for vandalism, damage or graffiti) experiencing the above behaviours on at least a weekly basis: street drinking / drunken behaviour 20%; vandalism / damage 14%; inconsiderate behaviour 23%; drug use / dealing 22%.

Apart from inconsiderate behaviour, results for Derby City and Derbyshire County overall showed little difference, although there was a large variance between different areas around the force.

There was also considerable variance with the different age groups, with respondents aged 25-44 years generally being the most likely to report having experienced or witnessed the behaviours. Respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a recent victim of crime were more than one and a half times more likely than the average to say they had experienced or witnessed these behaviours.

- e. Inconvenient or illegal parking, abandoned vehicles**
- f. Speeding cars or motorcycles, car revving, boy racers**

As in previous years, these two types of behaviours were reported as occurring more frequently than the others. For inconvenient or illegal parking and / or abandoned vehicles, two out of five respondents (41%) said they had experienced or witnessed this at least weekly. More than half of respondents (54%) said they had experienced or witnessed speeding cars or motorcycles, car revving and / or boy racers at least weekly.

For both issues, results are fairly consistent across all areas of the force, apart from speeding in Derbyshire Dales which is a little lower.

Question 8. Do you think that your local police are dealing with the issues that matter to your community?

More than half of respondents (56%) did feel that their local police are dealing with the issues in their community, which is similar to last year (57%), and an increase from 2021/22 and 2022/23 (53%/50%).

Respondents who were the most likely to agree that their local police are dealing with issues were those aged 24 years or under (66%), aged 75 years or over (68%) or from an ethnic minority background (73%). Respondents who were the least likely to agree were those who had been a recent victim of crime (35%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (37%).



Question 9. To what extent do you agree or disagree...?

a. Derbyshire Police treat people fairly and with respect

Two-thirds of respondents (67%) agreed that Derbyshire police treat people fairly and with respect, similar to previous years.

Respondents who had been a victim of crime (53%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (53%) were the least likely to agree. There was very little difference between respondents from an ethnic minority background (67% agreed, 9% disagreed) and respondents from a white ethnic background (68% agreed, 10% disagreed).

b. Derbyshire Police use physical force appropriately

Three out of five respondents (59%) agreed that Derbyshire Police use physical force appropriately, which is similar to 2021/22 (56%) when the question was last asked.

There was not much difference between the various demographics, although older people were slightly more likely to agree than younger people. Respondents from a white ethnic background agreed more (60%) than those from an ethnic minority background (54%). Respondents who had been a recent victim of crime (48%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (48%) were the least likely to agree.

c. Derbyshire Police use Stop and Search appropriately

Just over half of respondents (53%) agreed Stop and Search is used appropriately, which again is similar to when the question was last asked in 2021/22 (50%).

Again, there is little difference across the various demographics, including between respondents from a white ethnic background (54% agreed, 9% disagreed) and those from an ethnic minority background (51% agreed, 11% disagreed).

d. The police use of Stop and Search is an effective tool to prevent crime

Just over half of respondents (55%) agreed that the police use of Stop and Search is an effective tool to prevent crime, a reduction from last year (67%), but the same as in 2021/22 (55%). One in seven respondents disagreed (15%).

Older respondents were more likely to agree than younger respondents, with 49% of those aged 24 years or under agreeing compared to 61% of those aged 45 years or older.

There was little difference between respondents from an ethnic minority background (55% agreed, 10% disagreed) and respondents from a white ethnic background (55% agreed, 15% disagreed).

e. I feel I have enough information about how I can keep myself and my family safe online

This was a new question in the 2024/25 survey and more than two-thirds of respondents (70%) agreed that they had enough information about keeping safe online, although 11% disagreed. Responses were fairly similar across the various demographics, with those aged 24 years or under only slightly more likely to agree (75%) than those aged 25 years or over (68%).

Question 10. Taking everything into account how good a job do you think the Derbyshire police are doing?

The proportion of respondents (49%) who feel that Derbyshire police are doing an excellent or good job is higher than the last three years (39-44%), and now more similar to 2017/18 to 2020/21 when it averaged 51%. The national YouGov monthly tracker “Are the police doing a good job?” also showed a large decrease from 2020 to 2022 (when reports emerged of a number of individual police officers who had committed serious crimes).

The CSEW figure for Derbyshire for “excellent/good job” in 2024/25 is 44% which is similar to the Listening to You figure; however, the CSEW figure is based on a small sample size of 566 people.

