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Introduction

Listening, responding and being accountable. These are responsibilities I take extremely seriously in my role as Police and Crime Commissioner for Derbyshire.

Each year, I consult residents, businesses and stakeholders in a variety of settings and platforms to understand local concerns, shape and refine policing priorities and empower communities to actively influence their own safety.

My Listening To You programme is the primary vehicle for this engagement and captures a truly representative spectrum of views and perceptions including those of underrepresented and seldom heard communities.

This year, 4,132 individual responses were collected through the L2U programme through a multitude of community events and shows, public meetings and exhibitions, across each of the nine local authorities.

Crossing the 4,000 threshold is a significant achievement for community engagement and statistical representation. This equates to around one in every 255 people in the force area.

I have consistently promised to listen to local people and remain visible and accessible to residents to ensure their experiences and insights drive my improvement plans. I am pleased that residents are using their voice. The views expressed throughout 2025/26 will be vital for mapping future resources, informing new safety strategies and targeting crime prevention to where it is needed and will be felt most.

This year's findings show strong parallels with 2024/25 and are overall very positive. Almost half of all respondents (49%) said they were aware of the victims' services available, mirroring 2024/25. It is pleasing to see continued recognition of these services which are vital for recovery from crime and protecting people from re-victimisation.

Confidence in policing overall has seen a slight improvement with more than half of respondents (58%) agreeing that local police are dealing with the issues in their community, compared to 56% and 57% in the two preceding years. The same percentage of people also feel that Derbyshire Constabulary is doing an excellent, good or fair job compared to last year at 84%. Although this has not changed in 12 months, it remains higher than the preceding three years (81%, 78% and 78%).

Derbyshire remains one of the safest places to live in the country with lower levels of crime than national averages. Yet despite these reduced risks, the survey results continue to highlight that people in Derbyshire have a higher fear of crime, and the impact of high-profile incidents can leave a lasting impression on public confidence and perceptions of safety. This fear is often higher for older residents in some crime categories, with respondents aged 35 or over nearly three times as likely to be worried about being a victim of fraud (65%) than those aged 34 or under (23%).

When people feel less safe, they feel disconnected from their communities and are at risk of isolating themselves from social networks that are vital for their mental wellbeing. This withdrawal impacts our economy and erodes community life.

Strengthening resilience and building trust and confidence in our communities lies at the heart of my Police and Crime Plan and I will continue to work closely with partners to improve feelings of safety overall, addressing the root causes of fear and ensuring our communities have the tools and resources to thrive.

I am grateful to residents for helping me to understand our communities better and for their ongoing support. We are stronger when we work together so please continue to share your views to help me achieve our collective goals.

Conducting the survey

Over 4,000 questionnaires were completed in 2025/26 by residents from across the whole of the Derbyshire Police force area, with generally around 400 respondents from each of the nine local authorities.

As usual, the survey was promoted at various engagement events across Derby and Derbyshire, including in Buxton, Chesterfield, Matlock, South Normanton and Swadlincote. Young people were engaged with at the University of Derby's City and Buxton campuses, as well as Chesterfield and Derby Colleges.

The survey was also regularly promoted through various channels, including social media (Facebook, Instagram, X, Nextdoor), Derbyshire Alert and via partners, to try to reach a wide variety of demographics and ensure representation from across the area.



Commentary and Main Points

Responses were received from 4,132 people, which equates to approximately one in every 255 residents of the Derbyshire Police force area having completed a survey during this 12-month period.

The profile of respondents is broadly representative of the population of Derbyshire with regard to female/male, age group, home local authority, ethnic background and sexual orientation. However, to ensure that valid comparisons can be made across the different demographics, and that results can be directly compared to past and future survey results, answers have been weighted by female/male, age group and home local authority in line with the Census 2021 profile of Derbyshire.

Results calculations for each question are generally based on answers where the respondent has expressed an opinion only, i.e. "Don't know / Prefer not to say" and blank answers have been excluded unless specified.

Particular issues of note from individual questions are detailed below. Where appropriate, comparisons have been made with results from the Crime Survey for England & Wales (CSEW) year ending March 2026.

Question 3. Have you been a victim of crime in the past 12 months?

Around one in nine respondents (11%) said that they had been a victim of crime in the past 12 months, similar to the last two years (13%, 12%). This is lower than the national CSEW estimates of 17% for the year ending March 2026 - which is to be expected as Derbyshire's crime rate is also below the national average.

Respondents with considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities were much more likely (18%) than the average to have been a recent victim of crime, with respondents aged 25-44 years (16%) and those who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (16%) also more likely to have been a victim of crime.

Question 4. Are you aware of the services available for victims in Derbyshire?

Almost half of respondents (49%) said they were aware of the victim services that are available, the same as last year (49%), but higher than the previous two years (43%, 40%). The proportion of respondents who were aware was generally fairly consistent across the different areas; however, respondents aged 24 years and under were much more aware (65%), with respondents aged 55-74 years (38%) less aware.

Three out of five (61%) respondents who had been a recent victim of crime were aware of the services available for them (compared to 47% of respondents who had not been a victim of crime). This is lower than last year (65%), but higher than the previous two years (58%, 57%).

Question 5. How safe do you feel walking alone in your local area during the day / after dark?

Results show that most respondents (82%) felt either very safe or fairly safe walking alone in their local area during the day, slightly lower than the previous two years (86%, 87%).

Results for feeling safe during the day were fairly similar (mainly between 78%-88%) throughout the various demographics, apart from respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (61%) or who have been a victim of crime in the past 12 months (58%) - where results continue to be significantly lower.

Around half of respondents (48%) felt safe walking alone in the local area after dark - the same as last year (48%).

However, there continues to be considerable variance for feeling safe after dark in the local area between different demographics. Females (35%) were much less likely to feel safe compared to males (62%). Respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (28%) or who have been a recent victim of crime (31%) were the least likely to say they felt safe, whereas those living in Derbyshire Dales (75%) were the most likely to say they felt safe.

In comparison, CSEW results show 78% of persons nationally felt safe when walking alone after dark (males 88%, females 68%), which may suggest that people in Derbyshire have a higher fear than average of crime, even though Derbyshire's crime rates are lower than the national average.



Question 6. How worried are you about being a victim of the following types of crime?

Respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a recent victim of crime were consistently more worried than average about all of the issues asked about.

- a. Having your home broken into and something stolen?**
- b. Being mugged and / or robbed?**
- g. Having your vehicle stolen or vandalised?**

The proportions of respondents being very or fairly worried about the property crimes – burglary (43%), mugging/robbery (38%) and vehicle crime (44%) – are similar to last year (42%, 36%, 42%), but worry about burglary and vehicle crime remain lower than the period 2016/17 to 2023/24 when both averaged around 50%.

Respondents aged 24 years or under were considerably less worried about burglary and vehicle crime than older respondents. Those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities or who have been a recent victim of crime were more worried than average about being a victim of property crime.

As in previous years, there does appear to be a higher fear of property crime in Derbyshire compared to the country as a whole – even though Derbyshire's burglary and vehicle crime rates are considerably below the national average. The Listening to You survey 2025/26 has 9% of respondents being very worried about burglary and 12% of respondents being very worried about vehicle crime, compared to the CSEW year ending March 2026 national figures of 8% and 7% respectively.

c. Being physically attacked by a stranger?

Two out of five respondents (39%) said they were very or fairly worried about being physically attacked by a stranger, which is similar to the last three years (36%, 41%, 40%), with respondents who have been a recent victim of crime (59%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (63%) being the most worried.

Females (46%) were much more worried than males (32%), and residents of Derby City (50%) were more worried than residents of the Derbyshire County area overall (36%), although there were large variances between different areas of the County.

The proportion of people very worried about being attacked by a stranger (11%) is similar to the CSEW proportion of people very worried about violent crime (9%).

d. Being physically attacked by someone you know?

