





Sub-Objective 8: Increasing Confidence in Reporting Crime and **Vulnerability in Rural Communities**



To deliver on the priorities in the Police and Crime Commissioner's Police and Crime Plan

Derbyshire Constabulary will:

- · Increase officers' visibility in our communities
- Listen to the concerns of residents and act quickly to address these issues.
- Inform communities swiftly about the work to tackle local problems