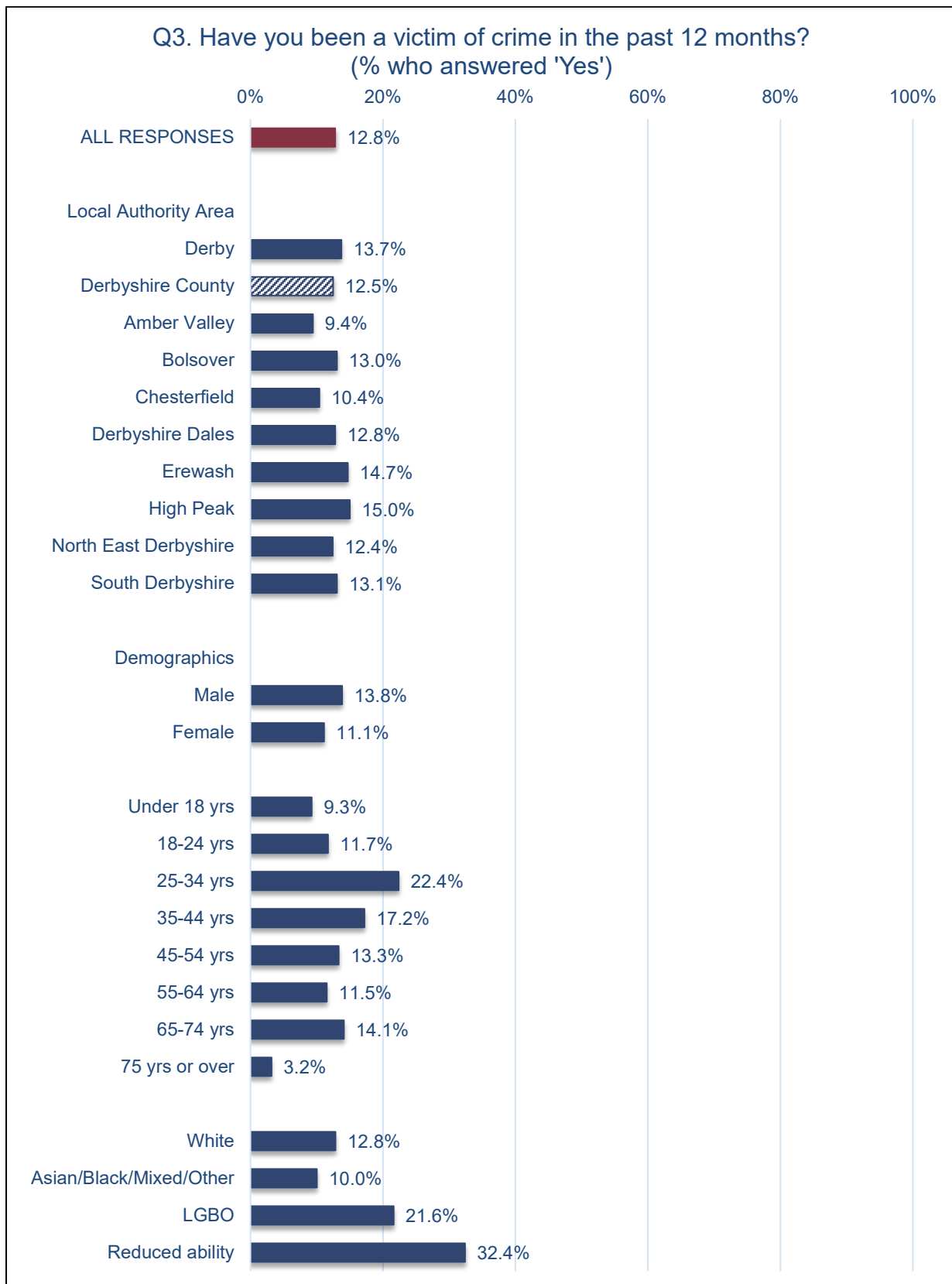

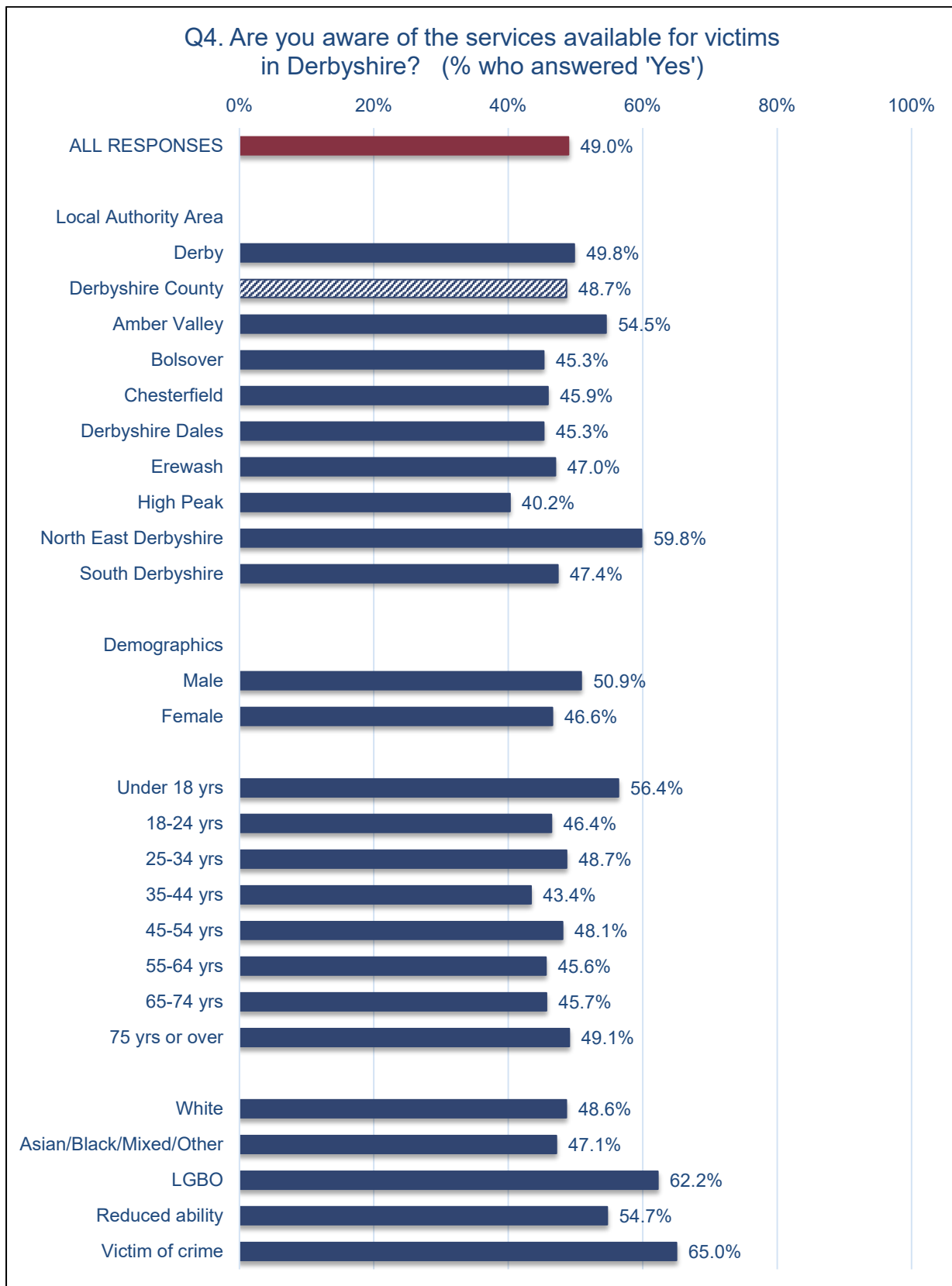

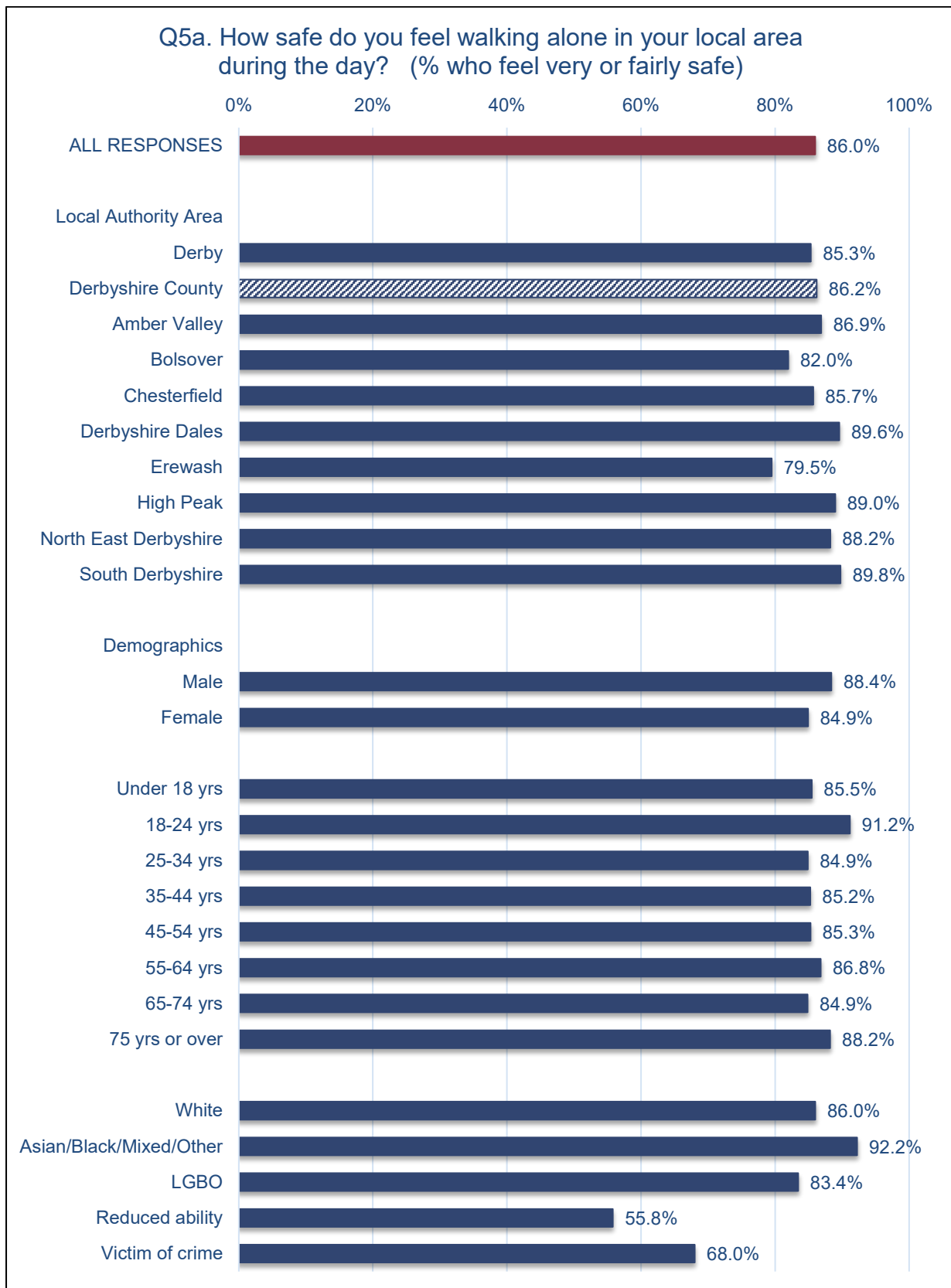