Respondents were far less worried about being physically attacked by someone they know, with one in nine respondents (11%) saying they were very or fairly worried. Respondents aged under 18 years (18%), from an ethnic minority background (20%), who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (21%), who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (25%) or who have been a recent victim of crime (25%) were the most likely to be worried. Generally, the level of worry decreased with age.

e. Being sexually assaulted?

Just over one fifth of respondents (23%) said they were very or fairly worried about being sexually assaulted, which is similar to the past two years (20%, 25%).

However, females (36%) were more than four times more likely to be worried than males (8%). Levels of worry decreased with age, with those aged 34 years or under (29%) being nearly two times more likely to be worried than those aged 55 years or over (16%). Respondents who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality were nearly twice as likely (41%) to be worried than the average.

f. Being subject to a crime because of your race, religion, sexual orientation, transgender identity or disability?

One in six respondents (16%) said they were worried about being subject to a crime because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, transgender identity or disability, similar to last year (15%). The responses to this question had the widest variance of levels of worry by different demographics.

More than half (51%) of respondents from an ethnic minority background said they were worried compared to 13% of respondents from a white ethnic background. Half of respondents who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual or Other sexuality (49%) were worried, as were almost one third of respondents who have been a recent victim of crime (31%), or who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (31%). Levels of worry peaked amongst those aged 18-24 years and then decreased with age.

h. Being a victim of fraud or identity theft?

Levels of worry about fraud (49%) are similar to the last three years (46%, 49%, 46%) and have reduced compared to 2016/17 to 2020/21 (average 57%). The CSEW indicates that fraud is one of the most common crime types experienced - by 8% of people in 2025/26. The proportion of people very worried about fraud (14%) is lower than the CSEW (17%).

The fear of being a victim of fraud increased considerably with age – respondents aged 35 years or over were nearly three times as likely to be worried about fraud (65%) than those aged 34 years or under (23%).

Respondents from an ethnic minority background (38%) were less worried than those from a white ethnic background (49%) - this may be at least partly due to the ethnic minority population in Derbyshire consisting of a higher proportion of young people compared to the white ethnic population, and younger people being less worried about fraud.

i. You or a family member being a victim of an online crime?

This was a new question in the 2024/25 survey, and results are very similar last year, with just over half of respondents (52%) saying they were very worried or fairly worried. Levels of worry increased considerably with age, with just 33% of those aged 34 years or under worried compared to 64% of those aged 35 years or over.

Respondents from an ethnic minority background (39%) were less worried than those from a white ethnic background (53%) - again, this may be at least partly due to the ethnic minority population in Derbyshire consisting of a higher proportion of young people compared to the white ethnic population, and younger people being less worried about being a victim of an online crime.

j. Being a victim of antisocial behaviour?

Just under half (47%) of respondents said they were worried about being a victim of anti-social behaviour, similar to last year (45%) and lower than the previous two years (55%, 56%). Respondents who have been a recent victim of crime (67%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (64%) were the most likely to be worried. Respondents aged 24 years or under were considerably less likely to be worried (28%) than those aged 25 years or over (54%).



Question 7. How many times in the past 12 months have you personally experienced or witnessed in your local area?

- a. Street drinking / drunken behaviour / under-age drinking**
- b. Vandalism / criminal damage or graffiti**
- c. Inconsiderate behaviour**
- d. People using or dealing drugs, or evidence of drugs**

Responses to these questions were very similar to last year, with around one in five respondents (one in seven for vandalism, damage or graffiti) experiencing the above behaviours on at least a weekly basis: street drinking / drunken behaviour 20%; vandalism / damage 15%; inconsiderate behaviour 23%; drug use / dealing 23% (last year 20%, 14%, 23% and 22% respectively).

Results for residents of Derby City were higher than for residents of Derbyshire County area overall, although there were large variances between different areas of the County.

There was also variance with the different age groups, with respondents aged 65 years and over generally being the least likely to report having experienced or witnessed the behaviours. Respondents who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities were around one and a half times more likely, and respondents who have been a recent victim of crime were around two times more likely than the average to say they had experienced or witnessed these behaviours.

- e. Inconvenient or illegal parking, abandoned vehicles**
- f. Speeding cars or motorcycles, car revving, boy racers**

As in previous years, these two types of behaviours were reported as occurring more frequently than the others. For inconvenient or illegal parking and / or abandoned vehicles, two out of five respondents (38%) said they had experienced or witnessed this at least weekly, similar to last year (41%). More than half of respondents (54%) said they had experienced or witnessed speeding cars or motorcycles, car revving and / or boy racers at least weekly, the same as last year (54%).

For both issues, results were fairly consistent across all areas of the force, apart from Derbyshire Dales, where they were lower, and High Peak, where they were higher.



Question 8. Do you think that your local police are dealing with the issues that matter to your community?

More than half of respondents (58%) did feel that their local police are dealing with the issues in their community, which is similar to the last two years (56%, 57%), and an increase from 2021/22 and 2022/23 (53%, 50%).

Respondents who were the most likely to agree that their local police are dealing with issues were those from Derbyshire Dales (73%), aged 24 years or under (69%), aged 75 years or over (69%) or from an ethnic minority background (66%). Respondents who had been a recent victim of crime (33%) were the least likely to agree.

Question 9. To what extent do you agree or disagree...?

a. Derbyshire Police treat people fairly and with respect

Two-thirds of respondents (65%) agreed that Derbyshire Police treat people fairly and with respect, similar to previous years.

Respondents who had been a victim of crime (45%) were the least likely to agree. There was very little difference between respondents from an ethnic minority background (66% agreed, 10% disagreed) and respondents from a white ethnic background (66% agreed, 9% disagreed).

b. Derbyshire Police use physical force appropriately

Just under three out of five respondents (57%) agreed that Derbyshire Police use physical force appropriately, which is similar to last year (59%) and 2021/22 (56%) when the question was previously asked.

Those aged under 18 years (64%) were more likely to agree than older people (56%). Respondents from a white ethnic background agreed more (59%) than those from an ethnic minority background (52%). Respondents who had been a recent victim of crime (43%) and those who have considerably reduced ability to carry out day to day activities (47%) were the least likely to agree.

c. Derbyshire Police use Stop and Search appropriately

Just over half of respondents (51%) agreed Stop and Search is used appropriately, which again is similar to last year (53%) and 2021/22 (50%). One in ten respondents (10%) disagreed.

There is some difference across the various demographics, including between respondents from a white ethnic background (52% agreed, 8% disagreed) and those from an ethnic minority background (45% agreed, 16% disagreed).

d. The police use of Stop and Search is an effective tool to prevent crime

Just under three out of five respondents (57%) agreed that the police use of Stop and Search is an effective tool to prevent crime, a reduction from 2023/24 (67%), but similar to last year (55%) and 2021/22 (55%). One in eight respondents disagreed (13%).

Respondents aged 34 years and under (58%) and aged 55 years and over (62%) were more likely to agree than those aged 35-54 years (48%).

Respondents from a white ethnic background (58% agreed, 12% disagreed) were more likely to agree / less likely to disagree than respondents from an ethnic minority background (52% agreed, 17% disagreed).

e. I feel I have enough information about how I can keep myself and my family safe online

This was a new question in the 2024/25 survey. More than two-thirds of respondents (68%) agreed that they had enough information about keeping safe online, similar to last year (70%), although 11% disagreed. Responses were fairly similar across the various demographics, with those aged under 18 years more likely to agree (76%) than those aged 18 years or over (66%).



Question 10. Taking everything into account how good a job do you think the Derbyshire Police are doing?

