1) Welcome and Introductions

This scrutiny panel was held online via Microsoft Teams.

Suspicion prior to search: Vehicle parked in a rural location known to be frequented by cannabis smokers. The suspect was a lone suspect who was unable to properly account for her reason to be in the area.

Feedback from Independent Panel Members

Panel Observations	No further comments were provided in relation to the description of the grounds however, in terms of the BWV, the panel commented that the search was very good. The detained person was very calm and the officer had a pleasant approach. One panel member asked if the officers should have cuffed the detained person. Whilst we understand this isn't a necessity and the detained person was compliant, LL also picked this up. Panel believe one of the other people at the search was a PCSO therefore for the officer's safety, they may have wanted to cuff the individual.

Panel Observations	No further comments were made by the panel in relation to the description of the grounds however, the panel did comment that the search itself was very good. The officer had a good rapport with the detainee. They also noted good practice that the officers took her to a more private place to conduct the search.

Incident Summary	Vehicle has very recent intelligence for transporting a male who is believed to be involved in the supply of drugs between the area of Matlock and Tideswell. Male was seen by a PCSO exiting the vehicle and the car drove off trying to evade officers. The vehicle was subsequently found parked up in a layby with a driver and rear seat passenger, waiting to collect the male who had left.

	Observations: Vehicle has an active PNC stop marker that it is believed to be transporting a well-known drug dealer. Both the driver and rear seat passenger (DETAINED PERSON) have been involved in the supply of drugs recently Information/intelligence: Information gained from anonymous source stating that the vehicle and the driver SUBJECT A are involved in transporting a well-known wanted male who is concerned in the supply of drugs in the Derbyshire Dales area. Suspicion prior to search: The male and female in the vehicle had parked up shortly after the wanted male making off from police officers. It was suspected that the male could have left any items of drugs with the occupants or in the car before fleeing. The rear seat passenger (DETAINED PERSON) was evasive when asked about what they were doing and the males whereabouts, raising the suspicion.

Panel Observations	The panel concluded that the description of the grounds was very brief. In terms of the BWV, the panel commented that this search took place back to front (search took place first then the grounds followed) which lead to questions as to whether this was an appropriate search. It was advised that in this situation, the officers were searching for an axe (which could be used to hurt people) therefore, officers had to ensure the situation was under control and a safe environment i.e. by locating the axe which meant conducting the search first. It was asked whether the officers should have given GOWISELY before searching or under the circumstances, is this appropriate? Questions were also raised by the panel that if they were concerned and looking for a potential weapon, how come the detained person wasn't handcuffed? Once the grounds were given, it was identified that 'you were detained' or the legal power in which they are using was not relayed to the detainee. Is this because the search was vehicle only?
Panel Decision	Panel agreed that the description of the grounds justified the stop search, and the BWV gave evidence for compliance.

	As officers were driving down XXX ROAD they observed the same male on a green mountain bike wearing the same clothing given and therefore detained him. A S1 PACE search was therefore necessary and proportionate to determine whether the male had a knife in his possession

Panel Observations	Panel commented that the description of the grounds was good. In terms of the BWV, the panel agreed the search was conducted appropriately however, the officer didn't ask the detained person if they would like a copy of the search or what their ethnicity is. One panel member asked if the detained person has to provide their details for a stop search? LL advised that no, this is not a legal requirement and they are only asked this in case they want to make a complaint or a copy of the search or if they are believed to have committed an offence. The panel did comment that the officers dealt with the situation well despite the circumstances.

Concerns were also raised for the officer as they didn't wear gloves when searching the detained person. Appreciate this isn't a
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	requirement but for the officers safety, the panel members thought this should have been done.

I have driven the route to the registered keepers address where I have found a male outside the registered keeper address who has been struggling to stand and clearly intoxicated. I have not been able to confirm the driver of the vehicle however I have strongly suspected this male to be the driver of the vehicle. I was also aware that the car key was outstanding. I have conducted a stop search under section 1 of PACE as I believed he has the car key on him, and this would provide evidence that he was the driver of the vehicle. Observations: RTC has been reported where driver is suspected to be under the influence of alcohol. Driver has not been with the vehicle and was reported to be the only male. I have driven the route to the registered keepers address where I have found a male outside the registered keeper address who has been struggling to stand and clearly intoxicated. I have not been able to confirm the driver of the vehicle however I have strongly suspected

	this male to be the driver of the vehicle. I was also aware that the car key was outstanding. I have conducted a stop search under section 1 of PACE as I believed he has the car key on him, and this would provide evidence that he was the driver of the vehicle. Information/intelligence: Males details were unknown. Suspicion prior to search: The male was outside the address of the registered keeper, he was clearly intoxicated and staggering.

Panel Observations	No further comments were made by the panel in relation to the grounds however, in terms of the search, the panel were satisfied that this was conducted in an appropriate manner. They do however believe that how the detainee can access a copy of the search and what their ethnicity was missing. Concerns were also raised for the property of the detained persons being put on the floor when removed from pockets etc. In future, could this be put somewhere more hygienic, like the seat of a car for example? The panel do appreciate this may not be an option in every circumstance. Safety and hygiene concerns were raised for the officer as they didn't wear gloves when searching the detainee. They understand this isn't a requirement but for the officers safety, they thought the officer should've done.

Panel Observations	No comments were made by the panel in relation to the stop search however, with regards to the BWV, the panel gave it 10/10. One panel member commented that this was one of the best plain clothed search seen. They specifically liked the showing of the warrant card and thought this was good practice.