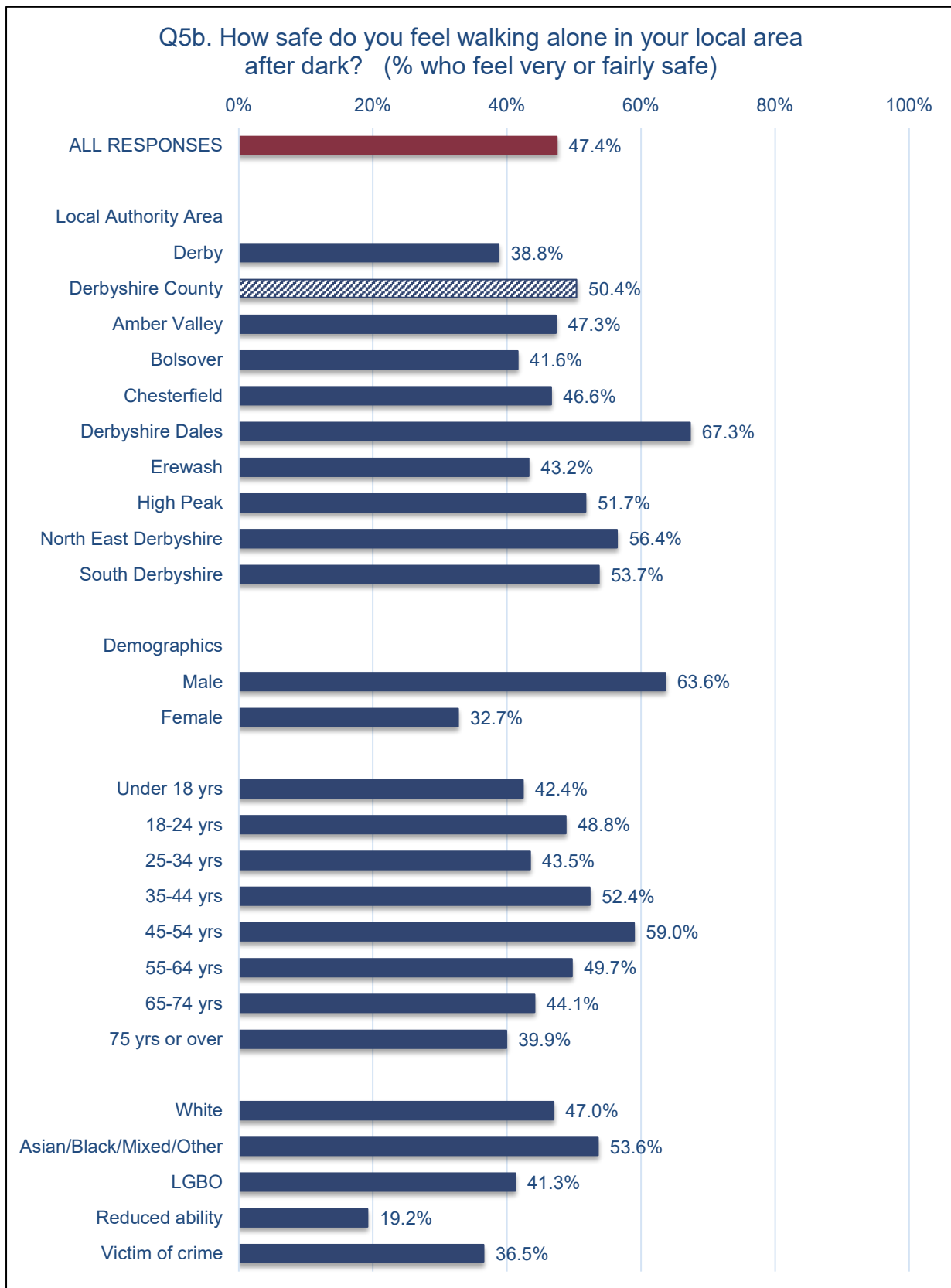

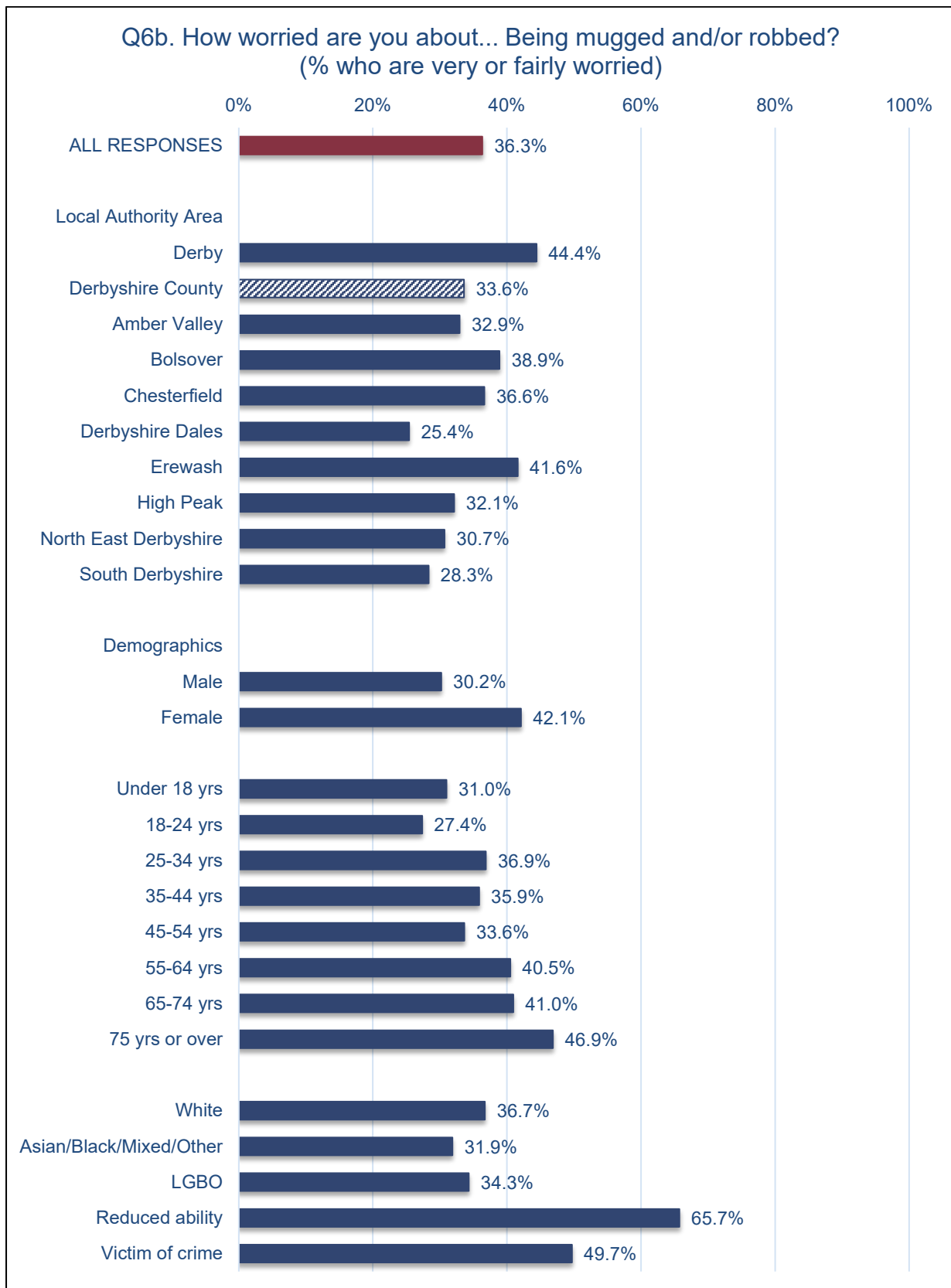


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Q6b. How worried are you about... Being mugged and / or robbed?