The proportion of respondents (49%) who feel that Derbyshire Police are doing an excellent or good job is the same as last year (49%), and higher than the previous three years (44%, 39%, 40%). It is now more similar to 2017/18 to 2020/21 when it averaged 51%. A further 35% of respondents feel Derbyshire Police are doing a fair job, and 16% feel they are doing a poor or very poor job.

The CSEW figure for Derbyshire for “excellent/good job” in 2025/26 is 47% which is similar to the Listening to You figure, noting that the CSEW figure is based on a small sample size of 555 people.

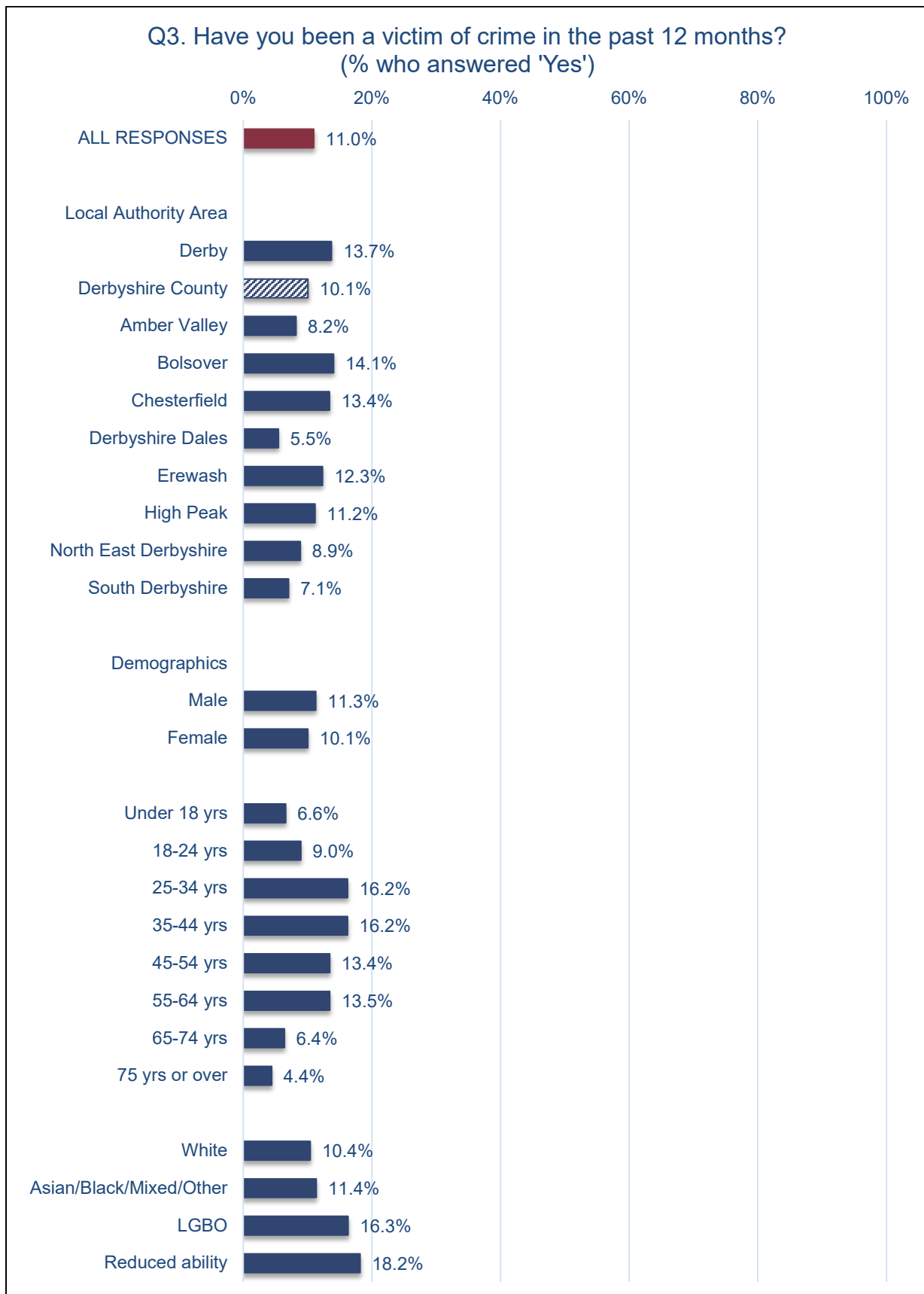

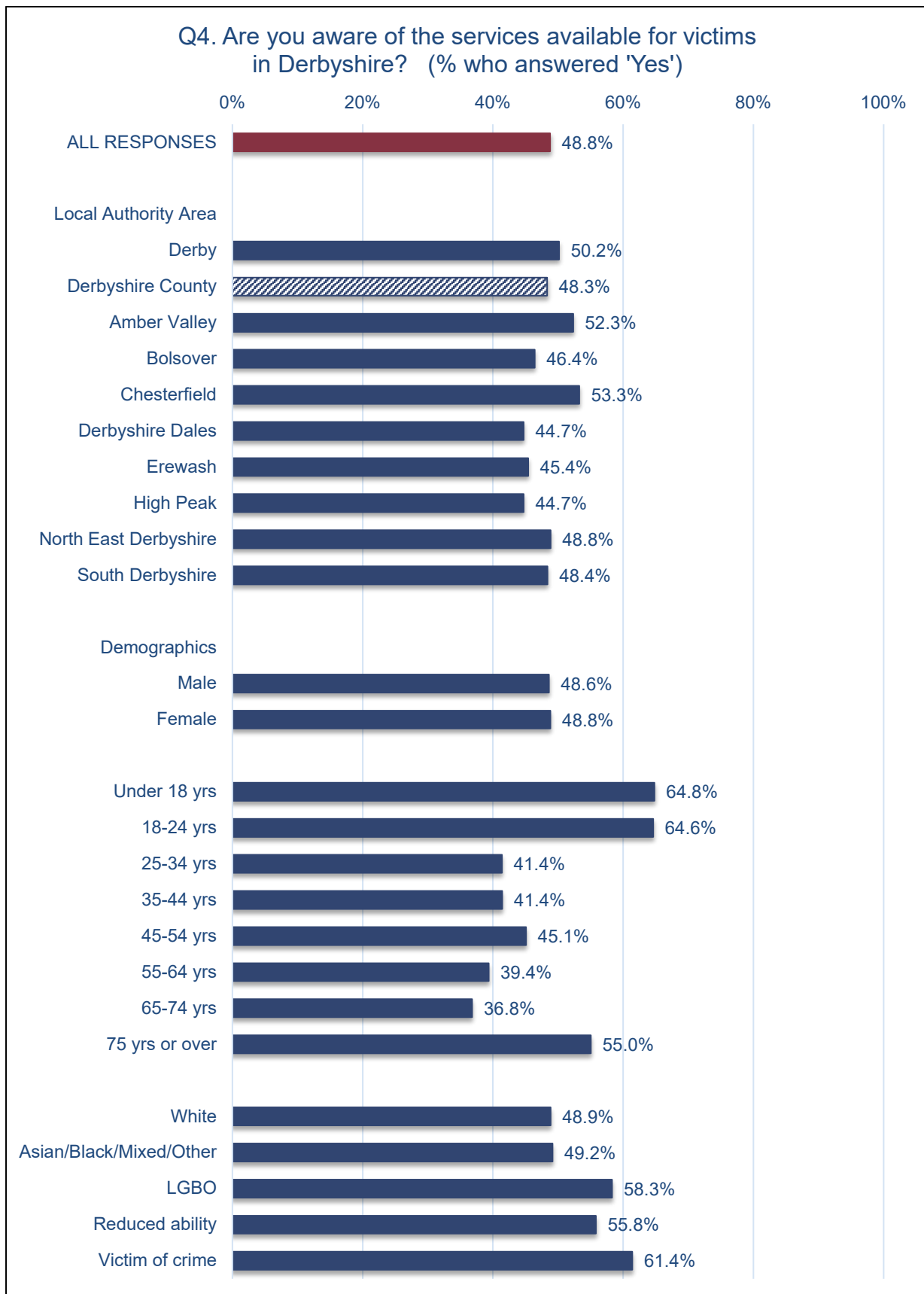

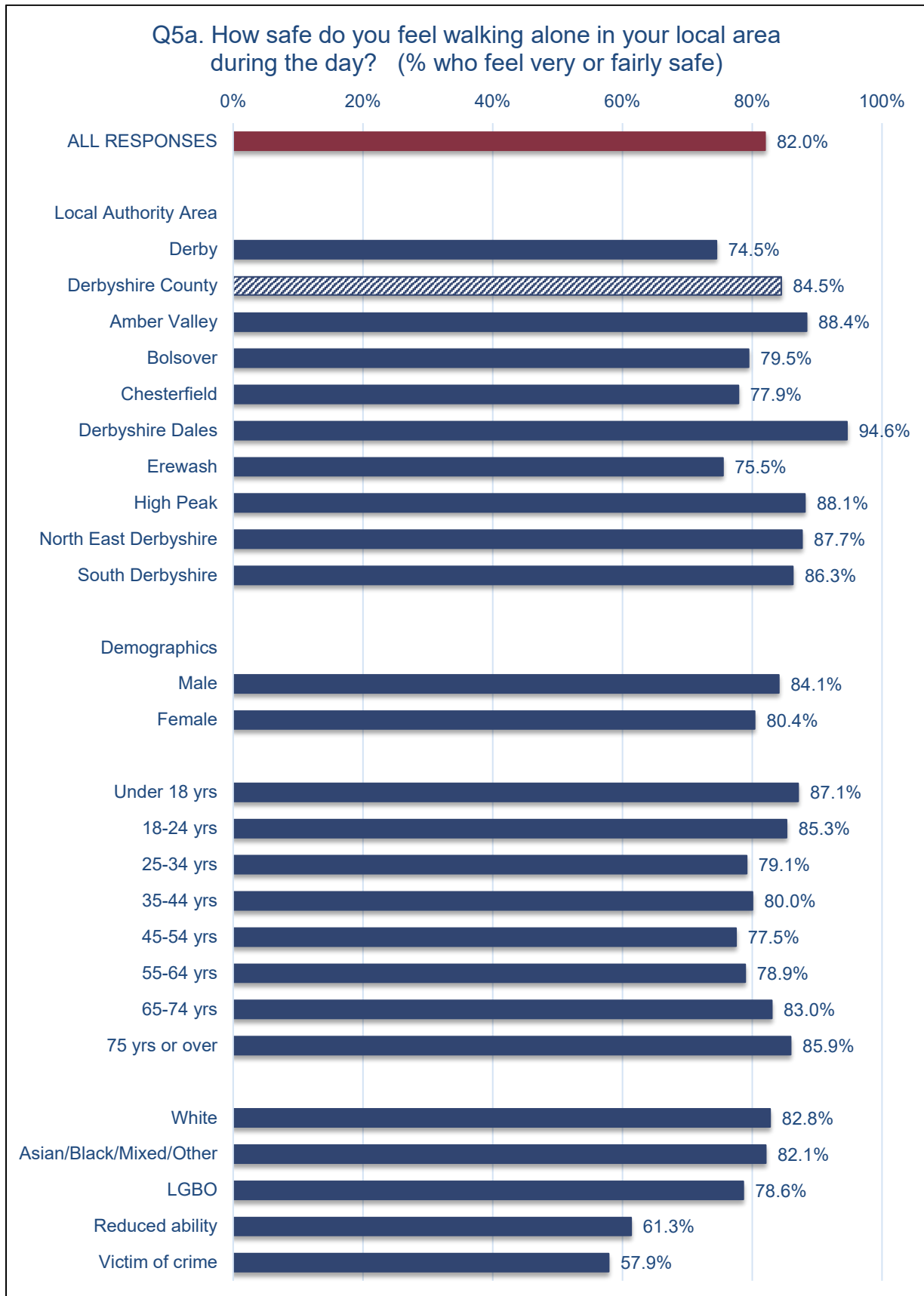

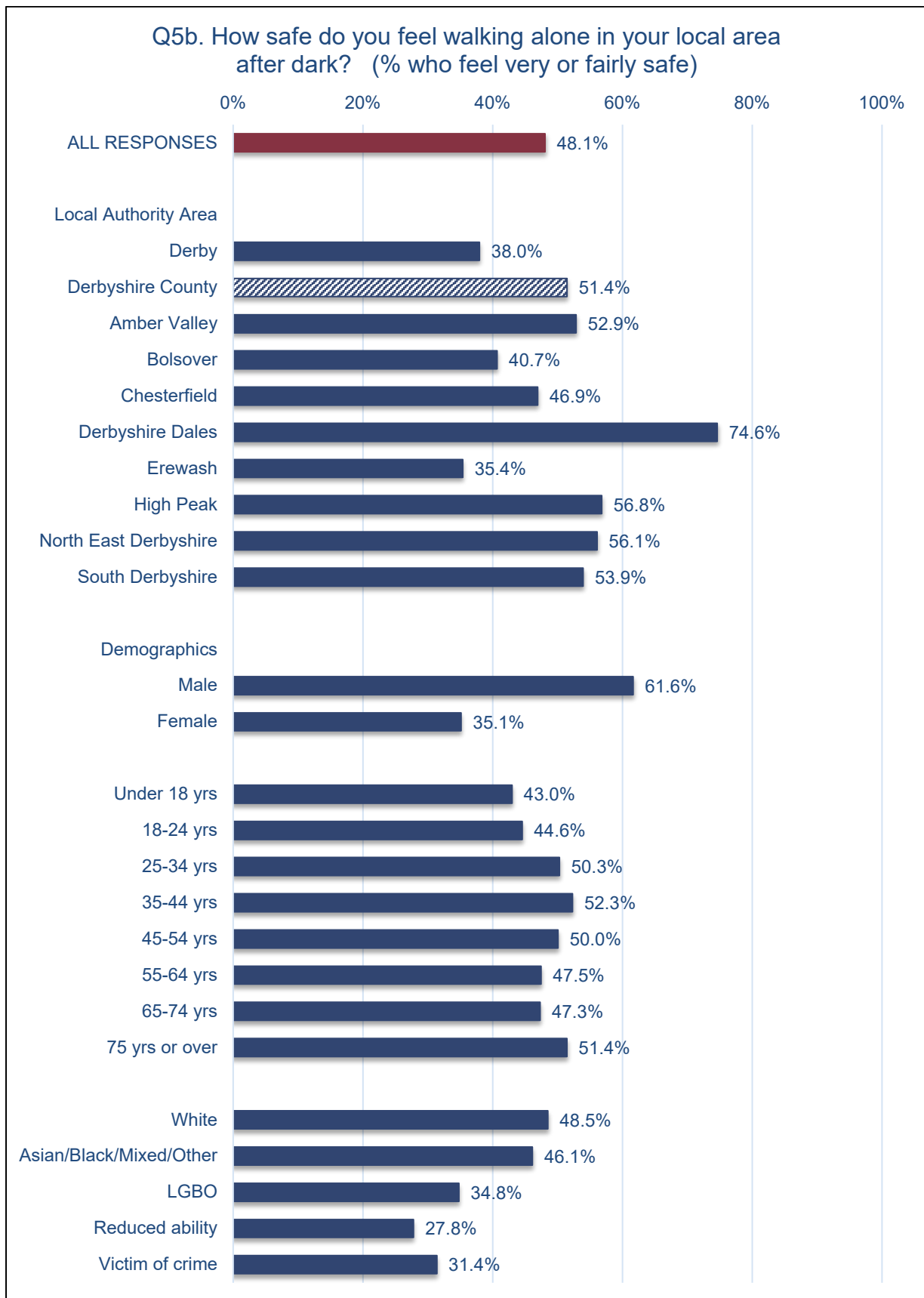