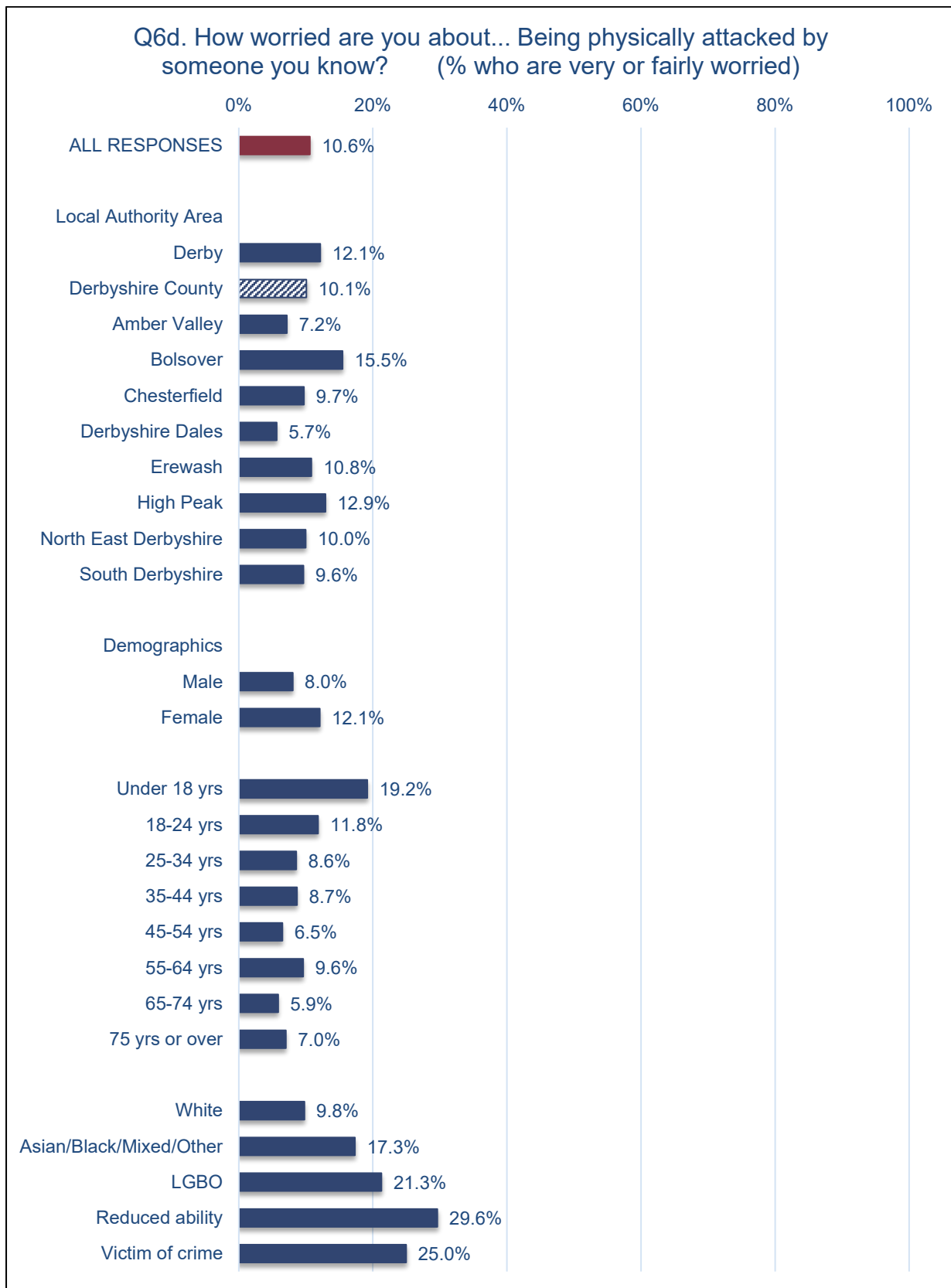

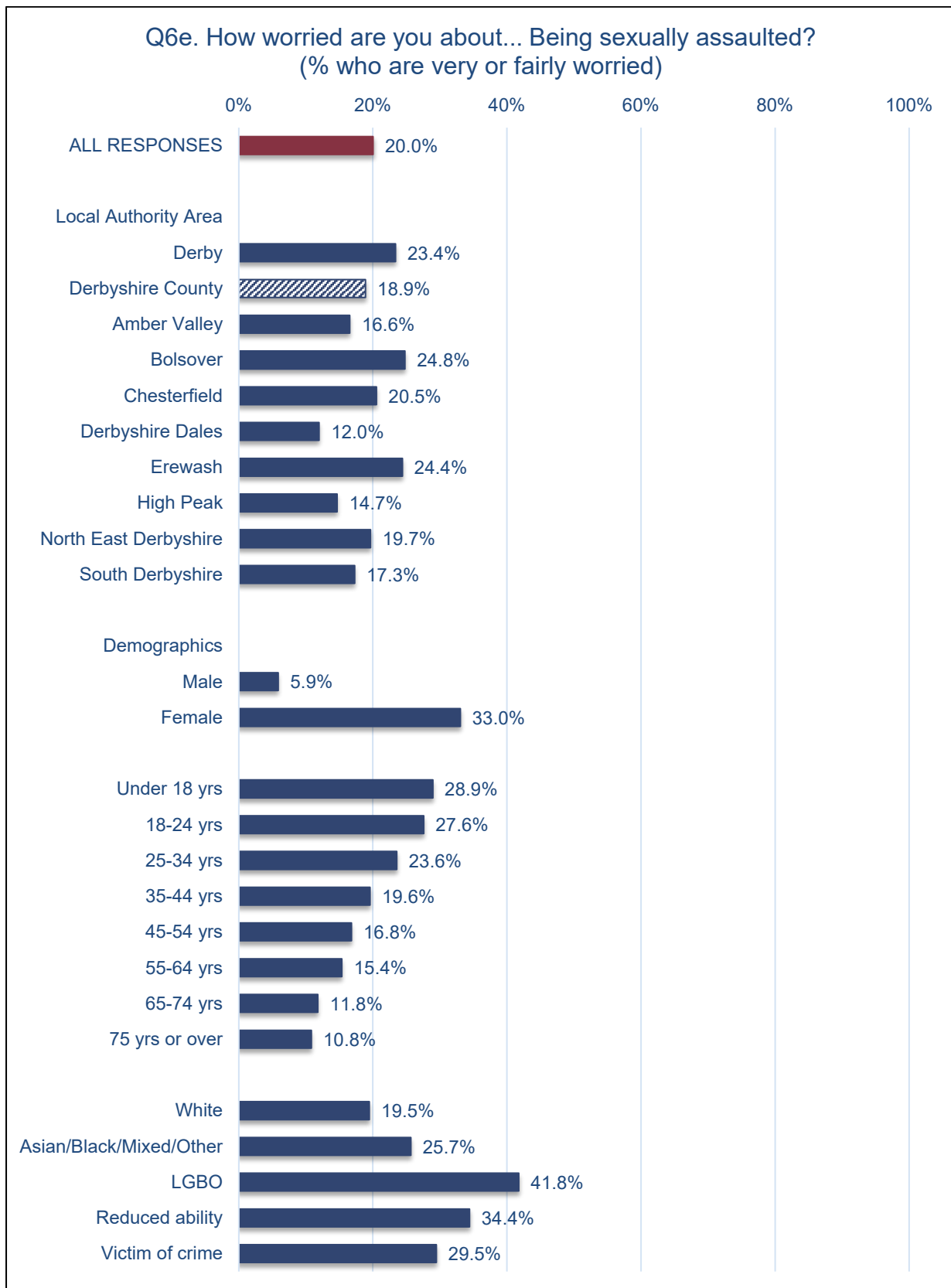

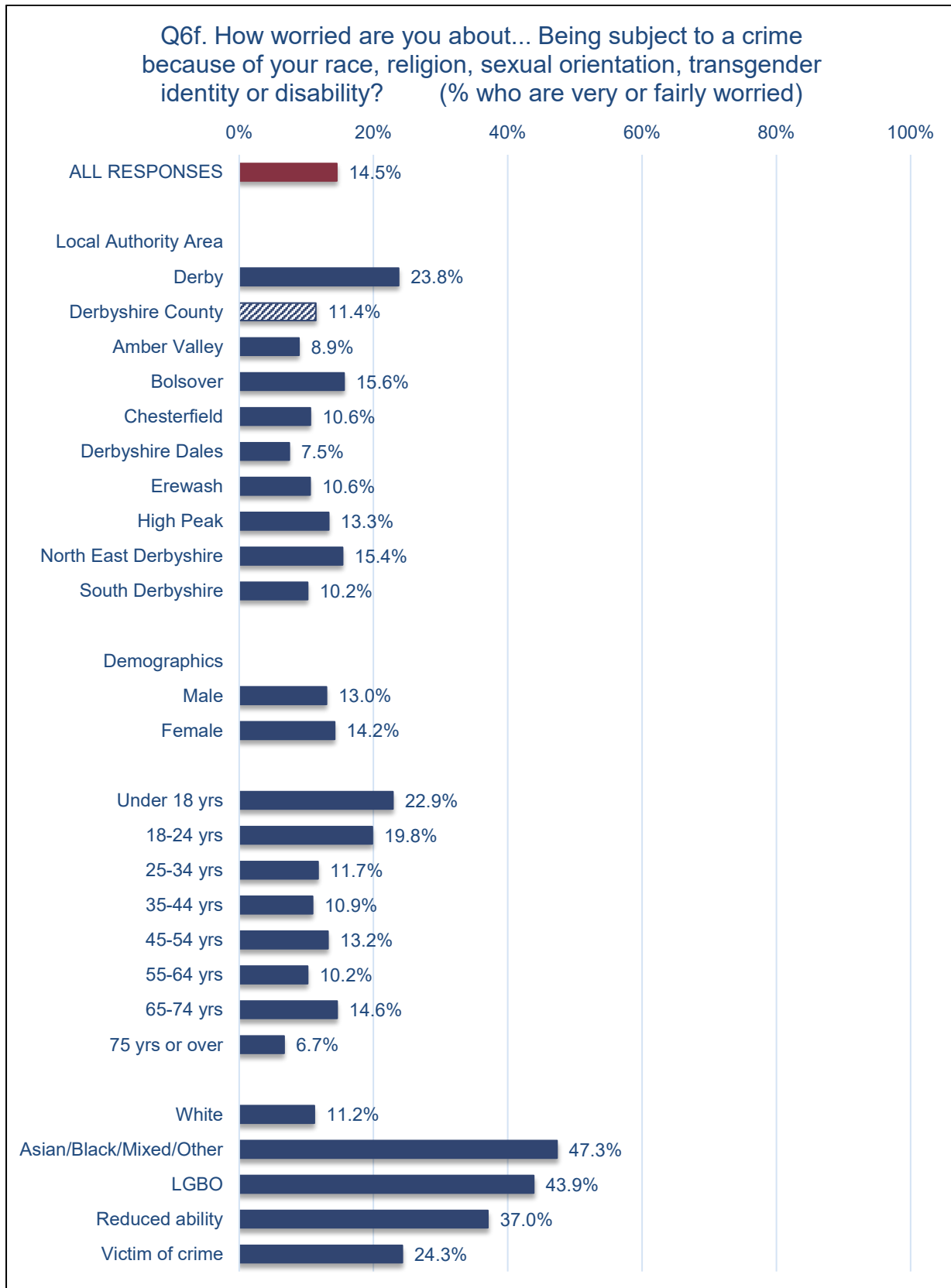

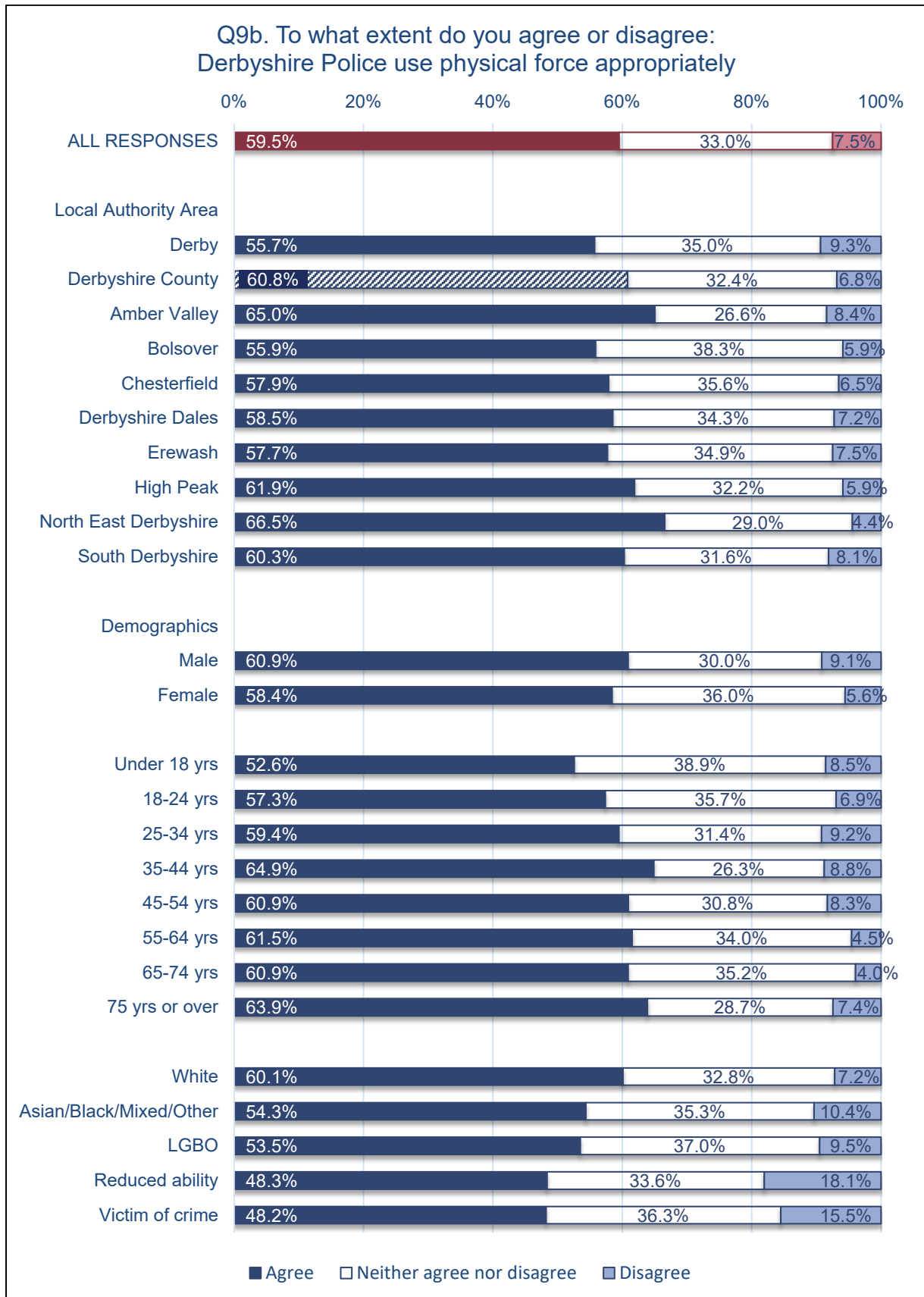

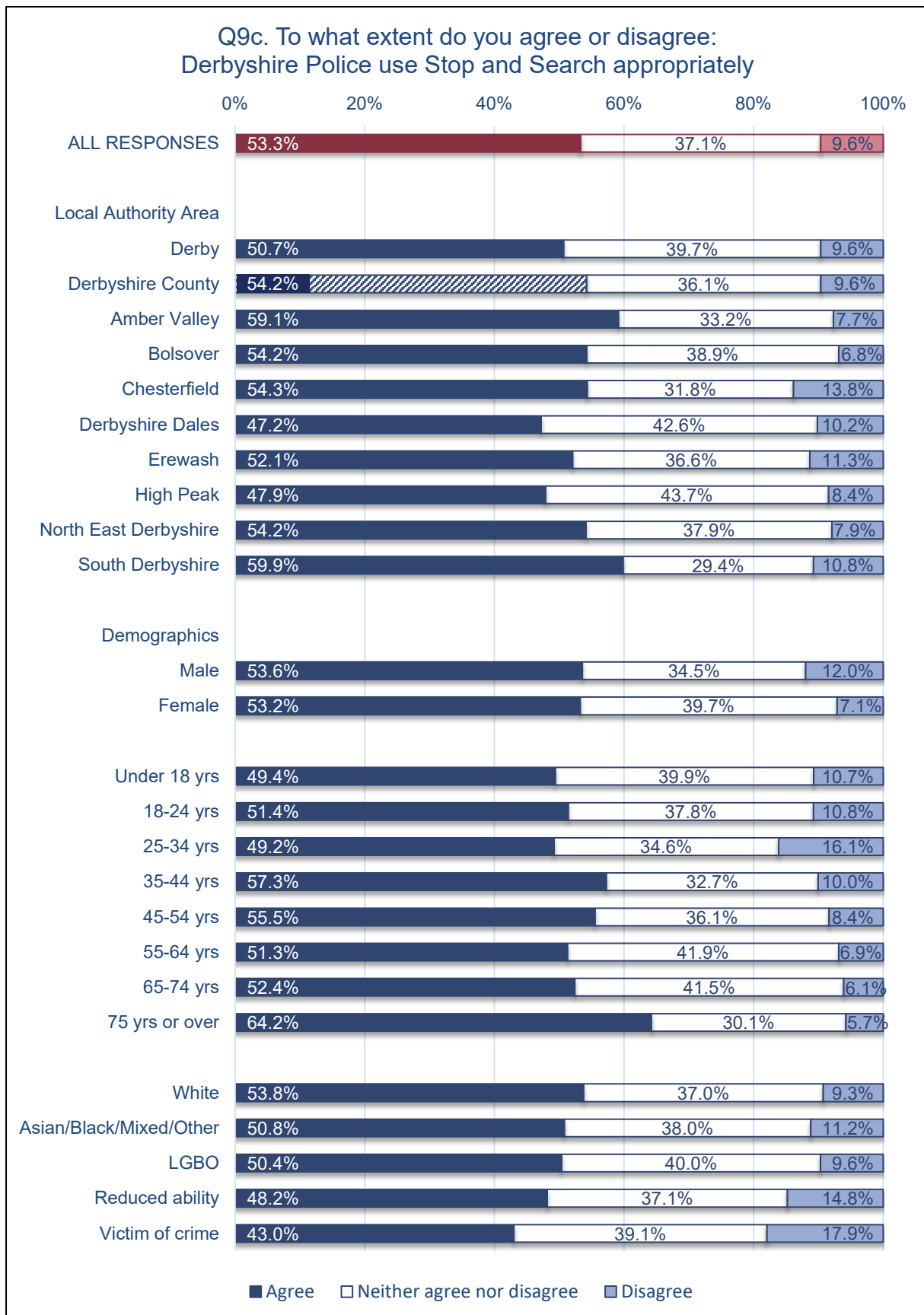