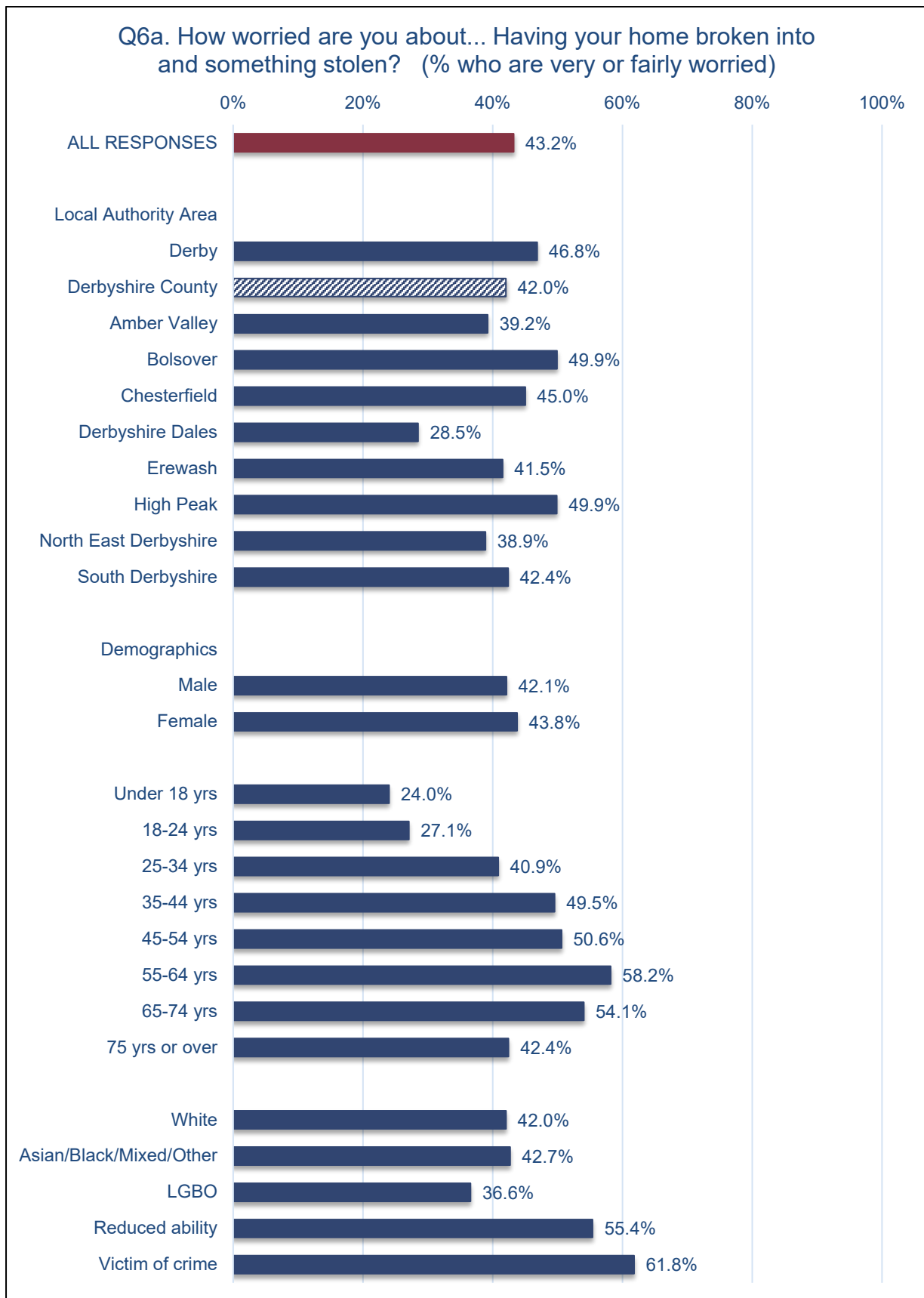

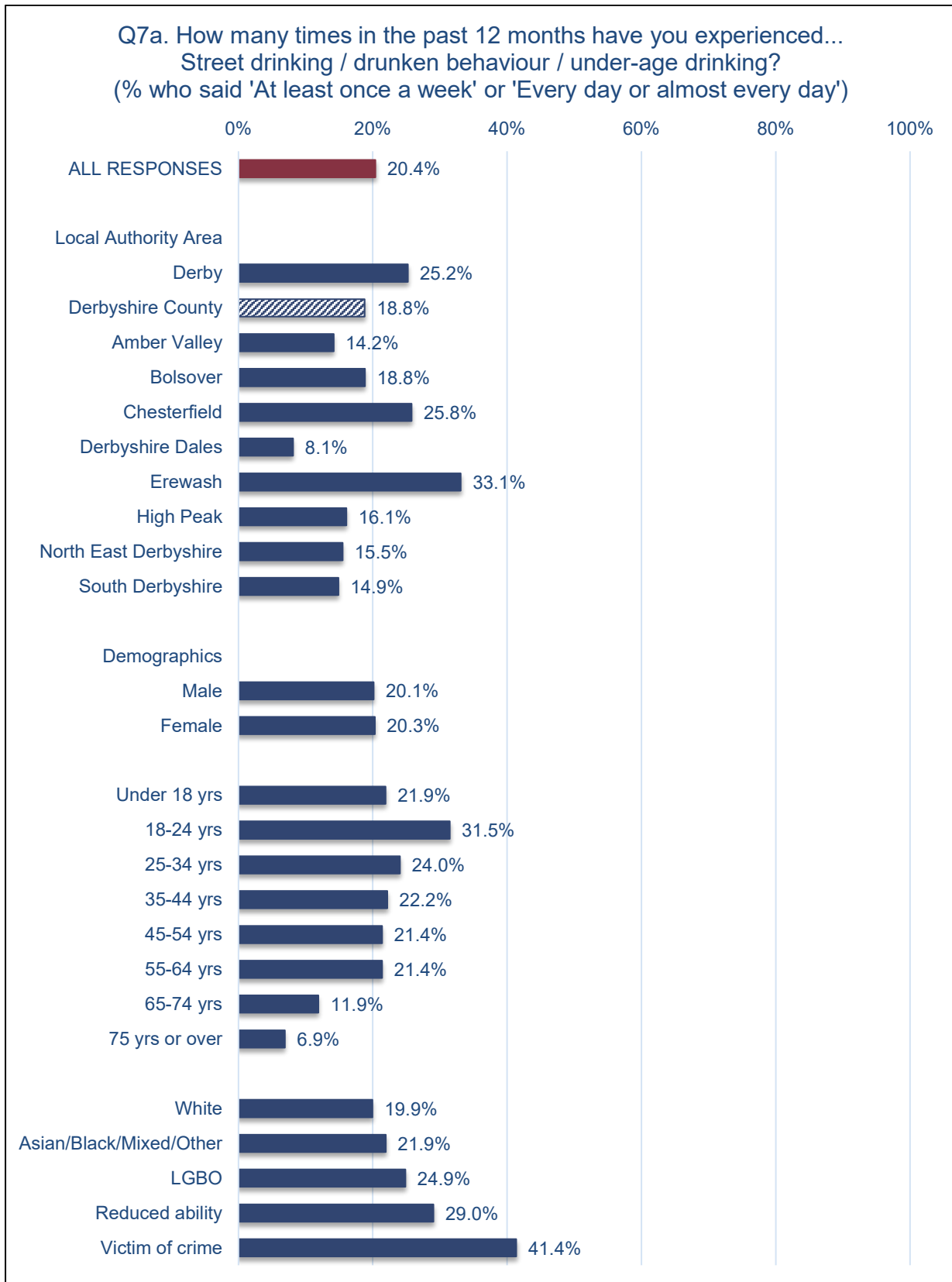

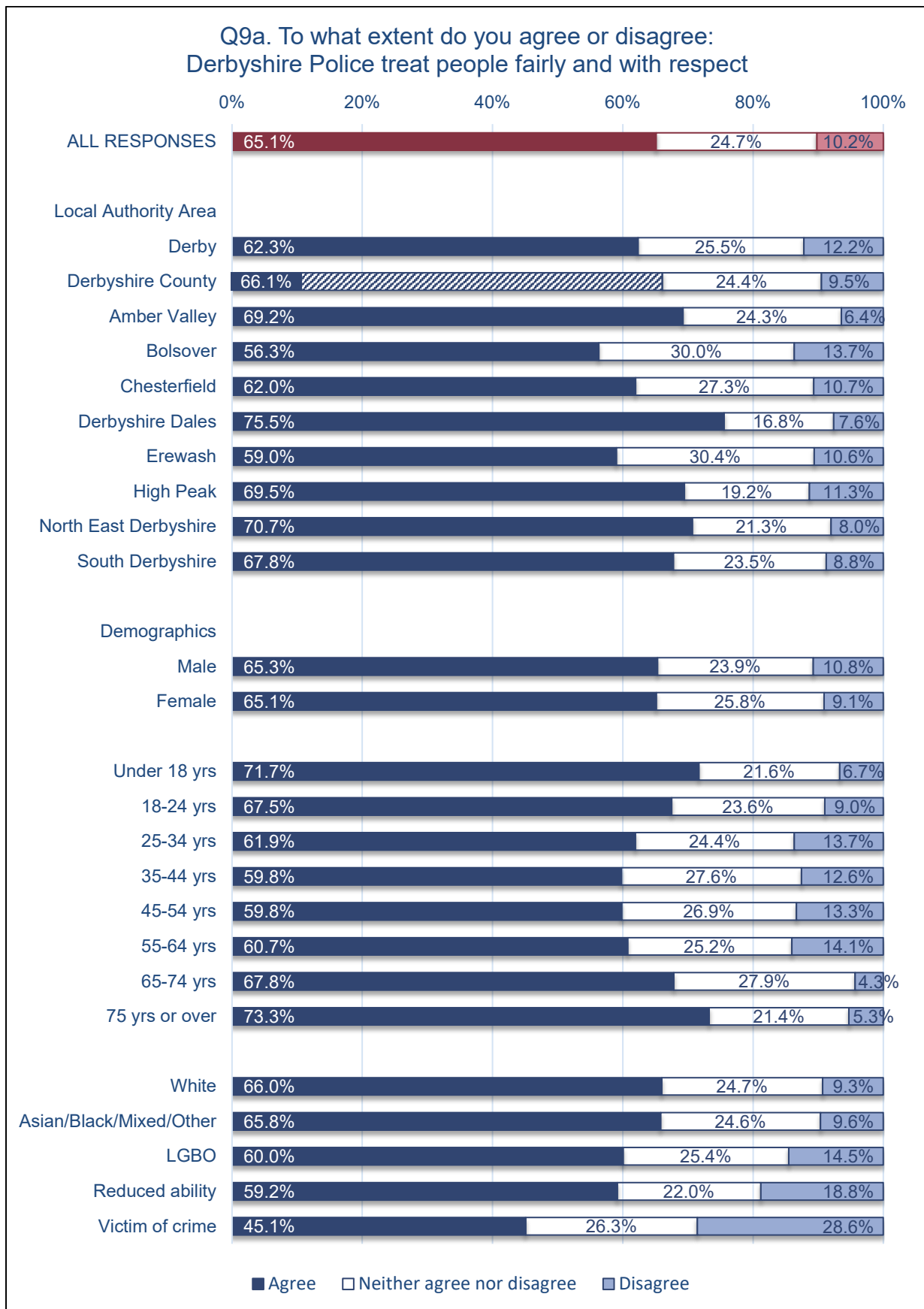

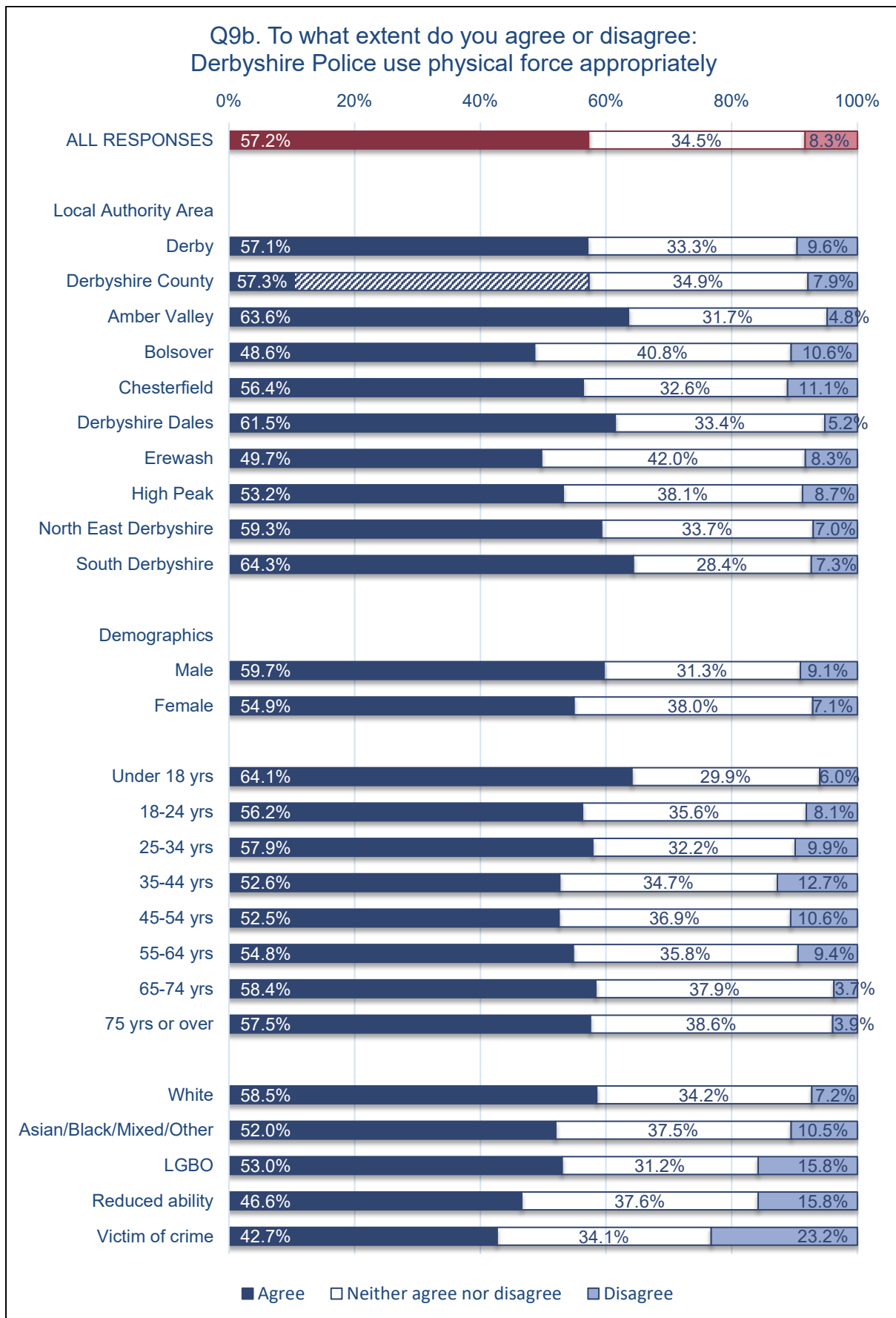

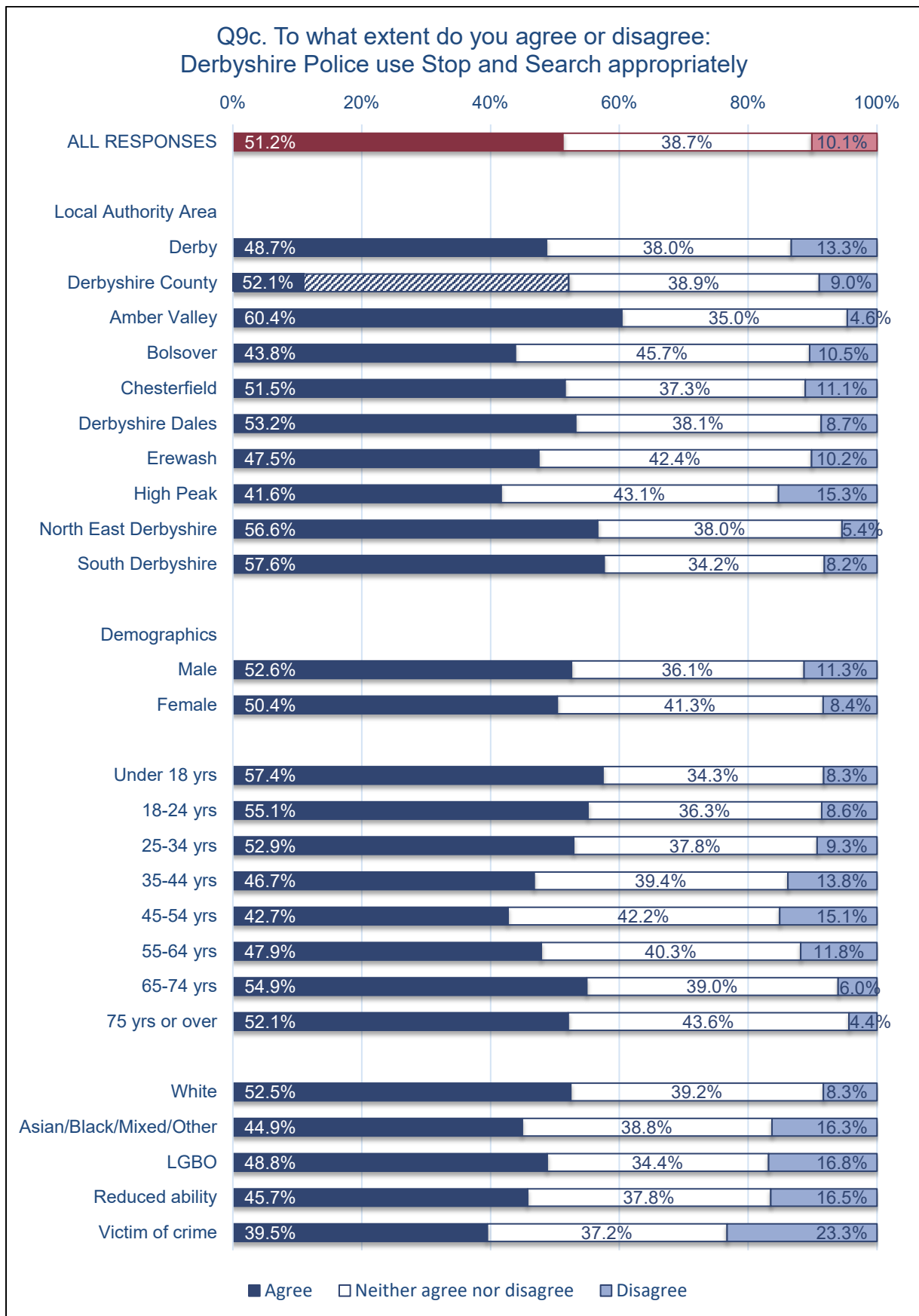