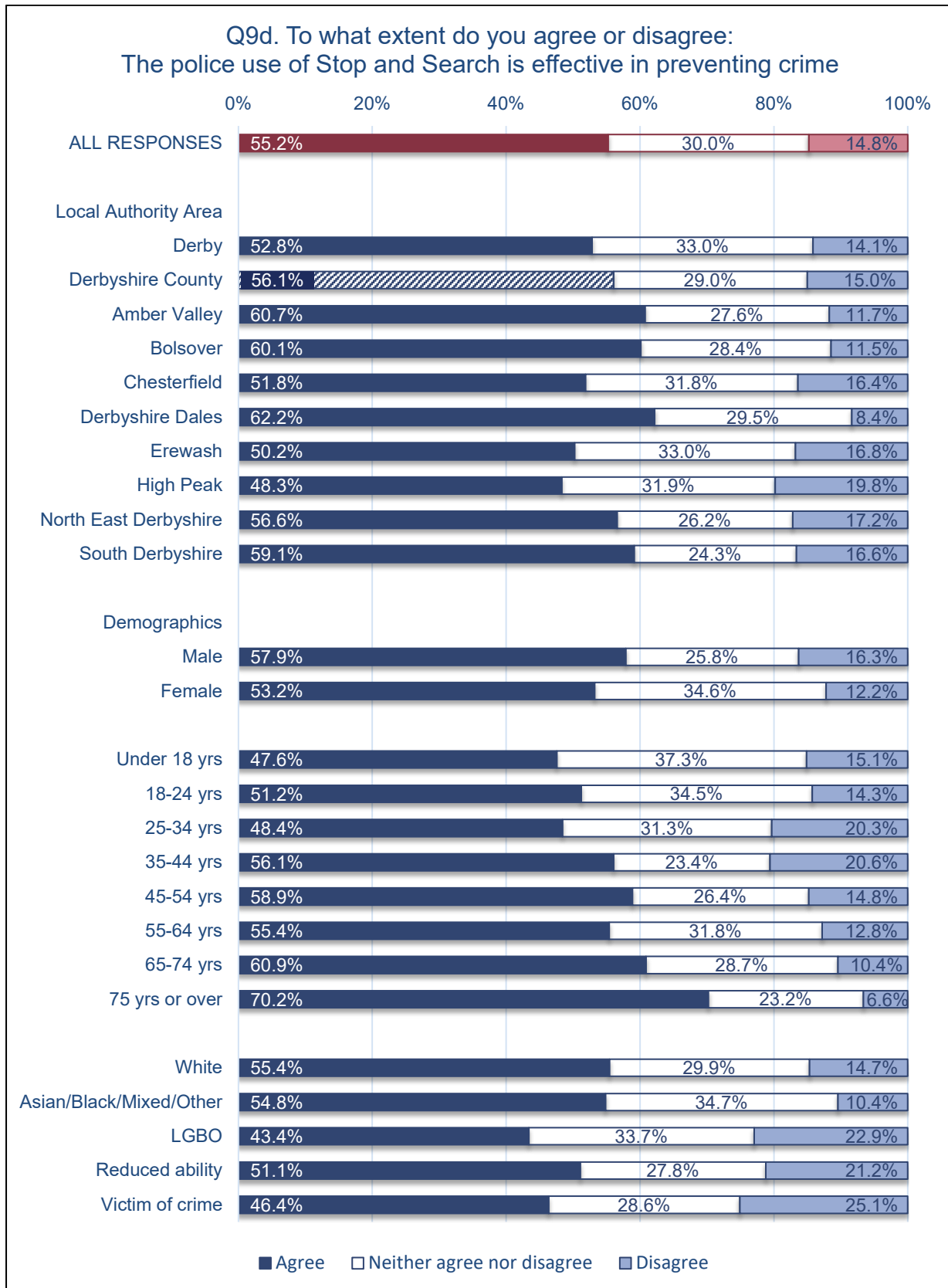

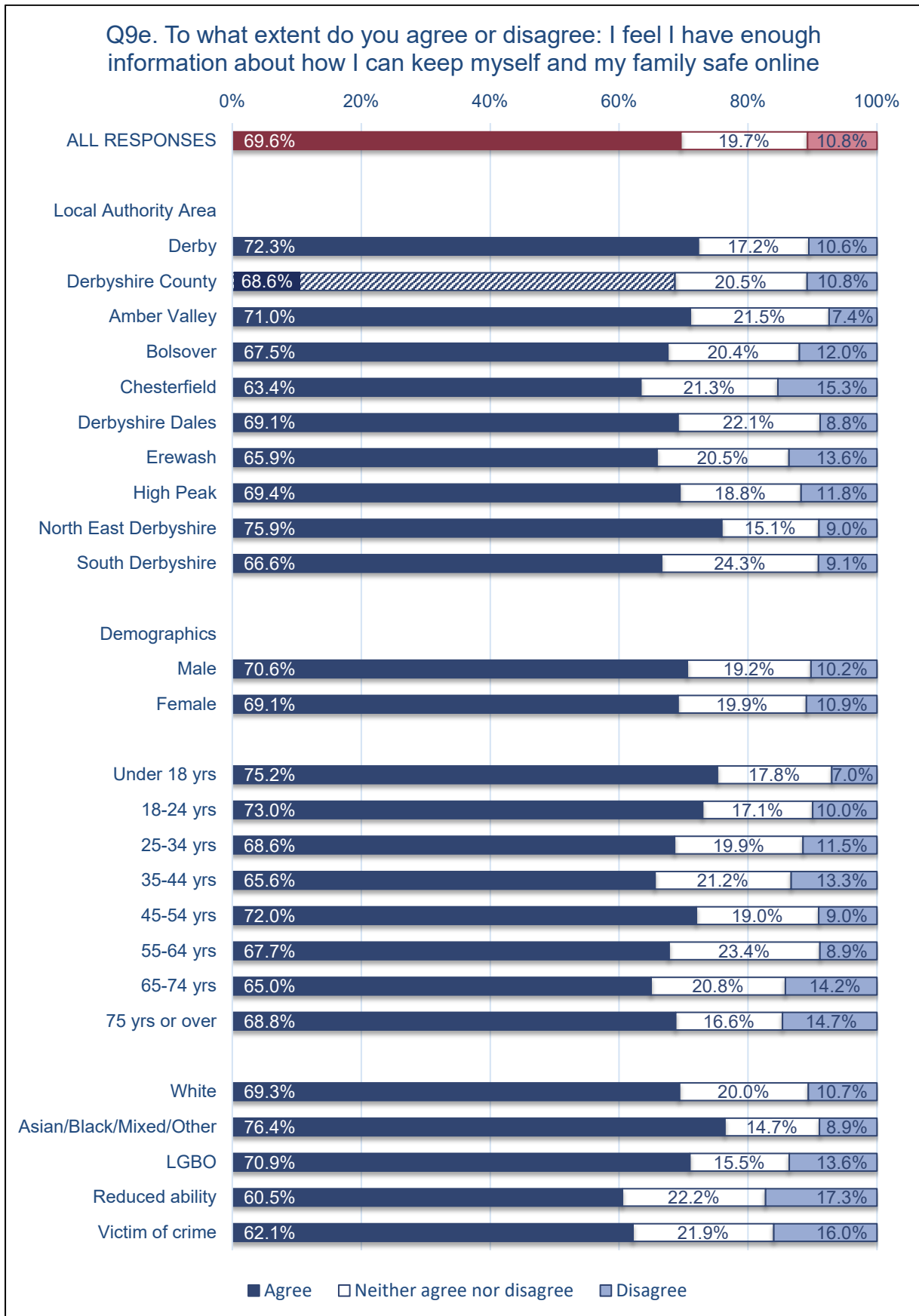


Q9e. To what extent do you agree or disagree...

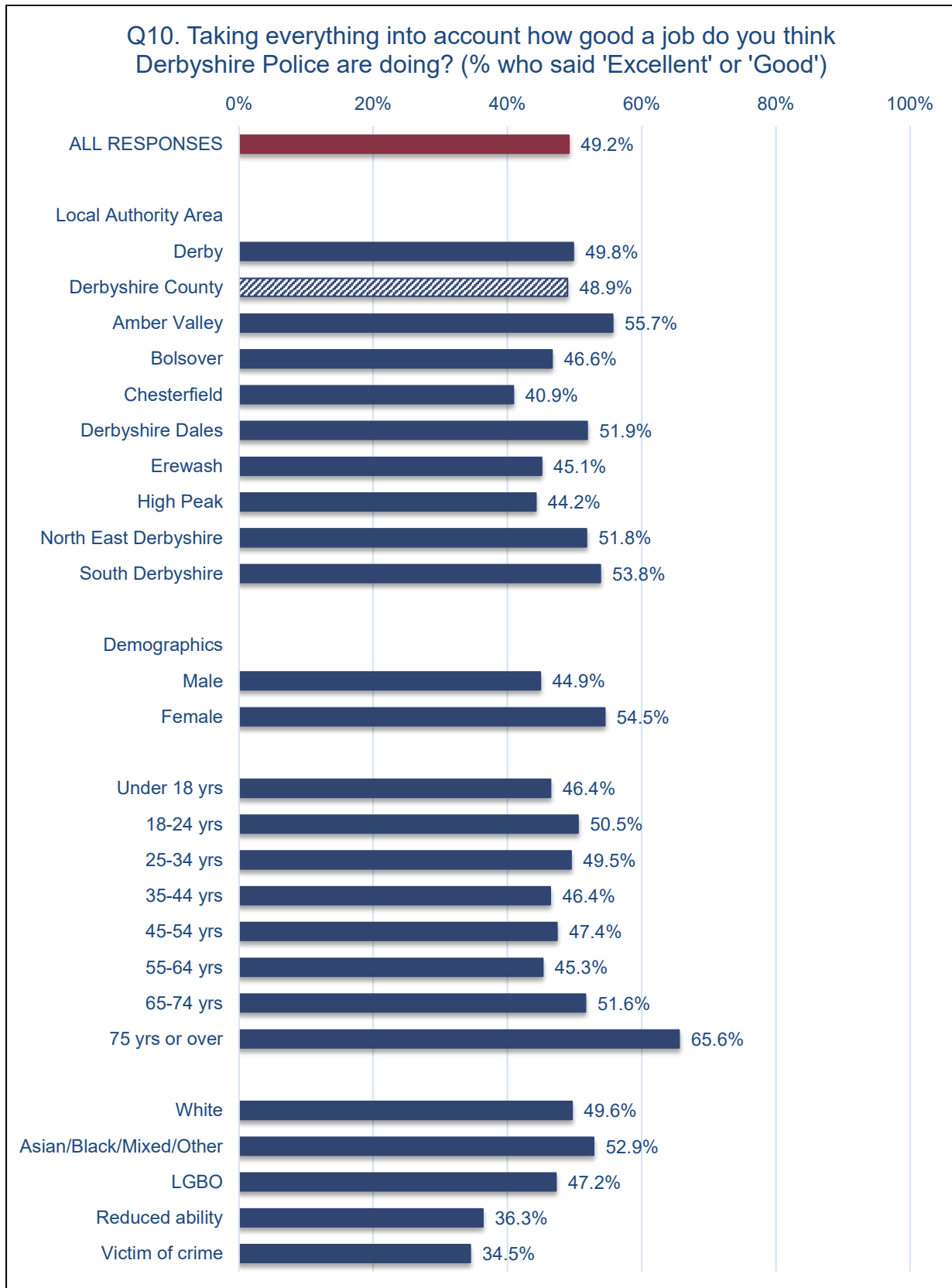