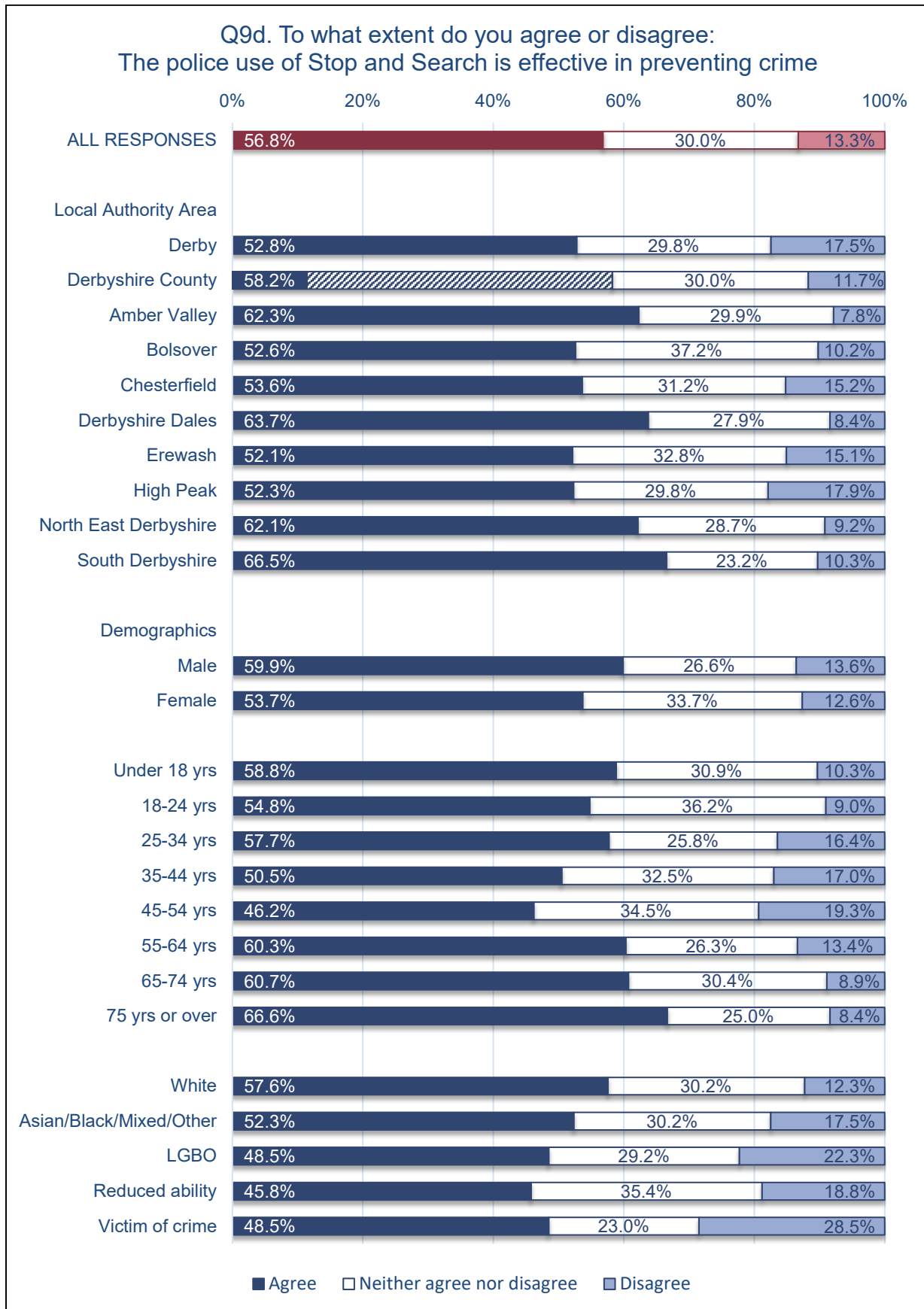

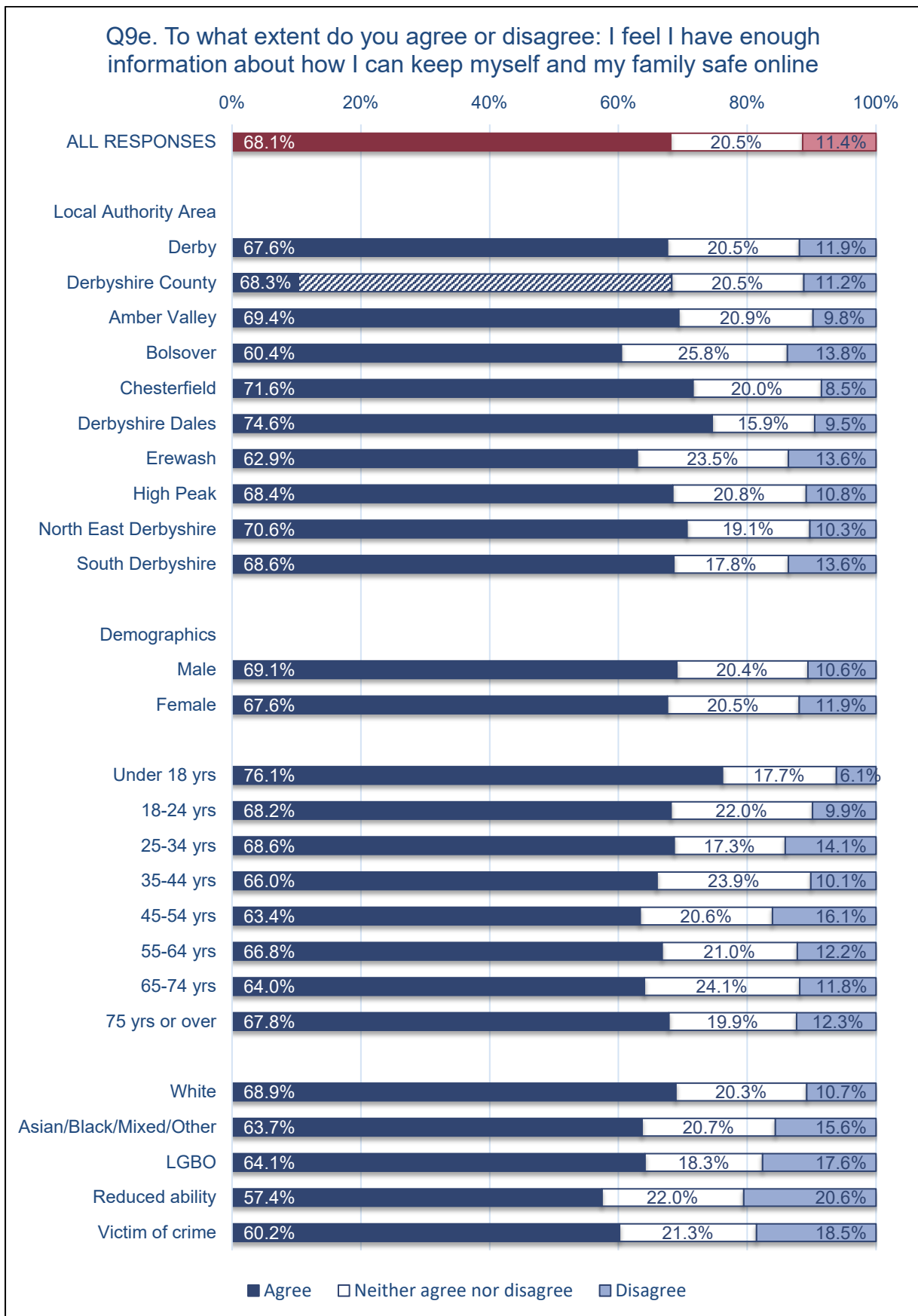


Q9e. To what extent do you agree or disagree...

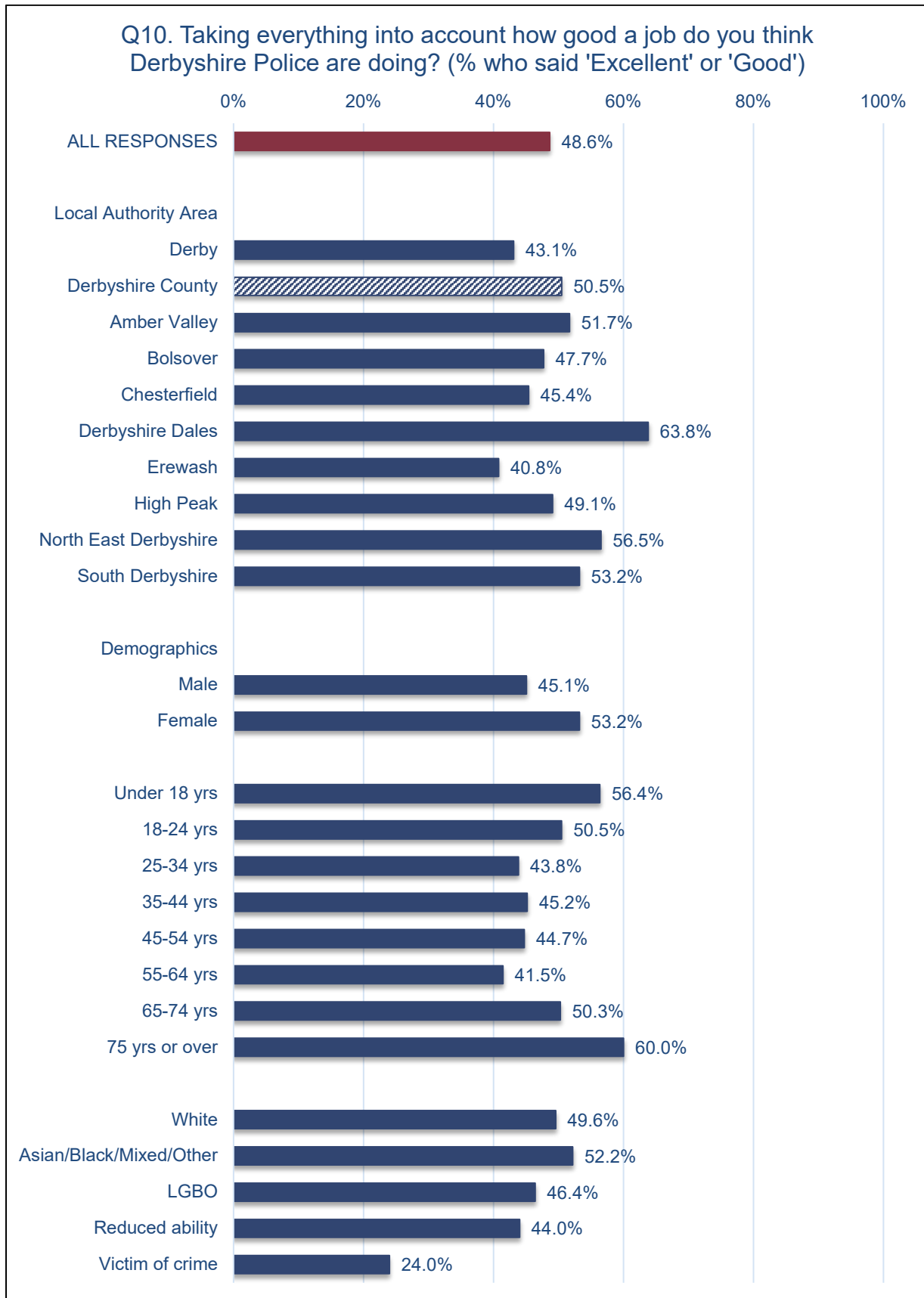
